Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

JANUARY 17, 2021

1 Samuel 3:3-10,19;

1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a,17-20;

John 1:35-42

Every one of us has a call from God. It is not only a call “in general” to be holy. It is a specific and concrete call to serve the Lord in a special way. From all eternity, God called each of us to serve him in a way which is unique; no other person who will ever live can serve the Lord in precisely the same way as we do!

The problem is that we do not hear the voice of the Lord, as Samuel did. Jesus does not talk to us in the same way that he spoke to Peter and Andrew. We must pray, and ask the Lord to make known to us how he wants us to serve him.

The first reading is the call of Samuel. Samuel was a “child of promise.” His parents were childless in their old age. They promised that, if they had a child, they would dedicate him to the Lord. Samuel was reared in the temple. He did not recognize God’s call at first; but finally, he said “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.”

Our bodies are members of the very Body of Christ; we are temples of the Holy Spirit. The motive for Christian purity and modesty is that we belong to Christ. We should not want to involve Christ in impurity. Our call from God includes a call to purity.

The Gospel is John’s story of the call of Peter and Andrew. (This is quite different from the call which Mark describes in next Sunday’s Gospel.) Peter and Andrew were disciples of John the Baptist. John points out Jesus as the Lamb; Andrew spent the day with Jesus, and then brought Peter to Jesus.

Let us seek to know our call from God. Let us pray especially that many of our young people will recognize that God is calling them to the priesthood and to the Religious life.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 17, 2021

Dear Parishioners,


Now that we have taken down all the Christmas decorations, our Church seems so bare. Yes, I know that there is beauty in simplicity, but the decorations for Christmas added so much to our Church. But until next year, they will be a memory.

We now have returned to what the Church calls "ordinary time." This means the time that there is no distinctive character to our celebrations but rather celebrate the mystery of Christ in fullness throughout these days of "ordinary time." This time will remain with us until Ash Wednesday, February 17.

Since there is no First Sunday in Ordinary Time, only the first week which was last week, this weekend we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our first reading from the Book of Samuel says so much about our encounters with Christ in our lives. In this reading, we find Samuel asleep in the temple when the Lord speaks to him. Not realizing it was God, he went to Eli the priest and said to him, "Here I am, you called me." This happened not only once but two more times when Eli realized that God must be calling Samuel. So Eli makes sure that the third time, Samuel was to answer with the following: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." And so it happened. The Lord called, Samuel listened, and then responded with those words which should be our own, "Speak, for your servant is listening." So often throughout our lives, we have a tendency with our Lord to do all the talking, petitioning Him for this or that, asking for attention to this matter or some other, and perhaps praising and thanking Him for what He has done. In this reading, we are called to be the listeners. It's very difficult to do when we are always talking. And so God nudges us in certain ways, like in a dream or at night when we are asleep, and calls our name to listen to Him. It's a beautiful lesson about prayer. Do we listen in our experiences of prayer, or are we always talking? It's by listening that perhaps we can utter with the psalmist today, "Here I am Lord, I come to do your will." We can't know His will for us unless we listen.

Recently, our bishop has enlightened us concerning a practice that has become a part of our Eucharistic celebrations, namely, giving blessings when people come up for Holy Communion. These blessings were given to children who are not receiving Holy Communion, and were also given to people who would come up and cross their arms over their chest (not Catholics). In a recent communication to all pastors and priests, he wants this practice stopped. There are a variety of reasons for doing so, and in respect for him and his teaching authority in the Church we will abide by his counsel. So if a person comes up with arms crossed, or a child comes up with his/her parents, the response is basically to say, without touching the adult or child, "Receive Christ in your heart." This is not a blessing but an invitation to worship. I know that I still find myself doing what I normally have done in the past and will take time to break myself of this habit. But I am asking all of our Eucharistic ministers to begin doing what he has asked of the parishioners of his diocese. Just as a personal note, I was one lone negative for this mandate to the diocese. But he is the bishop and I have promised him obedience so we will do our best to follow what is demanded (in time).
