## *Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

FEBRUARY 7, 2021

Job 7:1-4,6-7; 1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23;  
Mark 1:29-39

From time to time, we need time outs! A spiritual retreat is a good time out for all of us. It is a time when we rest from our ordinary work and routine, a time to get away in silence in order to realize our purpose in life.

Too often, our lives can be the same-old same-old. Even the work we enjoy can become drudgery. We can end up just “existing” rather than “living.”

In the first reading, Job laments that our lives are drudgery. The nights drag on; the day brings no relief. Job, of course, knew nothing of the Paschal Mystery. He knew nothing of offering his agony in union with Christ for the salvation of the world. He knew nothing of eternal happiness which awaits the good and faithful servant.

Even Jesus, in today’s Gospel, experiences the drudgery of life. In Mark’s Gospel, as we have often noted, Jesus always seems to be pushed, shoved, hemmed in, pressed upon, and crowded. He wants to get away, but they track him down. They almost hound him, even when he is trying to pray. His vocation is to proclaim good news to all the neighboring villages, but they won’t let him go.

The second reading is Paul’s apology: He is “compelled” to preach the Gospel. If he does not, he is ruined. But in preaching the Gospel, he experienced misunderstanding and opposition. People questioned his motives. Yet he tries to become all things to all people in order to save all.

Most of us do not have a full time vocation of preaching. On the other hand, we are all called to perfection. We are called, according to our state in life, to spread “good news.” We need some time outs and some space to realize this is so. We need to realize that even our ordinary work is of precious value when offered in union with Christ.

Let us try for a spiritual retreat. At least, let us set aside a few moments of quiet time each day to “be still and know that God is God.”

**Dear Parishioners,**

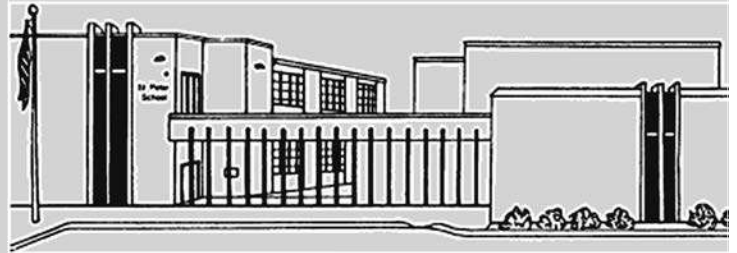
This weekend we celebrate the first weekend of February. With our celebration there is good news and bad news. The good news is that we are one week closer to spring; the bad news is the fact that we are still in winter. But in actuality this winter hasn't been bad and we hope that ole Punxsutawney Phil, the groundhog, didn't see his shadow this past Tuesday.

When I was in the seminary, our second reading today from Paul's letter to the Corinthians was often a topic of discussion. Filled with an idealism, it was the desire of some to put Paul's words into our lives as future priests. Let's listen to what he states: "I have made myself a slave to all so as to win as many as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak. I have become all things to all, to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the Gospel, so that I too may have a share in it." The discussion then centered upon a person who wanted to serve the Lord and His Church in this way, that he would lose his own identity in the service. The other part of the discussion centered upon a person who would give himself so totally that he would be literally drained of his energies. Hopefully with a sense of balance in life, priests are able to live these words of Paul as they serve the people of God.

Last weekend, I took the opportunity to address our parish family at all of our Masses. There were several issues that I wanted to bring to the attention of our parishioners.

1. This weekend, we will have in the Narthex of the Church 500 books written by Matthew Kelly entitled "I Heard God Laugh." This is the Lenten gift from the parish to assist our parishioners in their Lenten journey.
2. To give people an opportunity to attend Mass, we will be having a Mass on the weeknights of Lent, Monday through Friday, at 6:30 p.m. Many people are reluctant to attend Mass on the weekends because of the crowds, so this gives them an opportunity to celebrate without this worry.
3. I also will be having a class on Thursday nights of Lent, immediately following the evening Mass. This class will be a presentation of the series on the Sacraments by Bishop Robert Barron. After the presentation, I am hoping to have a discussion and answer some questions.
4. As you should be aware, the diocese has adopted a policy called "reordering the Sacrament." This means that Confirmation will be at the same time as First Communion. Now our 5th, 6th, and 7th graders this year were not able to celebrate these two sacraments. They only received the First Eucharist. So the bishop is allowing Pastors to confirm their students until next December. So we are planning on preparing these students who are in these grades this school year to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the next school year when they are in the next grade up. We will then be caught up. This affects our students in our Grade School and PSR program. We will also prepare our 3rd grade students next school year for both First Eucharist and Confirmation. The bishop would desire in the future to do all confirmations in the Cathedral in Springfield.

5. We have a number of differing customs in our Church that will be adapting to change because of the virus affecting our people. One custom is the distribution of ashes. This year instead of marking individuals with the cross on the forehead with ashes, the minister will sprinkle the crown of your heads with the ashes. This might seem unusual for us, but it has been the custom to do so in Europe. But it will be a change for us.
6. Finally we are hoping to have Eucharistic adoration in our Church every Sunday from Noon to 6:00 p.m. I have been reluctant to open the Adoration Chapel because those who are the most vulnerable are also those who serve as adorers in many instances. So as a re-introduction, we will be having Adoration in the Church for those who desire this devotion. In order for all hours to be covered we will have sign-ups. But for most of you who want to come, you won't have to worry about signing up. The start date will be announced later.


