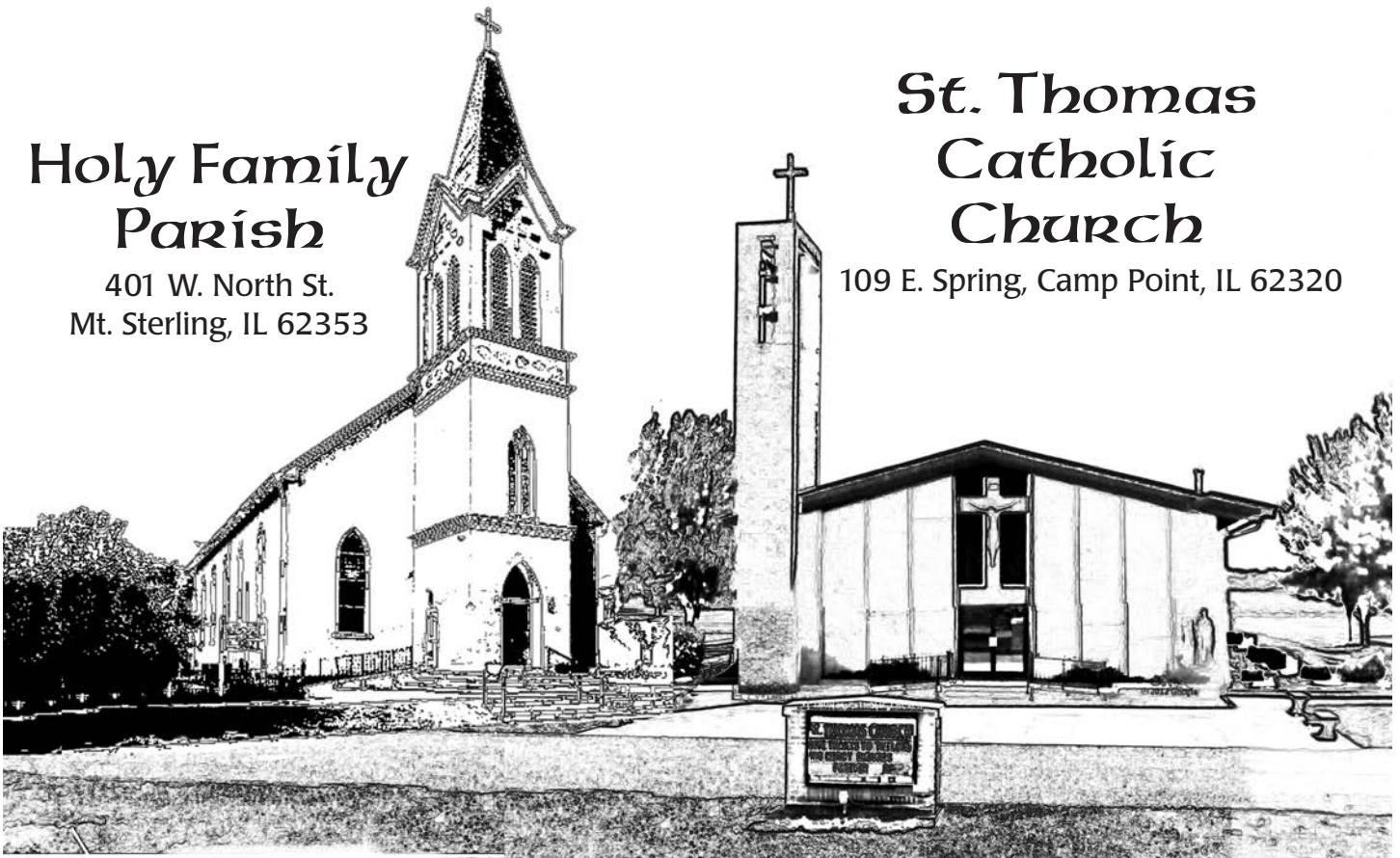

From the Pastor's Desk

Having entered into the Season of Lent and now celebrating the Second Sunday of Lent already, I encourage you to first stop and ask yourself how the Lenten Season is going for you. How have you taken up the spiritual disciplines that the Lord doesn't just suggest but expects of us...prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

If your reflection on this question brings you to suggest that you haven't entered into those spiritual disciplines so well (or maybe not at all) or that perhaps you have fallen short of sticking to those disciplines, then refocus yourself this very day, this very moment. Do not let another day pass or even another moment before embarking on those spiritual disciplines. It's far too easy for us to believe that I've failed up to this point, I might as well forget it. That's nothing but the devil himself talking and when we listen to him and all his deceit, we do nothing but stay where we're at in our spiritual life and our spiritual disciplines, keeping us from the Lord. But the Lord is calling us to more, much more, and the spiritual practices we embark on help to purify us, to strengthen us, to make us holy, and to draw us ever closer to the Lord.

Our Liturgical prayers for Lent are beautiful and remind us of the Lord's call for us to engage in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The prayers used for Ash Wednesday Masses are powerful. As we began the Season of Lent, the Opening Prayer for the Ash Wednesday Mass asked the Lord that we begin this campaign of Christian service with holy fasting so that, as we take up the battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. The highlighting of the reality of spiritual evils is so very important. One of the devil's greatest tricks and accomplishments is to convince folks that he nor these spiritual evils exist. THEY DO! And they are all around us. And we need not fear them, but we do need to be ever mindful of them and know that they are real so that we do not fall to them.

And in one of the formulas for the blessing of the ashes on Ash Wednesday we prayed "O God, who are moved by acts of humility and respond with forgiveness to works of penance, lend Your merciful ears to

our prayers and in Your kindness pour out the grace of Your blessing on Your servants...that, as they follow the Lenten observances, they may be worthy to come with minds made pure to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Your Son."

In the Prayer Over the Offerings at Ash Wednesday, we prayed, in part, that through works of penance and charity, we may turn away from harmful pleasures and, cleansed from our sins, may become worthy to celebrate devoutly the Passion of Your Son.

Finally, in Preface III of Lent, we hear that God wills that our self-denial should give Him thanks, humble our sinful pride, contribute to the feeding of the poor, and so help us to imitate Him in His kindness.

What beautiful and profound prayers we have as we embark on the Season of Lent. And though many of us heard these prayers at Ash Wednesday Masses, I thought it was well worth repeating them here and sharing them once again as we not only move through Lent but embrace the Lenten Season and reflect on our own lives and on our own call from the Lord to be purified and to grow in holiness. How are we doing?

Again, today the Church celebrates the Second Sunday of Lent. In the First Reading from Genesis, we hear, perhaps shockingly, the Lord calling Abraham to take his only son, Isaac, whom he loved, and offer him as a holocaust. And while Abraham obeys and readies the sacrifice, God, of course, stops Abraham. Having been put to the test, Abraham's faithfulness to God is revealed and with evidence of that faithfulness, God grants Abraham righteousness, making him the father of a great nation through whom "all nations of the earth shall find blessing."

Christ is the descendant of Abraham and it's worth noting what theologians often point out about the scene in the First Reading, that is, the parallels between this episode and the Crucifixion of Christ. Perhaps you've heard it before, but it is a good reminder for us as we allow the Living Word of God to permeate our hearts and minds and lives all the more. Though we do not hear it in the First Reading today, Isaac carries the wood for the sacrifice; Jesus carried His cross. Additionally, Abraham was willing to sacrifice his only beloved son for God; God did sacrifice His only Beloved Son for us.

The First Reading also points to another important element...our call and really, our need, to hand everything over to the Lord and to hand it over to Him in complete trust. I know...much easier said than done, Father! Believe me, I know that...I'm reminded of that each and every day in my own life and in my own attempt to follow Christ completely and with full trust.

What we have and who we are is from God and God alone and is meant to be handed over to the Lord in service to Him and one another for the building up of His Kingdom. We often times are very willing to hand over our sufferings and our trials with an expectation that the Lord will remove them from us. Indeed, we should hand our sufferings and trials over to the Lord but not with an expectation but with reflection on how we are being drawn more fully into holiness through them. But our call is to hand our entire selves over to the Lord, all that we have, all that we are, all that we do and accomplish because it is all a gift from God that we return back to Him, our Creator. We do that, of course, for our growth in holiness and to reflect our faithfulness in the Lord so that we too might be granted righteousness. We do it out of pure love for God.

As we return to the readings for today, God's sacrifice of His Son for us is at the heart of St. Paul's message to the Romans. God loves us and His love was made when God "did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all." And because of this, we have reason to hope since Jesus, who sits at the right hand of God, "indeed interceded for us" as St. Paul reminds us.

This hope is brought to light in today's Gospel. The Gospel passage is St. Mark's account of the Transfiguration. (As a side note, the custom of reading today's Gospel near the beginning of Lent may have come from an ancient tradition which held that the Transfiguration of Jesus took place forty days before Good Friday). The Transfiguration of Jesus demonstrated His Divine Nature and manifested the glory that He had always possessed, the same glory He would return to. It is also a prefiguring of the glory we shall one day obtain in our resurrected bodies...that is our hope that is brought to light. If we live and die with Christ, if we do in fact "listen to Him" as the voice in today's Gospel instructs

us to, then we can hope to take our place among the saints and enjoy the glory of Heaven for all eternity.

Our Psalm today calls out, "O Lord, I am Your servant." May we always, through God's grace, be His servant in all things so as to grow in holiness and share in that great joy of Eternal Life which is our hope.

And now a few notes:

-LENTEN REGULATIONS - 1. ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed. 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

-ADDITIONAL MASSES DURING LENT - Wednesday evenings at 5:30 p.m. at Holy Family. Thursday evenings at 5:30 p.m. at St. Thomas.

-ADDITIONAL CONFESSION TIMES - I will be offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation before each of the additional evening Masses during Lent...Wednesday evenings, 4:45-5:15 p.m. at Holy Family and Thursday evenings from 4:45-5:15 p.m. at St. Thomas. I will also offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Sundays during Lent before the start of the Stations of the Cross. I will try to be in the Reconciliation Room by 12:45 p.m. until 1:15 p.m.

-STATIONS OF THE CROSS - Wednesday evenings after the 5:30 p.m. Mass at Holy Family. Friday evenings at St. Thomas at 7:00 p.m. Sunday afternoons at 1:30 p.m., alternating parishes (Sunday, February 28 will be at Holy Family, Sunday, March 7 will be at St. Thomas).

-40 DAYS FOR LIFE - St. Thomas has the 40 Days for Life Calendar in the Back of Church. There are still days open. Please sign-up for one or more days to pray for life during Lent.

-RICE BOWLS - Are in the back of each church. Please consider taking one and using

it as part of the Lenten Season and your own Lenten practices.

-POPE'S INTENTION - The Holy Father's Prayer Intention for March is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Let us pray that we may experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation with renewed depth, to taste the infinite mercy of God.

-FIRST FRIDAY - Friday, March 5 is First Friday. We will have First Friday Devotion at St. Thomas. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from Noon until 5:45 p.m. followed by Benediction at 5:45 p.m. and Mass at 6:00 p.m. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available from 5:00-5:45 p.m. I encourage each of you to take some time to join us.
