## Baptism of The Lord

JANUARY 10, 2021

Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7; Acts 10:34-38;

Mark 1:7-11

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

The baptism of Jesus was his inaugural as the Suffering Servant of the Lord. Every prophet had an inaugural experience. Jesus' inaugural comes at his baptism. He identifies himself with sinful mankind by accepting a baptism leading to repentance and forgiveness. In so doing, he takes upon himself all the suffering and sins of the whole world.

The "Suffering Servant Songs in Isaiah (of which our first reading is the first) tell of an "everyman" figure who humbles himself, who is gentle, and who takes all evil unto himself; by his own suffering, he vicariously heals all.

This Suffering Servant Song begins with the words "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am well-pleased." In the original languages, these are almost identical with the words of the Father in the Gospel.

Mark's language is much stronger than our translations: Mark really says that the heavens were "ripped apart" and the Spirit descended as a dove. The dove was a representation or symbol of Israel. In this sign, then, Jesus becomes Israel personified; he becomes the sinful people of the Lord. He will strip off all sin in his saving death and resurrection.

The second reading is the story of the conversion of Cornelius. God is no respecter of persons; Jesus came to save all peoples of all times and places.

In our baptism, we are freed from sin precisely because in his baptism Jesus took to himself the suffering and sinfulness of the world. Jesus' other "baptism" is when he gives his life for the sake of us all; he strips away all sin and nails it to the cross. Through this "baptism" he empowers the sacraments to be signs of his salvation among us.

## *The Baptism of the Lord - Feast, January 10, 2021*

### **Dear Parishioners,**

Last weekend, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany. This Epiphany is a Holy Day for the Catholic Church as it celebrates Jesus manifesting His glory to the entire world. As I stated in my column, this entire world was represented by the Magi. Well, that was the first of three Epiphanies that the Church celebrates. The second of the three we have in our celebration today, the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus. Why is this Feast an Epiphany, you might ask? Well, if you look at the Gospel for this feast, we have St. John the Baptist declaring, “One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of His sandals.” And so Jesus enters the water of the Jordan and was baptized by John. But then comes the Epiphany. What we find as Jesus came out of the water, is the glory of God being shown in Jesus. The “heavens were torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descended upon Him and a voice came from the heavens, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.”” This one event truly is an Epiphany for John and all who were present as witnesses to it. What we find is a declaration as to whom Jesus is, the very Son of God. We also find in this event, the first time revelation to all God’s people that our God is a triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. All are present as our Epiphany at this Baptism of Jesus.


So often people think that we are baptized in imitation of Jesus’ baptism. This is entirely untrue. First of all, Jesus did not need to be baptized for Jesus was without all sin. Second, John’s baptism was a type of baptism for forgiveness of sin, it wasn’t a baptism like ours which immerses us into the very life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Because John’s baptism was different from ours, we realize that when Jesus enters into the water to be baptized by John that He was accepting on His very shoulders all the sins of the entire world, past, present, and future. And in His death, He would nail those sins to the cross, and in rising from the dead, He would give us new life. And so today, we celebrate this Epiphany of Jesus declaring so much of what we believe and what we celebrate.

The third and final Epiphany would be Jesus’ invitation to the wedding feast of Cana, and working His first miracle, changing the water into wine. Once again this very act manifests who Jesus is, and the glory that is part of His life. But this Gospel will not come until a later time.

With this celebration we conclude our Christmas season. It is always with a bit of sadness that we take down our decorations. I know that I am a bit prejudiced, but I don’t think you can find a Church in Quincy as beautifully decorated as St. Peter’s. I want to thank the entire committee for their help in decorating as well as their help in taking down. A special thanks to Ronda Wand for coordinating and leading the charge.

With the closing of Christmas, we begin the first week in Ordinary Time. Again this time is considered “ordinary” because there is no special feast or season that the Church is celebrating. However, any time that we celebrate the Eucharist together, it is never “ordinary” but always grace filled. This time will continue until we celebrate the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 17.

### Protecting God's Children Online


During the current state of COVID-19, Protecting God's Children can be completed ONLINE or in person. This is a ONE TIME certification.
