Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JUNE 21, 2010

Jeremiah 20:10-13; Romans 5:12-15;
Matthew 10:26-33

Quite often, we would like to keep quiet. After all, who wants to make waves except a rabble-rouser or a fanatic? Jeremiah (first reading) would have preferred to keep quiet. God had told him to announce the doom of his nation because of its corruption. Because of his message, people hated him and wanted him dead.

The second reading tells us that we suffer the effects of original sin. We don't always see (or want to see) the pure truth of a matter. We are always tempted to take the easy way out, the line of least resistance. We are tempted to rationalize.

It is easy to settle for mediocrity. But Christ has redeemed us! Original sin is no excuse for mediocrity, for Christ's redemption is more powerful than original sin's effects.

In the Gospel, the Lord tells us not to be intimidated by this world. Why should we be afraid to proclaim the truth? If people stood up to tyrants, there could be no tyranny. If we stood together against evil, there could be no evil!

Remember the old saying of Edmond Burke: "The only thing necessary for evil to triumph is that the good do nothing!" Jesus calls you to stand for him, to witness for him.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 21, 2020

Dear Parishioners,

Since Pentecost, we have been celebrating the return to what is called “Ordinary Time.” This is the time designated as “ordinary” because there is no distinctive character to it, nor is there a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ that is being celebrated. So during this time the mystery of Christ is honored in its fullness. But because it is a time filled with grace, there is nothing ordinary or common about this time, because God enriches us with the mystery of His Son and His life and teachings.

This past Tuesday, we were finally able to celebrate the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults for all those who were part of our RCIA process this year. We have included their names and a brief biography for each of them in our bulletin this week. I ask that if you see them, you welcome them into our Church. Even though we had a shortened second semester for our RCIA, and even though we were unable to celebrate the Easter Vigil with them as planned, nevertheless we had a beautiful celebration for them as they entered our Church through the Rites of Christian Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist) or through a profession of faith followed by Confirmation and Eucharist. But we were all able to breathe a sigh of relief as we finally were able to celebrate what they had long been awaiting and thus fulfill their longings to be a member of our Catholic Church. I was so very proud of them and pray that they continue their journey of faith by being active members of our Church. I also want to thank the various members of our team for all their help in sharing their faith: Connie Schrage, Bob Musolino, Beth Young, Dr. Daniel Strudwick, Martha Rapp, James Stella, Mary Kussman, Bill Prichard, Pat Prichard, Nikki Doyle, Merrie Colgrove, Deacon Bob Lundberg, and Fr. Aaron Kuhn.

It has been a very busy time here during the past two weeks. We were able to celebrate First Communions and Confirmations for all of our young people with six differing celebrations on six evenings. Even though we had to wait until we could open our Churches for these celebrations, and even though the Bishop was unable to be present, we were able to celebrate these Sacraments for our 3rd graders and 8th graders. And it was a joy to celebrate them and still maintain the social distancing restrictions. Very proud and happy for all of our young people.

In a previous bulletin column, I announced that Kathy Harman, our parish nurse for eight years, has retired from her position. I know that she was truly loved by the people whom she visited whether at the hospital, nursing homes, or just in the individual homes in our parish. She was also so very helpful in assisting grieving families at times of funerals and helping provide a support system for those dealing with death. She was also a great asset for me as once in a while I need the counsel of woman and nurse to keep me in line with my own health. But we will miss her and wish her well. I was hoping that we would have a response from parishioners to this opening. I know that it is only part-time, perhaps 30 hours a week, but it is a very important ministry for our parish.
