## Second Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 6, 2020

Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11; 2 Peter 3:8-14;  
Mark 1:1-8

Jewish tradition expected that everything would be instantly perfect when the Messiah came. There would be justice, peace, an end to all suffering and death, plenty of food and of the good things of earth for every faithful person. It didn't happen that way.

The primitive Church saw the problem: Jesus *IS* the Messiah; why then aren't things perfect? The Church proclaimed that all would be perfect when Jesus the Messiah returned in his glory. And that would be very soon. But it didn't happen.

Our second reading is a sort of rationalization at the delay in the glorious Coming of Christ (the Parousia.) It tells us that a day is as a thousand years, and vice versa, in God's eyes. According to his time frame, it has only been a couple of days since Jesus ascended to heaven. What happens when our expectations are not fulfilled? Do we lose hope? Are we embittered?

Our first reading is from the second part of Isaiah; it was written toward the end of the Babylonian Captivity. The Jews in exile expected liberation; they expected that the Messiah would come immediately and that all would be perfect.

The reading begins the section of Isaiah called "The Book of Consolation." The captivity (service) of the Jews is at an end, but they must make ready for the Coming of the Lord.

Jewish tradition taught that the Messiah would come instantly *IF* everyone repented at exactly the same time! It's not bad theology! If we all repented and prepared, surely the Lord would come in glory.

The Gospel is the beginning of Mark's Gospel: John the Baptist calls on us to "turn our lives around," to make straight a way for the Lord. If all of us do, then surely we would see the glory of the Lord.

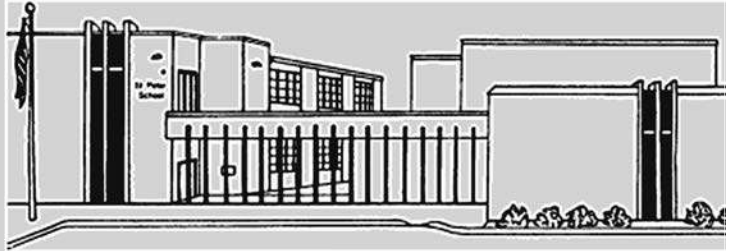
**Dear Parishioners,**

We gather this weekend to celebrate our Second Sunday in our season of Advent. As we continue our Advent preparation, the Church introduces us to a prophet of the Old Testament whose very mission was to prepare the people for the coming of the long awaited Messiah. This prophet is none other than John the Baptist. He bridges the gap between the Old Testament and the New Testament. As this bridge, He provides the hope that God would once again intervene in the history of the Jewish people and would fulfill His promise to send a Messiah. Then as the prophet of the New Testament, John ends up introducing Jesus to the people as that promised Messiah. In our Gospel for this day, John is depicted as a prophet, proclaiming a baptism of repentance, preparing and challenging the people to live as the people of the covenant. But John is also humble enough to acknowledge that “one mightier than he is coming,” that John “is not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals.” John remarks that he is baptizing with water, but the one who is to come, “will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.” My brothers and sisters we have received that baptism of the Holy Spirit, we have become His temples of His glory. As we prepare for Christmas let us pray that we live as those temples reflecting God’s presence in our world today.

It is also interesting in our second reading for our Mass today. So often we become complacent, thinking that Jesus will never come again. Peter tells his audience as well as us, “With the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day.” We are not to judge the delay of Jesus’ coming as a thought that he will not come in our lifetime. This could be the ultimate mistake in all of our lives. We have to live as if Jesus is coming soon, which is what Advent is trying to proclaim. And when He comes again, “there will be a new heaven and a new earth in which the righteous will dwell. Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before Him, at peace.” Encouraging words, challenging words, and words that should take root as we continue to prepare our lives for Jesus’ coming.

This Tuesday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. This Solemnity is important to us both in the United States as well as our Diocese, for it is this Solemnity for which Mary is designated as our patron. We have the very beautiful basilica in Washington, D.C. called the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception; we also have our Cathedral in Springfield called the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. It is under this title that our country and our Diocese is dedicated to Mary. With that in mind, it is also a Holy Day of Obligation. But because of the virus, the mandate for Mass on this day is lifted. But for those who still want to celebrate the Eucharist, the following are our Mass times: Monday, December 7, Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m. Then Tuesday, December 8, our Masses will be at 8:30 a.m., 12:10 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. I will also be having a Holy Day Mass at QND both on Tuesday at 9:45 a.m. and Wednesday, December 9, also at 9:45 a.m. This Solemnity affirms that Mary was conceived in her mother’s womb without sin. She is the new Eve who was to usher in through her fiat the new kingdom of God through the birth of her Son, Jesus. She was given this privilege which was intended for all of us but for sin in our lives.


