Fourth Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 20, 2020

2 Samuel 7:1-5,8b-12,14a,16;
Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38

Our God is the God of the unexpected and the un hoped for. In the first reading, God promised that the dynasty of David would last forever. This promise was handed down for centuries, even though the descendants of David were worthless and corrupt.

It was un hoped for that a descendant of David could be righteous – but the Lord promised it. The promise was fulfilled in Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of David.

The second reading reflects the un hoped for reconciliation of Jew and Gentile. Jews hated Gentiles as corrupt, immoral, pagan, and evil. Gentiles (non-Jews) hated Jews as condescending, snobbish, arrogant, picky people who separated themselves from others. Yet Jew and Gentile are united in Jesus, Messiah for the Jews and Savior for the Gentiles.

Jewish tradition never expected a divine Messiah nor the Virgin birth. But beyond expectation, God himself became man; he took human nature, being born of the ever-Virgin Mary!

If God has done the unexpected and un hoped for in the past, he can also do it now! He can even convert us to be his holy people. He can change our lives and our world. Let us renew our faith and our hope in the God of unexpected joy.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT/CHRISTMAS BULLETIN

Dear Parishioners,

This bulletin has a twofold purpose. First, it is a recognition that we are still anticipating Christmas as we celebrate the Fourth and last Sunday in our season of Advent. Second, it also is our Christmas bulletin as this bulletin wishes each and everyone of you a very Merry Christmas which will be celebrated this Thursday evening and Friday morning. So with one sentence, I wish you a hope-filled Advent from this weekend to Thursday and a very Joy-filled Christmas from Thursday-Friday and beyond.

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, God does the unexpected. He goes beyond our expectations, and hopes, and does something far greater. In our first reading, we hear how David wanted to build the Lord a house in which to dwell. But God states through the prophet Nathan that this was not his undertaking, but would belong to his son, Solomon. But God does something even further than that as God promises to build David a house that would last forever. From this house would come the Messiah, the anointed one, who would save the people of Israel. Then we find God once again entering the human history of a person, namely, Mary, and promises that this God would become one with humankind by being born of Mary. The most unlikely person to conceive a Son, a person of humble beginnings, who through her yes to God would bring forth a Savior. Talking about the unexpected. And yet, that's how God so operates in each of our lives. As we bring this Advent to a close let each of us be open to the unexpected presence of God in each of our lives, challenging each of us as He did Mary to respond in obedience to His will. Let Mary's fiat be our fiat.

This will be an interesting and most unusual Christmas for all of us. Because of the COVID, we are limited to the amount of people at each Mass. Our seating capacity (25%) is about 175-200 people. We cannot exceed that capacity if we want to maintain our social distancing policy. So I am asking you to realize and adhere to these regulations along with wearing your masks at the Mass you attend. **Our Christmas Eve Masses will be at 4:00, 6:00, 8:00, and 10:00 p.m. Christmas Day celebrations of Mass will be at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.** So far we have not had anyone tracing the spread of this virus from being present at Church and we want to maintain that record. Second, you have been asked to sign-up for the Mass in which you will attend. Sign-ups were last Thursday and your name will be checked for admittance into the Church. This is the only fair way and still safeguard the health of our parishioners. Third, there will be no seats reserved at any of our Masses as the ushers will seat you so that we can better use the seats available and still adhere to the 25% capacity. All of this might seem unreasonable to you and it probably is, but as I said this is a most unusual year for all of us. Fourth, those people who are most vulnerable for this virus I encourage you to stay at home and to watch it on television. Even though we have not had contact tracing of this virus from here in Church, we cannot let our guards down and must continually be on guard for it. In spite of all these precautions that we are undertaking, nevertheless I want to wish each and every one of you a very BLESSED AND MERRY CHRISTMAS! You have been special gifts to me during this trying time and I thank you for your cooperation.
