Exodus 22:20-26; 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10;
Matthew 22: 34-40

At the time of Jesus, Pharisees held that the ultimate self-revelation of God was the Torah. The Torah was eternal, unchangeable, and the way of salvation. If a person kept the Torah, he would find life.

They distinguished 613 precepts or laws in the Torah. Although the Torah was eternal, it was revealed to Moses in time, on Mt. Sinai. But the elders held that not all precepts were equal; some were “heavy” and some were “light.” So they asked Jesus what was the most important precept in the Torah.

Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 6:5 (Love God above all). And then he added Leviticus 19:18 as a co-equal precept (Love your neighbor as yourself). Jesus was the first person to put these two laws together and make them different sides of the same coin.

The first reading in its details is irrelevant to modern life. But it instructs us that our love of neighbor must be practical and concrete.

Too many people talk a good game of “care and compassion,” but never *do* anything. If we say we love our neighbor, we must show it by our deeds.

In the second reading, Paul uses good psychology in complimenting the Thessalonians on their faith and constancy. If we want to win people to our viewpoint, we do not mount a frontal attack or verbal broadside. Honey attracts more flies than vinegar.

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 25, 2020

Dear Parishioners,

Next Sunday, we begin another new month of the year, November. During this month, the Church calls us in a special way to remember “our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection.” (Eucharistic Prayer II). We do this in a variety of ways. Our Book of the Dead will be placed near the Easter candle, and we will be remembering the names of those listed throughout our Masses in November. We will write the names of those who have died from this time last year to the present and were buried from St. Peter. If you know of someone else who has died and was buried not from St. Peter, you are invited to write their names in this same book. This book is a reminder that this “earthly tent is fragile and never meant to last forever.” We all have the hope that the doors of death lead to a life greater than we could ever imagine. And so we pray for those who have died, be they in heaven or purgatory, knowing that our prayers are answered by our God who desires to share His eternal life with us.

Next weekend we celebrate what we believe in the Apostles Creed as the “communion of saints.” The communion of saints includes all those who are now living on earth (pilgrim Church), those who are being purified in purgatory (Church suffering), and those who are blessed in heaven (Church in glory). This doctrine flows from our belief that we Christians are closely united as one family in the Spirit of Jesus Christ. The bond of love makes us one. In a certain sense, all of God’s people are dependent upon one another. Those of us who are still living depend on the prayers and good works of our Christian brothers and sisters who are united to us in the friendship of the Lord. We also believe in the value of prayer for our departed brothers and sisters who are being purified (made ready) in purgatory. Finally, we believe that those Christian heroes whom we call saints in heaven are vitally interested in those of us who are still living or in purgatory. The saints pray for us in our weakness. And we also pray for all of our deceased brothers and sisters, offering Masses and sacrifices to assist them in this period of purgation. And since we are never sure of the final destiny of anyone other than what we call canonized saints, we still must pray for our deceased.

Sunday is November 1 and the Solemnity of All Saints. Our Mass schedule is that of the weekend. On this occasion, I invite you to the south entrance of our Church here at St. Peter, to the shrine of All Saints, to view the relics of those saints in heaven. I am amazed at this shrine which holds various relics of so many saints from our past. As we honor them with this shrine and the candles before it, let us ask their prayers for all of us who are still struggling as we continue this earthly tent in which we live. Then Monday, November 2, is the Feast of All Souls. This is the Feast day in which we remember all those who have died and through the mercy of our God are preparing their lives for the fullness and joys of heaven. This day is also a traditional day to visit the cemeteries and pray for the dead. As we celebrate this communion of saints, this is what the Church is and should be. People who pray, sacrifice, and remember each other in all of our struggles with life. Let’s also remember those families who are still dealing with the reality of death in their families. Through our prayer, love and support may they remain a people of faith, hope, and love.

Fr. Leo's column continued....

For those of us who grew up earlier in the Church, there were only two days of the year that a priest could celebrate three Masses. These two days were Christmas and thus we have three differing Masses on Christmas, night (vigil), dawn, and day. They are still listed as such in the missalette. The other day was All Soul's Day. I can remember serving Mass in Latin with a priest who would finish one Mass and then begin a second and then a third. That's when side altars were still in use. These Masses remembered the souls in purgatory who depend upon our prayers to assist them.

Since we are remembering the deceased, I also invite your generosity for the resting place for our deceased, namely, our cemeteries. There are two times a year that I ask your generosity, Memorial Day and All Soul's Day. Your generosity helps us to make improvements to this burial place for our dead. You should have special envelopes for the cemeteries in your packet of parish envelopes. We have perpetual care but this money only maintains the cemeteries and is not enough to make improvements when necessary. Please be generous.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE: The story is told of a young man when he was in his 20's, he hated going to weddings. The reason was that after the wedding and during the reception, his aunts and all the other grandmotherly type of individuals would come up to him and poke him in the ribs, cackling, "You're next."

Finally, they stopped, when he started doing the same to them at funerals!

Birthright Virtual Trivia Night

Birthright of Quincy's largest annual fundraiser, taking place Saturday, November 7, is receiving a makeover this year due to current restrictions on large gatherings.

For years, Birthright Trivia Night has packed over 500 fun-loving supporters together inside Quincy University's Health & Fitness Center to enjoy a Trivia contest and silent auction of more than 200 locally donated items. Money raised by the annual event represents half the funds needed to support Birthright's clients for the entire year.

For the first time in its 11-year history, this year's Birthright Trivia Night will be taking place virtually. "If we want to be able to continue helping the women and girls we serve, we have to find a way to forge ahead with our largest fundraiser, and we need our supporters' help this year more than ever" Birthright President Patty Adam said. Teams will gather at a location of their choice, or even virtually if they prefer, and follow along with the evening's events on Zoom while entering Trivia answers on a separate mobile app provided. Because of the virtual platform, there will be more multiple choice questions than years past, and answer scores will be weighted on response time.

In another first, this year's event will not include a silent auction. Adam said it didn't feel right to ask Birthright's small business supporters to donate items this year considering how many are currently struggling as a result of the pandemic. For businesses and individuals who still want to support the event but not necessarily play Trivia, event and round sponsorships are available and will be critical to funding Birthright's mission.

For a donation of \$125, Trivia teams of up to 8 players can register online at birthrightquincyil.org, or contact Birthright at (217) 224-1277 for a registration form or more information. The registration deadline is Friday, November 6 at 8:00 p.m., and teams who complete their registration by October 23 have a chance to win their entry fee back.

Birthright of Quincy is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded in Quincy in 1973 to help pregnant women overcome the challenges of unplanned pregnancy. Birthright of Quincy is non-political, non-denominational, 100% volunteer, and operates 100% through donations from the community.
