Isaiah 25:6-10a; Philippians 4:12-14,19-20;  
Matthew 22:1-14

In the Bible, heaven is often described as a great banquet, a feast in which there is plenty of food and drink for everyone. Although Isaiah knew little about heaven, he thought of paradise in these terms.

He looked forward to a time when all people would be united in peace, when there would be no death or suffering, and when everyone would have plenty of food and drink. This is what we call the “Messianic Hope.” Jewish tradition thought that this hope would be fulfilled when the Messiah came.

Jesus uses a banquet parable to describe salvation or heaven. The parable was told against the Pharisees. They thought that the only ones to be saved were righteous Jews who kept all 613 precepts of the Law of Moses.

In the parable, these are the ones who refuse the invitation of the king. The king invites them again and again. This refers to the prophets whom the Lord sent. But they ignored his invitation and abused his messengers.

The king then invites all others to the banquet. This refers to the Gentiles, to us, to those who are not God’s first choice. It is a teaching of our Catholic faith that God invites everyone to salvation, and that he gives sufficient grace to everyone to be saved.

The longer form of the Gospel adds a corollary to this, however. Everyone is expected to change his life. The parable says that someone was not properly dressed. He was willing to accept the invitation, but not willing to change his ways. He was cast outside.

God in his lovingkindness has invited us to salvation. But we must respond to his invitation by conversion of heart. Those who refuse will be outside with those who ignored the invitation in the first place.

In the second reading, Paul tells us that we should learn how to cope amid all circumstances of life. Somehow, God will see us through. He will supply our needs. He is the source of our strength.

**Dear Parishioners,**


This weekend the Church celebrates the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In every culture, food is an essential part of celebrations, from wedding banquets to the Thanksgiving meal. I remember vividly our gathering at Thanksgiving. Since my brother lived in Pennsylvania, he and his family would come home sometimes before Thanksgiving Day. We would have our usual customs like going to lunch at the chili parlor in Springfield, or some pizza place in the evening. But on Thanksgiving Day, mom would make her rolls, dad would prepare the turkey, and everyone would lend a hand on all the side dishes. We would sit down and eat a delicious meal, then we would exchange gifts later as everyone took their seat on what was traditionally called the “hot seat.” This chair was for the recipient to sit upon as they would guess who would give them a gift. Then later on in the early eve, we would turn over the Thanksgiving placemats and eat a Christmas meal, which was basically left over from the earlier meal. And as I reflect upon this memory it brings such happy thoughts as I remember family, meals, and our gathering around the table.

This reflection came to my mind as I read over our Scriptures. In the first reading from Isaiah, we hear of a banquet foretold by this prophet that the Lord would provide for His people. The very things that the people were lacking, Isaiah tells them that some day if they remain ever faithful to the covenant, that “God would provide a feast of rich food, and choice wines.” Everything that they could dream of as a banquet would be provided by the God who chose them as His people. In fact the mountain upon which this feast would be celebrated the Lord would also destroy death and its bitter sting. We might take this banquet as a fulfillment of everything the people of God desired, and wanted. Perhaps a type of image of heaven.

If this banquet is an image of heaven, a reality that Jesus presents in the Gospel is that they, the people, must choose to share in this banquet. So Jesus tells the story of a wedding feast to which many people are invited. Some ignored the invite, others hurt the messengers inviting them. The king in response rid himself of these ungrateful people and then sent the invitation out to many others, good and bad, so that the banquet would be filled. Heaven is often seen as a banquet. In fact, this Gospel parable states that the kingdom of God is like that banquet with many being invited but few being chosen. But the choice is ours. God invites us to share in His kingdom, a banquet that He provides abundantly for all of us. But He doesn’t force Himself on us. We have to freely choose to be a part of it. And that’s what we need to do each and every day of our lives.

This is a reminder to you: If you do receive the Eucharist, at Mass, I ask that receive in the hand, step aside, and then remove one side of the mask from the ear while keeping the other side over your ear. Then place the Eucharist in your mouth, place the mask back over your ear, then return to your places. Too often I find people removing the mask with their hands from the mouth or nose area, which then defeats the purpose of the mask. Thank you for your assistance. I also know that Fr. Pawel would like you to remove your mask before receiving the Eucharist on the hand which is fine with me. Whatever you feel comfortable doing.

## Birthright Virtual Trivia Night

Birthright of Quincy's largest annual fundraiser, taking place Saturday, November 7, is receiving a makeover this year due to current restrictions on large gatherings.

For years, Birthright Trivia Night has packed over 500 fun-loving supporters together inside Quincy University's Health & Fitness Center to enjoy a Trivia contest and silent auction of more than 200 locally donated items. Money raised by the annual event represents half the funds needed to support Birthright's clients for the entire year.

For the first time in its 11-year history, this year's Birthright Trivia Night will be taking place virtually. "If we want to be able to continue helping the women and girls we serve, we have to find a way to forge ahead with our largest fundraiser, and we need our supporters' help this year more than ever" Birthright President Patty Adam said. Teams will gather at a location of their choice, or even virtually if they prefer, and follow along with the evening's events on Zoom while entering Trivia answers on a separate mobile app provided. Because of the virtual platform, there will be more multiple choice questions than years past, and answer scores will be weighted on response time.

In another first, this year's event will not include a silent auction. Adam said it didn't feel right to ask Birthright's small business supporters to donate items this year considering how many are currently struggling as a result of the pandemic. For businesses and individuals who still want to support the event but not necessarily play Trivia, event and round sponsorships are available and will be critical to funding Birthright's mission.

The registration deadline is Friday, November 6 at 8:00 p.m., and teams who complete their registration by October 23 have a chance to win their entry fee back.

Birthright of Quincy is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded in Quincy in 1973 to help pregnant women overcome the challenges of unplanned pregnancy. Birthright of Quincy is non-political, non-denominational, 100% volunteer, and operates 100% through donations from the community.
