Isaiah 22:19-23; Romans 11:33-36;

Matthew 16:13-20

Catholics believe that the lawfully elected Bishop of Rome is the successor of Peter and visible head of the Church. If we have the same Church which Jesus established, we must have the office of Peter. What is this office?

It is described in today's Gospel. After Simon Bar-Jona professes that Jesus is Messiah, Jesus tells him that he did not come to this on his own ability, but that God had revealed it to him.

Jesus then changes his name from Simon to Peter (which means "Rock.") He gives him the keys of the kingdom of heaven. "Kingdom of heaven" is the Church. He tells him that whatever he binds on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever he looses will be loosed.

"Binding and loosing" was a rabbinical expression for the authority to impose or to release from legal obligations. The meaning of the "keys" is found in the first reading: The "master of the palace" had complete authority over the king's household, second only to the king. He wore a key on a sash over his shoulder as a sign of his authority. To have the "keys of the kingdom of heaven," therefore, means to have authority second to that of Jesus Christ.

Peter is always first in the Gospel lists of apostles. Peter is the spokesman of the Church in Acts of Apostles. The Church acknowledged him as leader. It is historically certain that Peter went to Rome and was martyred there in the arena of Nero on Vatican Hill. His grave is under the high altar of St. Peter's Basilica.

The Church has always recognized, then, that the successor of Peter is the lawful bishop of Rome. The Pope does not tell us everything to do or not to do. But he is the center of Church unity. We cannot have the Church of Jesus Christ without him.

Dear Parishioners,

In our Gospel today, Jesus asks a very in depth and very interesting question for all of us to ponder. He first invites the disciples to answer a question that is less threatening and easier to answer. His question is “Who do people say that I am?” As I said, this question isn’t threatening because its based on what we would call hearsay information. What are people saying about Jesus? How is Jesus coming across to them. Because the disciples answer from hearsay information, this was relatively easy for them to respond. As they state, “some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets.” So they say what they heard from others. But Jesus didn’t leave it at that. Instead, He made the question quite personal as He looks at them and asks, “but who do you say that I am?” Now that question becomes uncomfortable as it necessitates a personal response from them, a response that would indicate what role in life did Jesus play in each of their lives. Peter, the one apostle who always seems to get things wrong, really got it right this time. He responds, “You are the Christ, the son of the living God.” Wow! Impressive! Peter even receives a compliment from Jesus as He says to him, “Blessed are you, Simon, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father.” Apparently Peter’s response was a grace from God. And from my reading of Peter, I think that it even surprised him. But nevertheless, Jesus gives to Peter a further grace, and that grace was that Peter was to be the rock upon which the Church would be built. Again, it is God’s amazing grace which is at work once again in His Church and in our world.

We had our first week of school here at St. Peters. The students, parents, teachers, and staff did an excellent job at social distancing and following all the guidelines of our health departments. Needless to say, it was great to see our young ones back in school. I want to thank our parents for entrusting these little ones to us. I also want to thank our teachers for going the extra mile in making this school year work. And I want to thank Cindy Venvertloh, our principal, Chris Reichert, our curriculum director, Sara Bradfield, and Roberta Hutson, for all their preparations and planning so that our school year would open up without much of a hitch. I appreciate all of you as we try to bring our educational mission as a Church to day to day living in our school. I know that we will be doing our best to keep our kids, teachers, and staff, safe from this virus but I also know that there are no guarantees in life. Please be patient and understanding.

We will once again be starting up what we call our RCIA classes. These classes will take place on Tuesdays from 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the Martha Jane Room, off our cafeteria. We will be doing our best to abide by the recommendations for social distancing and face masks. If you know of someone interested in learning more about our Catholic faith, please reach out to them and ask them to join us for these classes. I think our first class will be September 8. Please call the rectory and leave the names of the interested parties so that we can register them and have enough material for them. For the team member who might not feel comfortable attending these classes, I understand and we will try our best to carry on without you. Come when you can and are comfortable.


