Solemnity of All Saints

NOVEMBER 1, 2020

Revelation: 2-4,9-14; 1 John 3:1-3;
Matthew 5:1-12a

Today we celebrate all those countless persons who are in heaven, but who do not have a special “feast day.” They are of all kinds and varieties: young and old, intelligent and simple, jolly and reserved, introverted and extroverted, active and contemplative, slim and portly, and so on. They have one thing in common: They loved God above all things and tried to serve him in every aspect of their lives.

Our first reading, from Revelation, shows the scene of heaven; there are countless numbers from every race, nation, people and tongue. They have “washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb and made them white.” This applies strictly to martyrs who gave their lives for Christ. But it also applies to those who have sacrificed in order to live for him.

The second reading tells us that there is no essential difference between grace and glory. We share God’s life here; we shall share it hereafter when we shall be glorified with the glory of Christ’s resurrection.

The Gospel is the Beatitudes, the opening words of the first sermon Jesus preached, according to Matthew. The Beatitudes may be considered as the “new value system” which Christians must have.

The Beatitudes may also be considered as the “process of conversion.” “Poor in spirit” means “those who realize they need God.” This is the first step. Those who “mourn” means those who are sorry for their sins. Realizing our need for God, we must want to turn away from sin. We must hunger and thirst for righteousness, and God will fill us with his grace.

The other Beatitudes flow from this: Mercy will come to those who show mercy; we must be single-hearted; we must seek peace with all people. And we are blessed when we endure suffering for the sake of Christ and the Gospel.

All of us are called to be saints. Today, let us pledge that we shall be loyal to the Lord at all times in order that we may join all the saints in heaven.

But this Holy Day is always on November 1 and is the Holy Day that gives us hope.

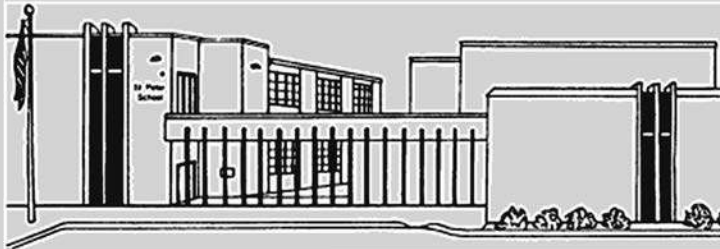
We all have our dreams in life, some are fulfilled and others we still await. By virtue of our baptisms, we were given a dream by the Church, a dream to live like children in light, a dream to be with God fully in heaven. And when this dream is fulfilled, it is called being a saint. Too often in life we excuse ourselves thinking that we could never be a saint especially when comparing ourselves to those saints known to be in heaven. It is said, a point to remember, that there is not a saint without a past, and no sinner without a future. No matter what our past is, no matter how unworthy we might feel, God is there with His grace to help us overcome our fears, faults, sins, and failings, and to be the person who is loved and graced by Him. Because of this grace, we can truly have our dreams fulfilled of living with our God in heaven forever. As we hear from our Book of Revelation this weekend, saints come from every walk of life, from the far and dark corners of this world, with all differing backgrounds, with life's successes and failures, and from all these walks of life they emerge victorious because Jesus has conquered everything that would keep us from Him, including sin and death. So today we honor those whose dreams have been fulfilled and we pray to them asking them to pray for us that we too will emerge from the failings of our human nature to have those dreams fulfilled of living with our God forever in heaven. Saints of God, pray for us.

As we honor these saints today, I invite you to go to the shrine of All Saints which is located in the back of the church, near the most south exit and view the shrine. Pick out the saints whose relics are there and realize that so many were just like you and me. Were they sinners? The answer is yes. Were they perfect? The answer is no. But God's grace changes, transforms, and challenges us to be His creature, not creatures of our own making. Since we are part of the Communion of Saints, we are reassured that they are praying for us until we truly have communion with them in heaven. Saints of God, pray for us.

Since All Souls Day is November 2, the traditional day that we remember the Souls in Purgatory, you are invited to pray for all those who are still preparing themselves for the eternal joys of heaven. These people have completed their earthly tent and through the mercy of God are making themselves ready for the fullness of the love of God in heaven. Because of sin and its effects in our lives, these souls, through our prayers and sacrifices, are making themselves ready for the eternal joys of heaven. May these souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

November is the month to remember the dead. In that spirit, I ask you to help us in support of our Catholic cemeteries. You have special envelopes and I ask you to help us improve these special places for the dead.

This weekend we have our Lay Witness talk concerning our Stewardship Renewal. This year our lay witnesses will be Luke and Tara Bealor. This witness talk always continues to inspire me as we see people within our parish living out what it means to be stewards of God's graces.

Speaking of stewardship, the diocese is also attempting to transition itself from thinking only about budgets to be met to more of a stewardship lifestyle regarding our treasures. So what was originally called the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA) has been changed to Parish Tithing. The former was based on a budgetary number which then taxed each parish. The latter understanding is more Scriptural, the understanding of giving 10% to God. So each of you received a letter from the Bishop reviewing this change with you, asking you to support the Parish Tithe effort. Our parish tithe this year is \$149,024, which is 10% of our total parish income from 2018. Your direct contribution to the diocese will assist our parish in its achievable goal of our tithe to the diocese.
