Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

NOVEMBER 15, 2020

Proverbs 31:10-13,19-20,30-31;
1 Thessalonians 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

This is the last Sunday for which we shall use green vestments until the third Sunday in January. For all practical purposes, it is the end of the Season of “Ordinary Time.” Next Sunday, the last Sunday of the Church Year, is the Solemnity of Christ the King. The following Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent.

Our Gospel continues Jesus’ last great sermon, the “Eschatological Sermon” or Sermon on the Last Things. Last Sunday, Jesus told us to watch and to pray, to keep our lamps burning brightly. Today he tells us to use wisely the talents given us by the Lord.

It doesn’t make any difference whether we receive many talents or few; the important thing is that we use our gifts and talents for God’s glory. When we use our gifts in the service of others and for the glory of God, we show a “profit,” and he will bless us.

The first reading today seems to be a bit of male chauvinism. It speaks of a worthy wife who does everything to please her husband. But the Church does not use this reading as a commentary on women. Rather, the Church sees herself as the “worthy wife” of Christ.

We, the Church, are to strive to reflect the glory of Christ in all things. We are called to bring him good all the days of our lives. (The reading is from the last chapter of Proverbs.)

Our second reading is from the last chapter of 1 Thessalonians. Paul has stated that the end will come, and that we must always be ready. But we don’t know when the end is coming.

All of the signs of the end took place a long time ago; we await no new “signs.” It only remains for us to watch and to be prepared as children of light. Let us suppose that today is the last day of our life. How would we live it? Live each day that way!

Dear Parishioners,

When I was growing up, there was a span of time usually in October that was unreasonably warm. If my memory recalls, we often called this “Indian Summer.” Not sure why, but we never argued with summer like temperatures in October. We just enjoyed it as we knew that nature would change drastically in a very short time. And this is where I find myself only this time in November. We have been enjoying summer time weather in the middle of November and the only thing I can say, enjoy it while it lasts. Because this too will change sometimes in days, let alone weeks.

This weekend we celebrate the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. With our celebration of the 33rd Sunday, we realize that there is only one weekend left in this Ordinary Time and that is next weekend, the 34th Sunday which is called the Solemnity of Christ the King. Not to alarm you, but the following weekend we begin the new season called Advent, that time of the year in preparation for Christmas. Hard to believe as we enjoy temperatures in the 70s.

Our gospel for this weekend is Jesus’ parable of the man going on a journey, and entrusts his possessions to his servants. To each of them he would entrust certain talents, according to their abilities. They were supposed to use them not for themselves but rather for the master. Two of them used these talents for their master, doubling the amount given. One, however, was too comfortable with his that he ended up burying it. While the two who used them for the sake of the master was praised, the one who buried his talent was criticized for his laziness and relieved of the one talent given to him. As we bring our annual stewardship renewal to a close, this Gospel is quite appropriate. God has blessed each of us with talents—call them time, abilities, treasures. These are to be used not for ourselves but for our master, who is Jesus Christ. When we use what God has given to us for His honor and glory, our master will double what He has given to us. When we are too comfortable and bury these gifts in the ground for fear of losing them, we end up losing them anyway. So again, I am asking all those parishioners who have not filled out their commitment cards to please do so this weekend. We need you to be stewards of what God has entrusted to you. Please take these cards to prayer and God will help you to discern your talents in relationship to Him and His Church. Remember the last words of our Gospel: “For to everyone who has more, more will be given and he will grow rich; from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away.”

I am hoping that some of our parishioners would have viewed our 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday night on our YouTube via the link that we sent you. Our new cameras worked great and we are still in the learning process of what our new system can do. We can zoom in so close you can count all my white hairs on my head. Ha. Ha. But we hope to be up and running very soon so that those of you who are home can still feel connected to us and celebrate the Eucharist with us especially on the weekends. We are still looking for volunteers to help us in this new ministry. The one working our system will be in the old choir room, the room north of the sanctuary which is opposite to what we call the Fr. Bauer prayer room. If interested, come into the room and take a peek.


