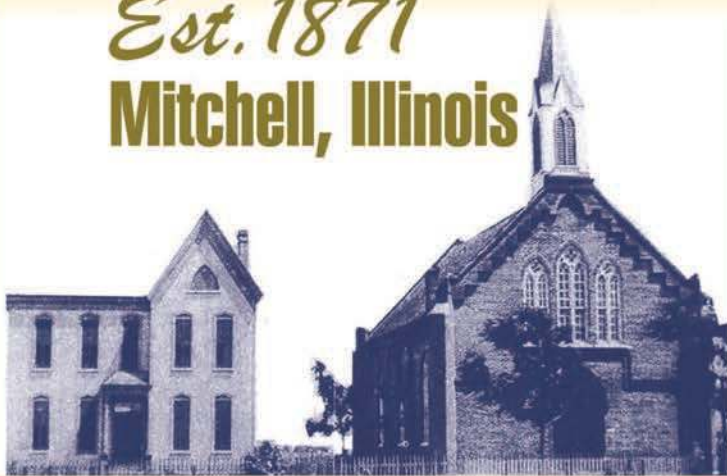
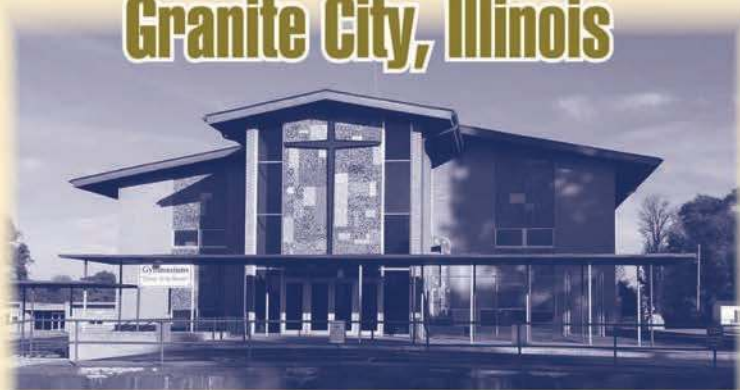

Sunday's Mass Readings

Second Sunday of Lent – 28 February 2021

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18. Psalm 116:10, 15, 16-17, 18-19. Romans 8:31b-34. Mark 9:2-10.

Listen to Him. One week into Lent, we are simply told by the voice from the cloud: Listen to Jesus. He told us last Sunday to "believe in the gospel." What does belief in this Good News look and sound like this Lent, this year?

- Since we are descendants of Abraham, how am I to behave with my cousins (that is, everyone)?
- Since we are sisters and brothers in the Lord Jesus Christ, to whom do I listen? What am I told?
- Since I am also "beloved", what will I do?

From our Pastor's Desk

Father Alfred Tumwesigye

Praised be Jesus Christ! The Second Sunday of Lent is here! The season of Lent is the most favorable time not only to encounter our Savior Jesus in a new way, but also to delve deep and listen to the good news of salvation. While prayer is one of the hallmarks of Lenten Season, the liturgy of this weekend underlines the importance of listening, of being attuned and attentive to the Word of God as we stand in His Holy presence.

In the Gospel narrative (Matthew. 17:1-9) this weekend, Jesus invites us for an ascent to the mountain – the holy site for the intimate closeness with our God. Our Lord takes Peter, James and John to the top of Mt. Tabor, and he reveals who He is to them in His glorified form. The three disciples of Jesus are called to be people who listen to His voice and take his words seriously – as the voice came from the cloud: **“This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.”** (Mark 9:7).

My dear brothers and sisters, listening is followed by following through what our Lord Jesus expects of us! Think of it – what is Jesus for you, and what has He done for you? He is a sacrifice for our sins, He offered Himself upon the cross of Calvary, and at every sacrifice of Mass, He desires us to share in his Easter glory.

Let us receive and listen to Him who is our sacrificial gift/Passover lamb (1 Corinthians. 5:7). As we listen, we turn away from our sins and we are interiorly transformed and renewed! During this sacred time and space, may we be more sensitive and receptive to the incredible sign of Jesus' saving love. **“This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.”** (Mark 9:7) As we carry and participate in the way of the cross this Lent, may we be more open to God's grace.

As our patriarch in Faith, Abraham, in the first reading, offers his beloved son as a sacrifice to God, and reminds us that God, who lacks for nothing, is glad to have the gift of our sacrifices, not because he gets something great from them, but because we do. I therefore, pray that we be sacrifices pleasing to God during this Lenten Season. Let us join our Lord Jesus for that spiritual climb to the Holy mountain as never before – to Mt. Tabor, and allow ourselves to be transformed by the Spirit of the Lord.

You may ask yourself, where do I go for this ‘Holy Climb’? This could be to a retreat event, reconciliation service, joining a Bible study group, or any other place of silence, where we listen more, and perceive better the Voice of the Lord. *“It is from the mountain, and back down into the plain,”* Pope Francis said, *“where we meet many brothers and sisters weighed down by fatigue, injustice, and both material and spiritual poverty.”* (Pope Francis Angelus Second Sunday of Lent March 16, 2014)

May God give us the grace during this Lenten season to carry the fruits of the experience we have with God to our troubled brothers and sisters, sharing with them the treasures of grace received. Jesus is our Easter Light; let us trust in that light (the hope of resurrection) the way Abraham trusted in God.

Last Sunday at the 10:30 Mass, we welcomed our two RCIA **Catechumens** (those seeking Baptism, Confirmation, and first Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil) and had the *Rite of Sending*. After that, we loaded up in cars and drove to the Cathedral in Springfield for the *Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion* with Bishop Parocki. In that Rite, our **Catechumens** officially became the **“Elect”** – with the Bishop ratifying their “call” (their “election”) by Christ on behalf of the Church. Congratulations to our **Elect** – Mrs. Lauren Nash and Mr. Gerald Broadwater. We continue to pray with and for both of you as you continue this Lenten journey to the Easter Sacraments!

This Sunday at 10:30 Mass, we have another Scrutiny – this time for our one **Candidate** for Full Reception into the Church. This **Candidate**, Daniel Kraus, was already Baptized into another Christian church community earlier in life, and now seeks reception into the Catholic Church entry into the sacramental life of the Church. We also continue to pray with Daniel as he journeys this Lent toward reception, Confirmation, and first Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

Next, on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, our **Elect** will be back for additional **Scrutinies** (which include minor exorcisms) at the 4:30, 8:00, and 10:30 Masses, respectively. This will allow each of the different groups at each of the different Masses to see our **Elect** on their Lenten journey.

You are welcome to join with us any Thursday night for our RCIA meetings, where you can also learn alongside our Elect and our Candidate. You can also invite anyone with you – Catholic or non-Catholic. This is another good way to learn more about our faith, and to invite others along on that journey.

I was very excited to hear about the great feedback from the first meeting of our first group of the **Romans Bible Study** this last Monday evening. We also have a Thursday afternoon group and are starting a group for our school teachers. We are very excited with the amazing turnout for this Bible Study! Let's pray for all who are taking part as they seek to learn more about God's Word in Scripture.

Another key opportunity for learning more about our faith that we have started this year to great feedback is our **Learning in the Library** series. We are excited to have two more Learning in the Library sessions scheduled between now and Easter: On March 9, Amy Guenther will present *Mary at the Passion and the Early Church*, and on March 23, I will present *What's the Triduum? Understanding the 3 Holiest Days*. We hope you can join us! Sign up for a spot in the room at stelizabethgc.org/events. Or we also stream them live on our Facebook Page and YouTube Channel.

We're very eager to open the **Parish Life Center Library** between Sunday morning Masses soon. Please see the information on that further in the bulletin and consider signing up to help host in the library one Sunday each month. Thank you!

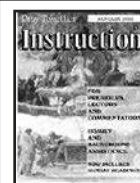
