## Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JANUARY 31, 2021

Deuteronomy 18:15-20;  
1 Corinthians 7:32-35; Mark 1:21-28

There are several ways of understanding today's first reading from Deuteronomy. Recall that the Deuteronomistic tradition came long after Moses. Deuteronomy is a series of sermons and moral admonitions which are placed on the lips of Moses. Very likely they are part of the prophetic tradition.

The prophet held a distinct place in Israel. Peasants and kings feared the prophet, for his word came from God. The prophet was independent of priest and monarch. His voice was the conscience of Israel.

Today's reading may be the justification of the prophetic mission: Moses promises that prophets will arise from among the people, and they must be listened to, for they will speak with the authority of God.

But tradition found another meaning in this passage. Israel looked forward to the time when the Prophet par excellence would come. He would be like Moses; he would surpass Moses; he would be the Messiah.

The Gospel is the fulfillment of this expectation: Jesus speaks with authority, and not like the Scribes of the Pharisees. They split hairs and talked of cases; Jesus speaks with the authority of God himself. He heals in the power of the Spirit.

The second reading, the continuous reading, is St. Paul's admonition to celibacy and virginity because "the time is short." He means that the Second Coming of Christ is near. But it really was *not* near. Nevertheless, the celibate state and the state of virginity for the sake of the Lord are holy. The Church cherishes these in order that men and women may more freely serve the Lord and his Church.

A theme of today's Mass might be: To whom do we listen? Are we willing to hear the voice of God, even when he calls us to change? Will we listen to his authentic representatives in the Church, or do we seek those who tickle our fancy and suit our own whims?

**Dear Parishioners,**


Well, the month of January is now a memory. It seems to have dragged along in a slow pace, but we have survived this month with the pandemic still at large as well as the winter weather affecting the things we can do or not do. With the vaccine being distributed, we may be able to restore some normalcy to our lives in the near future. As far as the winter weather, we are about less than two months before our calendar says it's Spring. So let's all hang in there and remain people filled with that virtue of hope.

In my bulletin column last week, I presented the Bishop's concern about the Communion procession as well as people who are not Catholic as well as our children coming forward to receive a blessing. In a spirit of obedience and cooperation, we will follow his desire and will abide by his directions. Instead of blessings, we will still acknowledge those coming forward, be they young or old, and invite them to a spiritual communion as we say, "Receive Christ in your hearts." I ask all of our Eucharistic ministers to follow this direction. I know that habits are hard to break as I find myself still wanting to bless especially the children. It will take time but let's put our efforts into it and we will survive even this.

Our Bishop is also looking at returning normalcy to our celebration of the Eucharist by limiting the dispensation from Sunday Mass. Not sure when that will happen as we still are bound by the social distancing mandate from the government. As long as the social distancing is in place, we really can't increase our attendance because of the limitations in seating in the Church. But in an effort to provide more opportunities for people to celebrate the Eucharist with us, and still maintain the social distancing, we will be having weeknight Masses offered at 6:30 p.m. during Lent. Again, this is a tremendous opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist on a weekly basis or even daily basis for people who have stayed away because of the COVID. Please think about this as an opportunity for you and your families.

This weekend we begin to celebrate National Catholic School's Week in our country. This is the week we acknowledge the value of Catholic Schools in our community and continue our pledge to support and maintain them as a ministry of our parish to spread our Catholic faith. I am a product of Catholic education and to this day I continue to appreciate all that I received in going to a Catholic school. And so I cherish my Catholic schools as they helped frame and nurture me in my educational experiences. They allowed me to grow in my faith, to practice my faith, and to be able to celebrate the sacraments as well as to be able to pray each and every day. That in itself is a valuable asset to any young person as they face the struggles and challenges of life. Did we have all the opportunities of the public school system? No, but what we did have was an acknowledgement of our faith life, a better understanding of being a good citizen on earth while keeping our focus on the things that will last, namely eternal life. I want to thank you for your continual support of Catholic education as it provides a foundation for being a good citizen of earth and of heaven. May God bless you for helping our young people appreciate and live their life of faith.

During the Thursdays of Lent, I want to offer an opportunity to our parishioners to help them gain and appreciate a greater understanding of the Sacraments. One of my favorite presenters is Bishop Robert Barron. I purchased for myself his presentation on the Sacraments. I would like to share these discs with you, discussing each of the sacraments each Thursday, from 7:00-8:00 in Church. We would show you the presentation, and then have some points of discussion with you afterwards. Each sacrament will have its own night, but marriage and holy orders will be together. The presentations will vary from 25 minutes to 30 minutes. I invite you to be a part of our group. Come, celebrate the Eucharist, and then stay for some adult learning of our faith. Please consider this as a way of growing in your Catholic faith this Lent. The first session will be February 18.

## Haiti Sister Parish News

Father Michel recently sent videos of parish activities in Haiti during the Christmas season. The ongoing political unrest has made it difficult for his parishioners to obtain food and the basic necessities of life. None-the-less he was able to provide a meal to them following the Masses.

The Sister Parish Committee has been in contact with the Parish Twinning Program in Nashville, TN about participating in a second matching grant to purchase food. Unfortunately, COVID-19 has negatively impacted the implementation of the second initiative. We hope to hear something positive soon. Last year we were able to nourish over three hundred of our Haitian sisters and brothers through the first matching grant.
