Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

DECEMBER 27, 2020

Sirach 3:2-6,12-14; Colossians 3:12-21;

Luke 2:22-40 or Luke 2:22, 39-40

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

We desperately need fathers who sacrifice themselves for their families. We need fathers and mothers who are firm in discipline with their children, but in whose hearts Christ's peace and love always reigns.

Children will grow to be like their models, their parents: If parents are undisciplined, children will likewise be undisciplined. If parents are indifferent in their faith, we can't expect children to be any different. Today we pray that our families will model themselves after the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus.

Our first reading is from *Sirach*. In older Bibles, this book is called *Ecclesiasticus*, a word which means "Church Book." It was called that because it was the most frequently used Old Testament book in the liturgy. The book is Hebrew poetry, in couplets.

Today's reading is plain common sense: Each member of the family needs to respect every other member. Each member of the family must realize his/her distinct role.

The second reading expands on this theme: Husbands are not wives, nor are wives husbands: each has a distinct role. Children are not parents; they must not usurp the parental role; nor can parents abdicate their responsibility to guide their children.

The Gospel scene is forty days after Jesus' birth. The Savior of the world, born in obscurity, is presented in the Temple. Two old people come and bear witness that he is the promised one. The Gospel was probably selected because of the last two sentences: The family returned to Nazareth, and Jesus grew, filled with wisdom and grace. And he was obedient to Mary and Joseph.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Feast, December 27, 2020

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend after our Solemnity of Christmas, the Church continues to celebrate this mystery of the Incarnation. Remembering the words of Scripture for this night, we hear the angels proclaiming, “For today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord. And this will be a sign for you; you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.” Thus the good news of Christmas. God chooses to send His Son into the world, born of Mary, and raised in a family. It is in this family structure that this Savior would experience all that there was to experience as a human being, faith, love, hope, and the many values lived in a family. And so on this Sunday after Christmas, we celebrate the intention of God to have His Son experience what most if not all of us experience, the life of a family. This weekend we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

In our Gospel reading for this weekend, we find Mary and Joseph, faithful Jewish people, presenting their Son Jesus in the temple for the purification rites of a Jewish family for their first born son. As was the ritual, they would have to offer a sacrifice since the first born was always to be consecrated to God. In their case, they offered “a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.” Through this sacrifice, then they would be able to take their son home and raise him in their family life. Then we hear the final words of our Gospel as it states: “The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon Him.” After reading this text, I thought of the many baptisms of young children whose parents bring them to Church. They too understand that this child is a gift to be raised in a family life, being nurtured in the love and faith of the family. Our families don’t offer a sacrifice other than a pledge of raising these children in the practice of the faith. How God chose to raise His Son in a human family, we too do the same as the family is the ideal place in which we learn our faith, our hope, and our love. May our families always realize the responsibility that belongs to them and be the best of teachers as was Mary and Joseph for Jesus.

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, my prayer and blessing for each of you is the following:


“We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own incarnate Son to become part of a family, so that, as He lived its life, He would experience its worries and its joy.

We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace, its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in the world to your glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.”
