Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

JANUARY 3, 2021

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:23a,5-6;
Matthew 2:1-12

Among Germans and Latins, Epiphany celebrated primarily the coming of the “three kings” or the Magi. In the ancient Church, Epiphany was the second greatest feast in the Church Year (after Easter!) It celebrated the glorious manifestation of God-in-the-flesh especially in three mysteries: The Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the wedding feast of Cana. Epiphany is actually older than Christmas as a festival.

Nowadays, Epiphany celebrates the universality of God’s love. The message of the Gospel is for all peoples of all times and all places. It is intended for Gentiles as well as Jews.

Each of the texts of Mass refers to the inclusion of Gentiles (non-Jews) in salvation: “You have revealed your glory to the nations.” (Opening Prayer) “Nations shall walk by your light.” (First Reading) “Lord every nation on earth will adore you.” (Responsorial Psalm) “In Christ Jesus, the Gentiles are now co-heirs with the Jews...” (Second Reading)

The Magi or Wise Men were Gentiles. The irony is that they came from afar to honor the King of kings, while those who were near were either indifferent or hostile. The Bible does not tell us how many Magi there were; it merely says that there were three gifts. The gifts are symbolic: gold for nobility; frankincense for divinity; and myrrh (an embalming spice) prophetic of the Lord’s saving death.

The star has many possible explanations. It may be a literary device. Perhaps it was a celestial phenomenon such as Halley’s Comet or a conjunction of planets. The message is clear: The star leads us to the Light of the World, the One who came to save all peoples of every nation. Wise men follow in faith!

The Epiphany of the Lord, January 3, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

“Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you.” Thus begins the words of our first reading for this Solemnity of the Epiphany. Yes, the light has entered into the darkness of sin and has brought a new radiance into our world, a radiance that reflects the love, the presence of our God in our midst. Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. That word is a beautiful expression that states that God has manifested Himself to His Creation in the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, the newborn king of the Jews. And what is our response? It's found in the beautiful Responsorial Psalm that reflects the attitude of people when recognizing this presence, namely, *“Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.”*

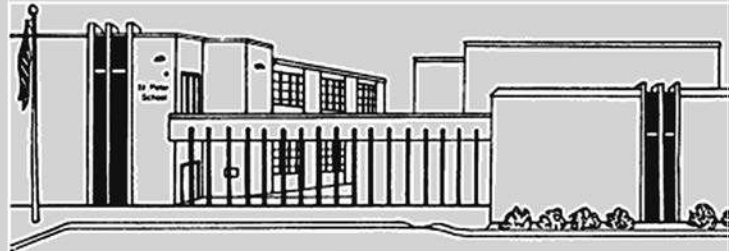
As Christmas reflected God's manifestation of Himself, His Epiphany, to the chosen people, the Israelites, today this Epiphany is God manifesting Himself to the non-Jewish world, symbolized by the magi. These mysterious visitors who are often pictured as astrologers and later as kings, brought forth gifts, namely gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Since our Scriptures don't say much, it was interpreted that these gifts were the following: gold, for the royalty of Jesus; frankincense, for the divinity of Jesus; and myrrh, for the passion and death of Jesus. We don't know much more, but St. Bede the Venerable, considered them to be representatives of the three continents of Europe, Asia, and Africa. Because of that, we often see them racially presented in figures which are white, yellow, and black. Also according to this same Bede, their names were Melchior, Gaspar, and Balthasar. According to legend, after they left the house of Jesus on this day, St. Thomas the Apostle visited the Magi and, after catechizing them, initiated them into the Christian faith. They were ordained priests, and later, bishops. Toward the end of their lives, at the legend goes, the Christmas star revisited them, this time leading them to one another for a reunion. The city of Sewa in the Orient is said to be the place of burial. Furthermore, according to legend, their relics were brought to Cologne in Germany, where they are enshrined in the Basilica, where they are honored by pilgrims ever since. As Paul Harvey would say, this is the rest of the story. (Catholic Source Book)

St. Peter School will resume this Monday, January 4. We hope and pray that this in person educational experience will last for many days and weeks ahead as we enter this new school year of 2021. Let's continue to pray for the health and well being of our students, faculty, staff, and parents.

I want to thank everyone for cooperating so well in our sign-up for the Masses for Christmas. Not everyone was able to attend the Masses for which they wanted but I just hope that everyone will understand that this is not a normal year and we have to abide by both the 25% seating capacity as well as other social distancing. This virus has affected everything that we do and unfortunately we have to follow the guidelines and directions given to us.

In this New Year, may the Lord bless you and keep you! The Lord let His face shine upon you and be gracious to you! May the Lord look upon you and give you peace. Amen!

Protecting God's Children Online

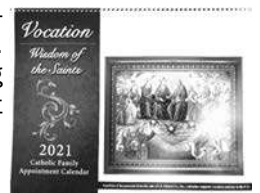
During the current state of COVID-19, Protecting God's Children can be completed ONLINE or in person. This is a ONE TIME certification.
