Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

NOVEMBER 22, 2020

Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17;

1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28; Matthew 25:31-46

What difference does Jesus Christ make in your life? When you are at work or at play, does your faith in him make you any different from others? When you are relaxing with friends, or when you are enjoying recreation, are you any different because you know Christ Jesus?

Jesus Christ should be the meaning of every dimension of our lives. If we truly live for Christ, we don't need to parade it or to always talk "God-speak." People will know we are Christians by the way we live. They will see in our lives the reflection of Jesus Christ. Our deeds will speak louder than our words.

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 (in the "Roaring Twenties") when civic and social life was divorced entirely from religion. It was the time of the rise of Totalitarian dictatorships. Among religious people, it was a time of sentimentality without substance.

We claim Christ as our King: All laws of nations must be subject to his moral reign. We claim Christ as our King: We cannot be content with mere sentimentality in our private religion; we are called to profess our faith publicly and boldly.

Our first reading is from Ezekiel. The metaphor of "shepherd" was used for the leaders of Israel, both secular and religious. Unfortunately, during Ezekiel's time, those leaders were corrupt. The Lord says that he himself will become our shepherd, our leader. He will rescue the scattered and lost sheep; he will protect all the sheep of his flock.

The fifteenth chapter of First Corinthians is a great sermon on the resurrection. Death is the great enemy, the great fear, of all people. But not for the Christian! Christ has risen from the dead. He is the "first fruits" or the cause of our own resurrection. Because he has risen, we, too, shall rise; death cannot hold us.

What, then do we ever have to fear? At the end of the world, all peoples will appear before the Lord. He will judge them on the basis of what they have done – or failed to do – to others. We shall be very surprised to hear that whatever we did – or failed to do – to our neighbor in need, we did (or failed to do) to Christ himself. Let us strive to see the image of Christ in every person. In this way we shall truly proclaim that he is king over our lives.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Solemnity, November 22, 2020

Dear Parishioners,


This, the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time, is the last Sunday in our liturgical calendar. This last Sunday is called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is placed at the end of our liturgical calendar and the beginning of another to indicate that Jesus Christ is the alpha and the omega of our lives, the beginning and the end. This Solemnity challenges us to make sure that Jesus Christ is the sovereign King of our lives, that no political party nor any particular form of government should take precedence over Christ as the king of our lives. We also realize in this Solemnity that when He comes again in glory, He will be coming to judge us according to where we place our time, talents, and hearts. He is mighty Lord and King. Let us always choose to be loyal to Him as He is to us. As the song goes, "To Jesus Christ, our Sovereign King, who is the world's salvation, all praise and homage do we bring and thanks and Adoration. Christ Jesus, Victor, Christ Jesus Ruler! Christ Jesus, Lord and Redeemer!"

This coming Thursday, November 26 is Thanksgiving Day. Since we are not competing with the Turkey Run sponsored by the YMCA, we will have our Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9:00 a.m. This is one Mass that we should be in capacity in our attendance. Why? Because we are a stewardship parish, and as that stewardship parish we recognize God's blessings and gifts given to us, and WE ARE THANKFUL! As Catholics, the best way to say THANK YOU TO GOD, is the Eucharist, a word which means "to give thanks." And so I invite all of you to join us and celebrate our thanks to God for what He has given to us, our time, talents, and treasures.

As a reminder, if you have not returned your annual stewardship renewal commitment cards, I ask you to do so as soon as possible. We need your cooperation to be a part of this renewal as it indicates your willingness to take ownership of this parish and its ministries. I also invite the parishioners who send their children to our St. Peter School to return their cards. If not, it indicates that you are choosing to be inactive in the parish and therefore will not receive any subsidy for tuition. So please make sure that you take these cards to prayer, and allow God to help you discern what God is calling you to share in your time, talents, and treasures. It would be great to get at least 75% of our parish families to take part in this renewal.

Finally, with the spike in our COVID-19 cases, I continue to remind you that the dispensation from weekend Masses still is in existence. People who are sick, who might be vulnerable for many reasons, or who just fear getting the virus, I tell you that you are free to stay at home. We will be video taping our Masses for our parishioners to watch either on YOUTUBE or on our website. Someone will be sending you this link via email. Our new camera system is great and a tremendous investment for us to keep everyone connected with us. For those who will be coming to Church on the weekend, I ask that you continue to distance yourselves and to wear your masks. We haven't had anybody get sick from coming to Church and I hope that our track record remains solid like this. And if you are here, please help us in cleaning the pews after each Mass.




