Wisdom 6:12-16; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18;
Matthew 25:1-13

The theme of today's Mass is "wisdom." A foolish or flighty person never thinks about goals or consequences; he/she never thinks about responsibilities; the fun of the present moment seems to be his/her only interest.

The wise person enjoys life in terms of goals and responsibilities. He/she sees that true joy and happiness will only be found in the pursuit of the right goals.

The foolish maidens in the Gospel didn't think to bring oil for their lamps. Their one purpose was to light the way for the bridegroom as he took the bride to his home. And they failed miserably in that one purpose; their sin was a failure to think, to consider, to take responsibility.

The first reading personifies wisdom. Anyone can be wise. Wisdom means seeking the real goal of life, and ordering everything in life toward that goal. Our one, over-riding goal of life is to please God in order to be happy with him here and hereafter. We need to "thirst for the Lord" as we sing in the Responsorial Psalm.

Our second reading is from 1 Thessalonians. The epistle was written to give hope to those who were discouraged about the delay in the Second Coming of Christ.

We must never give up hope. Heaven is our goal; the Lord will give us every grace needed to attain that goal if only we take the responsibility for our lives in wisdom. Let us, then, "Keep our eyes open," and live responsibly in the light of our goal

Dear Parishioners,

In our liturgical calendar, today is the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. With our celebration, we have only two weeks left in our Church calendar before we begin another Church year with the First Sunday of Advent. Without trying to shock anyone, but Christmas is right around the corner.

As we come to the end of this season called “ordinary,” the Church wants us to focus on the end of all things, on death, on the Second Coming, on the end of the world, on judgment. This focus is not to create fear, nor any type of anxiety, but rather it helps us realize that this earthly tent in which we dwell is not lasting and that our lives should always be prepared to meet the Lord whenever He comes into our lives.

Our Gospel presents the parable of the ten bridesmaids who were called to stand ready with their lamps burning brightly. The bridesmaids main role was to light the way through the narrow and dark streets of the city for the groom. If one understood the Jewish marriage ceremony, it is very clear that this role was important. The groom or his best man would have to negotiate with the father of the bride for her hand. They had been engaged, more than likely an engagement with the parents. Then was the betrothal where they got to know each other. It is in this part that they were basically married. The only thing left was to haggle over the dowry. Apparently in this parable, this took longer than expected and the groom was late in coming for his bride. But the bridesmaids were expected to live up to their role by having enough oil to keep their lights burning until he would come. As we hear, some were prepared, others were not. The former ones fulfilled their roles, but the latter ones failed in the one task given to them. The moral of the story is to “keep our eyes open, and our lamps burning brightly for we never know when the bridegroom, Jesus, will come again.

As I write this column, I have no idea of the outcome of our elections. Whatever they might be, I only hope and pray that people will accept whatever the outcome is and that we will come together again as citizens of this United States to pursue happiness and peace in our communities. There is no excuse for violence, vandalism, and stealing. Please continue to pray for our country and its leadership.

If you have attended Mass the past two weekends, you were made well aware that we are in the middle of our Annual Stewardship Renewal. Since the presence of this virus, we were worried how much participation we would have from our parish families. After doing this for many years, and realizing how much our parish families are thankful for God’s many blessings, we decided to go ahead and have this renewal. Each parish family received their envelope which included their commitment cards, differing ministries within our parish, and a letter of encouragement to read. I am hoping that each of you take this renewal to prayer, asking God to help you to discern the various ways that you can share your time, talents, and treasures with our parish family. The key is to take it to prayer. Through prayer God will help us to discern what we can return to Him for all His blessings and gifts given to all of us and then return them to us.

Fr. Leo's column continued....

By now, each of you have received a letter from the Bishop, explaining the new process on how parishes will support the diocese and its ministries. As many of you remember, this was called the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA) and was basically a tax on each Church's revenue for a yearly period. What the letter goes on to explain is that there will be a change in format. No longer will there be tax, but rather it will be a tithe. The tithe is a Biblical notion of giving 10% of what we have been given to support something much broader than ourselves. And thus we have the parish tithe. The first year is based on the revenue of our parish in 2018. But after this beginning step it will be 10% of our parish contributions. Then this year our goal is \$149,024.00.
