Isaiah 45:1,4-6; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b;
Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees and Herodians were mortal enemies. The Pharisees thought that Roman rule over the Jewish people was blasphemy; the Herodians supported Roman rule. Both groups unite to pose a dilemma to Jesus: Should a person pay taxes to Rome?

If Jesus answers “yes,” he alienates all observing Jews. If he answers “no,” he would be arrested by the Romans. He gets off the horns of the dilemma by using a coin, and telling people to give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, but to God what belongs to God.

But he doesn’t solve the problem. What belongs to the secular sphere? What belongs to God? Can religion impose on the natural order those principles which can only be known if one accepts faith?

Some things are obviously secular: for example, protection of rights and of the public order, roads and transportation. Some things are obviously religious. But many things are mixed, such as education, public morality, and the means of communication. The problem will probably never be solved, but reasonable people must always strive to cooperate while avoiding extreme positions.

The first reading is praise of a pagan secular ruler. Cyrus of Persia is even called “the Lord’s anointed.” The word used is “messiah!” The reading points out that Cyrus is great because of God, even though he doesn’t know God!

The second reading is the beginning of the very first book of the New Testament to be written. Paul wrote to the Thessalonians around 51 A.D. to solve problems about the “Second Coming.” Paul had preached that Jesus would return in glory very soon. When he didn’t, some of the Thessalonians were discouraged. Paul urges them to faith, hope, and constancy in spite of difficulties.

Dear Parishioners,

As the numbers marking Ordinary Time get larger, this means that our liturgical year is coming to an end. This year the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time is November 15, with the last Sunday, the Solemnity of Christ the King being celebrated on November 22. That being said, then the liturgical year begins again on the First Sunday of Advent, which this year falls on November 29. Without trying to create a panic, Advent has four Sundays with Christmas soon to follow. But in the meantime, let's just enjoy the change of nature where God reveals to us the beauty of His creations right before our eyes. Let us thank and praise our God for this change as nature prepares for winter.

Ever since we returned to Church for the celebration of the Eucharist, I have asked our maintenance personnel to go over and beyond their daily work in the schools and Church in order to clean the Church after Masses over the weekend. I know that this has created quite a burden upon them and I want to ease them of this extra work load. So I am asking your cooperation and assistance. Eric, our maintenance person for the Church, will prepare the cleaning material for the weekend on Friday afternoon and will leave it for our use. Then I am asking for volunteers after each Mass to bring the cart out and proceed to wipe down the pews. If a number of people stay, it takes only a short time. To assist us in making sure that we have volunteers, we have asked that when you sign up for Mass on line that you might consider signing to assist us in this cleaning. There will be a separate line that will both include your attendance at Mass but also your willingness to help clean. I am also asking our ushers to assist in the cleaning of the door handles of the Narthex and entrances of the Church as well as the restrooms in the Narthex. If we all make an effort, no one will be burdened by this cleaning. I can't thank you enough for helping us through this pandemic until we return to some normalcy.

For those who are interested, I have been in conversation with the editor of the Catholic Missourian, the diocesan newspaper for the Jefferson City diocese, who read about our project for Fr. Tolton in our bulletin. He is planning on printing this article in his newspaper as they too feel a connection with Fr. Tolton. Since I didn't want our Catholic Times, our diocesan newspaper to be slighted, I also informed them of this same project. They too will publish our project in this newspaper sometime in November. So whether one lives in Missouri or Illinois, our plaques depicting Fr. Tolton's life are receiving much attention, and rightly so. All of us should take much pride in this priest who will someday be recognized as St. Augustine Tolton. Since Fr. Roy Bauer, our pastor and friend, was such a proponent for this canonization, I am so happy to be able to do this project for him in his memory. I know he will truly be smiling on our efforts.

As we anticipate the arrival of the month of November, we are reminded that we are to pray for the dead. In the tradition of this parish family, we will be celebrating our Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, October 31 at the 5:00 p.m. Mass. It is during this Mass in particular that we will be praying for all those parishioners who have died from November 1, 2019 to October 31, 2020. Families are invited to join us as we remember those who have died.



Also, during the month of November we celebrate what we call the Communion of Saints, that particular profession of faith found in the Apostles Creed. This profession acknowledges that there is a resurrection of the dead. Those who rise and go to heaven are called "saints triumphant." We celebrate their feast on All Saint's Day, November 1. Then we celebrate those saint's suffering, namely, the Souls in Purgatory. Their feast is All Soul's Day, November 2. The final category of saints is you and I, saints militant, those of us who are still struggling to do God's will. Our feast is every day in which God graces us. And since we are the Body of Christ, the Church, each category prays for each other until one day we are all united in heaven, thus being the saints in glory with our God.

We will also be placing near the baptismal font the Book of the Dead. If you have already put in a name of a loved one from previous years, you do not need to repeat it. The ones who have died this year will be printed in this book by us. During the month of November we will be remembering all those who are listed in the Book of the Dead.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE: The pastor of the parish would quiz the young first communicants during their communion Mass. He asked one time, "What do you have to do to get to heaven?"

Most of the boys and girls contemplated their shoelaces for a long time, but little Molly the theologian raised her hand and confidently responded, "You have to die!"

Birthright Virtual Trivia Night

Birthright of Quincy's largest annual fundraiser, taking place Saturday, November 7, is receiving a makeover this year due to current restrictions on large gatherings.

For years, Birthright Trivia Night has packed over 500 fun-loving supporters together inside Quincy University's Health & Fitness Center to enjoy a Trivia contest and silent auction of more than 200 locally donated items. Money raised by the annual event represents half the funds needed to support Birthright's clients for the entire year.

For the first time in its 11-year history, this year's Birthright Trivia Night will be taking place virtually. "If we want to be able to continue helping the women and girls we serve, we have to find a way to forge ahead with our largest fundraiser, and we need our supporters' help this year more than ever" Birthright President Patty Adam said. Teams will gather at a location of their choice, or even virtually if they prefer, and follow along with the evening's events on Zoom while entering Trivia answers on a separate mobile app provided. Because of the virtual platform, there will be more multiple choice questions than years past, and answer scores will be weighted on response time.

In another first, this year's event will not include a silent auction. Adam said it didn't feel right to ask Birthright's small business supporters to donate items this year considering how many are currently struggling as a result of the pandemic. For businesses and individuals who still want to support the event but not necessarily play Trivia, event and round sponsorships are available and will be critical to funding Birthright's mission.

For a donation of \$125, Trivia teams of up to 8 players can register online at birthrightquincyil.org, or contact Birthright at (217) 224-1277 for a registration form or more information. The registration deadline is Friday, November 6 at 8:00 p.m., and teams who complete their registration by October 23 have a chance to win their entry fee back.

Birthright of Quincy is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded in Quincy in 1973 to help pregnant women overcome the challenges of unplanned pregnancy. Birthright of Quincy is non-political, non-denominational, 100% volunteer, and operates 100% through donations from the community.
