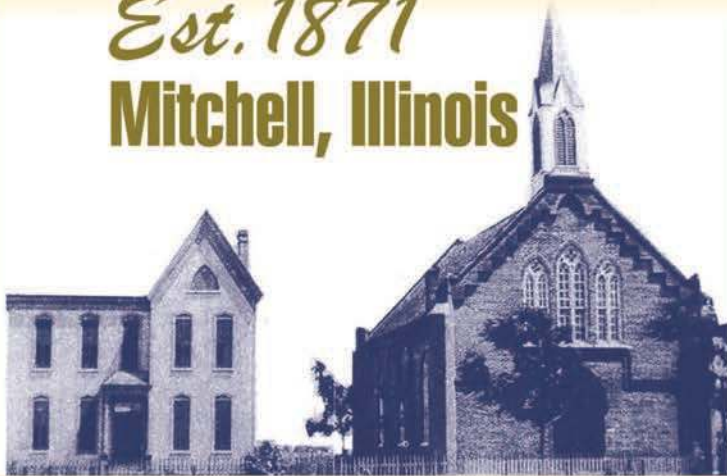
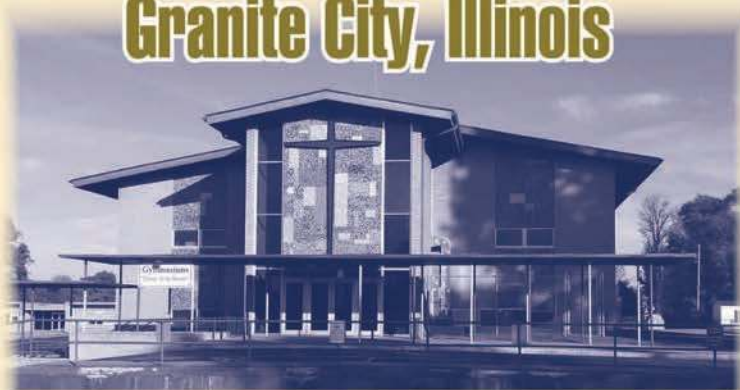

Sunday's Mass Readings

First Sunday of Lent – 21 February 2021

Genesis 9:8-15; Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9; 1 Peter 3:18-22; Mark 1:12-15.

If we go into the desert with Jesus this Lent, his grace will move us forward in our life of faith. Lent isn't an end unto itself; we go into the desert with Jesus in order to advance in holiness and in our spiritual life. All the blessings and trials in our lives are not closed events. They're precursors to more: greater trust in God, deeper union with him, and a greater sense of our mission to proclaim the kingdom of God.

THE WORD: In the first reading, God establishes a covenant with Noah and his sons, promising never to flood the earth again. In the second reading, Peter writes to his community about those in the days of Noah who were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which is what saves them now. In the Gospel, Jesus is tempted by Satan in the desert. He then goes to Galilee to begin his public ministry.

From our Pastor's Desk

Father Alfred Tumwesigye

Praised be Jesus Christ! This is our first Sunday of Lent 2021. In his Lenten message this year, Pope Francis Says: **“Lent is a time for believing, for welcoming God into our lives and allowing Him to “make his dwelling” among us.”** This is a season of grace, where through Fasting, Prayer and Charity we encounter a Merciful God who desires each one of us with tender love.

This takes a Lenten journey (40-Days) through which day-by-day, the Lord's covenant with us is renewed as He did with Noah and his sons: **“See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals ... I will establish my covenant with you...”** (Genesis 9:9-11).

My dear brothers and sisters, God is more important than we are, and so is what God wants and does. So, Lent is the opportune time to focus more of our attention on what God is doing, not only in our lives, but also in the lives of others and the rest of Creation with our lives.

As for us and as with every other generation, our response should be a deeper appreciation and understanding of His desire for each one of us. He is our Lord, who created and formed us long ago for His glory, and has redeemed us through the passion and resurrection of His Son, not because of our righteous deeds we had done, but because of His mercy – through baptism and renewal of the Holy Spirit.

If we are to renew our faith, and subsequently our lives with the Lord this Lent, then each one of us has to begin to respond better to God in Prayer. The personal response is expected of each one of us to the loving presence of God.

Let us offer our personal response to God's presence this Lent, be aware and acknowledge His presence. Remember, His love for us is more important than our love for Him. This is everything we can be – being docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, through which God communicates to us, in the interior of our hearts.

May each day be an opportune moment where we can open space for God to speak to us of His love and promises for us. Let us remain faithful and conscious to that union of God with us during this Lent.

A few people have found the ongoing *Seven Sorrows & Seven Joys of St. Joseph* devotion series (further in the bulletin) interesting and have asked for more information on the background of the devotion. I first came across the devotion when praying the *Consecration to St. Joseph: Wonders of our Spiritual Father*, which I highly recommend (<https://www.consecrationtostjoseph.org/>).

From what I can tell, the devotion was included in the long out of print book, *Pious Union of St. Joseph: Manual of Devotions for Every Day*, by Fr. Hugolinus Joseph Storff, OFM, printed in 1943. According to the book, “This devotion's origin is traced to an incident involving two Franciscan priests traveling in a ship along the Belgium coast. A storm hit, and the ship was sunk. For three days and three nights, the two priests clung to a plank and prayed to St. Joseph. Then, at one point, in youthful form, the spouse of the Virgin Mary and foster father of Jesus Christ appeared to the priests, guided them to safety, and taught them the practice of reciting seven Our Fathers and seven Hail Marys in honor of his Seven Sorrows and Seven Joys.”

The Seven Sorrows and Seven Joys each stem from seven powerful moments in St. Joseph's life. We are invited to learn a larger lesson from this. As the little old devotional book says, “A main issue in our life is to capitalize our sorrows and joys for eternity. Too many sufferings and consolations are lost for heaven. The method to sanctify sorrow and joy is to endure them all patiently and to offer them up in union with Mass celebrated throughout the world joined to the intercession of Mary Immaculate and St. Joseph for the salvation of the dying.”

This is a good lesson for us in Lent, too... enduring our sorrows *and* our joys and offering them in union with the Mass and to the intercession of Mother Mary and St. Joseph.

After our Rite of Sending at the 8:00 Mass this Sunday morning, our RCIA Catechumens (those who are preparing for Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil) will head to the Cathedral in Springfield for the annual Rite of Election. We give thanks to God for calling these people to faith in the Church, and to this formal Rite in which our bishop, as the leader of our local Church, ratifies that call on behalf of God's Church. Please continue to pray for our Catechumens and Candidate as they prepare for the Easter Sacraments through this Lenten journey. May God bring to completion the good work He has begun in them!

With last weekend in Springfield for the second half of my Trinity class, then a trip to Springfield this Saturday for my annual interview with the diocesan psychologist, then back to Springfield for the Rite of Election on Sunday, I'm thinking that maybe I need to set up a second home there. But as a fellow parishioner noted, “It's all in a day of God's work!” God-willing, in 125 days, Bishop Paprocki will ordain my brother classmates and me to service as Deacons for our diocese.

I hope to see you again Sunday night at our weekly Holy Hour with Vespers and Benediction at 7 p.m. Please join us!

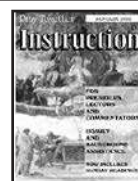
