Jeremiah 20:7-9; Romans 12:1-2;
Matthew 16:21-27

When the disciples first began to follow Jesus, they probably thought of him as a spell-binding teacher, a very holy man, and a wonder-worker. Last Sunday, we saw that (by divine revelation) Peter proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah.

The disciples thought that the Messiah would be God's instrument in bringing about a perfect world. He would vanquish all their enemies; he would establish perfect peace and justice; he would put an end to all disease and suffering; there would be no more death, and the dead would rise to share in his glorious kingdom of joy.

But Jesus said that he was going to suffer and die. The disciples simply could not understand how the Messiah (or Christ) could possibly suffer defeat. Peter argues with Jesus. Jesus calls him a "satan." "Satan" means "tempter." It certainly *would* be a temptation, even for Jesus, to be the kind of Messiah everyone wanted – a Christ without the cross!

The first reading parallels the Gospel. Jeremiah says that God "duped" him. To follow God, he thought, should be joy. To be the Lord's prophet should mean happiness. But Jeremiah suffered rejection by his own people.

Why do we follow Jesus Christ? Is it for "what we get out of it?" When things don't go our way, do we quit or cop out? When we suffer, do we think that God doesn't care or that religion is worthless?

The Lord calls us to share the cross before the crown. To follow Jesus means that we must deny our very selves. We are not masochists; we do not enjoy suffering. But we joyfully accept our share in the cross of Christ in order that we may "offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God."

Dear Parishioners,

Well, this is the last weekend in our month of August. Although summer has not officially ended, yet for most of us with the start of school once again, our summer vacation has officially come to an end. After last Spring, it's good to have the children back in school again. There is much that can be said of seeing smiling faces and an eagerness to learn. I want to thank our parents for their commitment to Catholic education, to our teachers and administrators for their special ministry in this education, and for our parish family for supporting our efforts with their generosity. St. Peter School has been and continues to be a part of the educational ministry of our Church and we all need to continue to work together to maintain and advance this mission. Thank you again for all that you have done and continue to do for St. Peter School.

As we gather on this 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, we are reminded by Paul in our second reading to offer ourselves to our God as a "living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God." He then challenges us not to conform ourselves to this age but be transformed so that we may "discern what is the will of God, what is holy and pleasing and perfect." We have heard much in our political climate today so Paul's words to us ring true, "not conforming ourselves to his age," but somehow trying to discern what God's will is for all of us. May each of us realize that we are to please God and His will rather than what is expedient for humankind.

Our Gospel reading today continues Paul's thinking but places it in the words of Jesus. Jesus had informed the apostles that He must go to Jerusalem where He would suffer, die, and then rise. This very person with whom the apostles had put all their hopes, now was talking about being defeated. Peter didn't like what he heard and so he responded, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." Then Jesus responds by telling Peter to "get behind him," and calls him "Satan," the tempter. Then Jesus says to Peter, "You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Following what Paul states, we are always challenged in our lives not to be an obstacle to God's grace, not to think only as human beings do, but rather to expand our thinking by including the will of God in our deliberations. May God assist and help us as we discern once again His will in our lives.

This is the last weekend for our missalettes. This weekend we will set out our new missalettes for you to take home with you. We cannot leave them in the pews but you can bring them to Mass and we ask that you take them home with you after each celebration. But please take them home this weekend. Since we cannot leave them out in the Narthex, if you want to take them we will save a number of them in the ushers room in the Narthex. Please go in and take them with you.

Next weekend is Labor Day weekend. We will have Mass on Monday, September 7, at 8:00 a.m., thanking our God for the gift of labor. It is through our work and labor that we become stewards of God's gifts, using our time, talents, and treasures to do His will in our lives and provide for our families.


