First Sunday of Advent

NOVEMBER 29, 2020

Isaiah 63:16b-17,19b;64:2-7;
1 Corinthians 1:3-9; Mark 13:33-37

Advent means “Coming.” The Lord Jesus comes in three ways: in *history* (at Bethlehem and in his public life,) in *mystery* (by his grace and in every sacrament,) and in *majesty* (at the end of the world, in glory, as our Judge.)

Today we emphasize his coming in majesty. This world will end; the Lord will return to take us to glory; we must live in hope and expectation. The coming of the Lord gives us hope: He promises that all things will work for good if we love him. He will bring good and not evil. He will save us and give us joy. We may suffer in this world for a time, but nothing can ever overcome the power of Christ who comes.

Our first reading is a cry for help, of longing for the Lord to tear the heavens apart and come down. We are weak sinners; only he can forgive and save. Our second reading is Paul’s prayer that we will persevere in holiness until the “Day” when Christ returns.

The Gospel is part of Mark’s “eschatological sermon.” We don’t know when Christ will return. It may be today. How would we want to live if we knew he would come today? Let us keep alert!

Today we begin a new cycle of Scripture readings. Our Sunday readings follow a three year cycle; this year is called “Year B.” Except for Lent and Easter, most of our Gospel readings will be taken from the Gospel according to Mark.

Mark is often very blunt and harsh; but his Gospel is the most vivid of all. His Gospel is also the earliest Gospel to be written. It is customary to speak of the First Sunday of Advent as the beginning of our Church Year or Year of Grace. While this has much to say for it, the real “new year” probably should be at Easter time. Nevertheless, let us begin anew to celebrate the mysteries of Christ in our liturgy.

First Sunday of Advent, November 29, 2020

Dear Parishioners,

On this the last weekend of November, the Church begins a new liturgical year with this First Sunday of Advent. What this means is that our readings for Sundays and the weekdays are changed to a different cycle of readings. So for this year, we are in the Year A in our Sunday cycle of readings. (Just to remind you that these cycle of readings are a three year period, A, B, and C.) Our weekday readings are in Cycle II of a two year cycle of readings (Cycle I, Cycle II). The emphasis in our Sunday readings for Year A is the Gospel of St. Matthew.

Advent is the season (time) that “has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ’s second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout an expectant delight.” (Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year)


One of the customs of the Season of Advent is to have an Advent Wreath with four candles in it, three purple and one rose. For each Sunday of Advent, we light a candle, two purple for the first two Sundays, rose for the Third Sunday, and purple for the final Sunday of Advent. Before you light the candle, listen to the prophet Isaiah (9:1-2, 5-6). Upon completion, the prayer of blessing is as follows: “Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin. Pour forth your blessing upon us as we light the candles of this wreath; may their light reflect the splendor of Christ who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.”

Once again, I remind you of the dispensation from the Sunday obligation. I do this, not because I want to discourage you from Mass, but rather that I care so much for you that I don’t want anyone coming to Church when they are either feeling sick or might be vulnerable because of other weaknesses that are a part of your lives that could be detrimental if you caught the virus. I just hope and pray that this ends soon. But in the meantime, if you are in one of these compromising states, I Invite you to watch us on YOUTUBE or on our website. Until we are able to return to some normalcy, this will have to do for many of you. I’m very thankful that we have this new technology and if I do say so myself, it’s one of the best I have seen. But again for those who do attend, remember to keep your distance, and to wear your masks. Again, we have not had a case of contact tracing because of someone who caught the virus in Church. Praise the Lord for this!

Confessions will begin starting this week, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 6:00-7:00 p.m. These times are open to everyone in the parish to prepare them for Christmas. These times are also available to our 2nd graders who will be receiving their First Reconciliation this Advent. Everyone is invited!

Reminder to our parishioners that we are in our last weeks of having you return your Stewardship Commitment cards to us. These are very important and help us to know who are active parishioners in our parish. This latter point assists us in our tuition subsidy for St. Peter School. Take these cards to prayer and allow God to guide you in your renewal of your time, talents, and treasures.
