First Sunday of Lent

FEBRUARY 21, 2021

Genesis 9:8-15; 1 Peter 3:18-22:
Mark 1:12-15

In one word, Lent is baptism! It is the final preparation time for baptism which (in the ancient Church) was conferred only during the Easter Vigil. For those of us who have been baptized long ago, it is the time of baptismal renewal. By our baptism, we entered into a covenant with God the Father in and through Jesus Christ.

Our first reading speaks of the covenant with Noah after the flood. The liturgy sees this as a symbol of our covenant with God through the waters of baptism. God promises good things for us; we for our part must keep our baptismal promises: to renounce sin and Satan, and to live for Christ.

Our second reading is from 1 Peter. Many scholars consider this book to be an ancient baptismal homily. The author tells us that we are cleansed of sin through baptism, and that we share in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent is always that of the fast and temptations of Jesus. But Mark's Gospel does not give any details. Rather, it states simply that the Spirit "drove" or "impelled" Jesus into the desert where he was tested. Afterward, he proclaimed the good news.

Each of us has his particular temptations. Satan attacks us at our most vulnerable point. But we have the power of Jesus Christ to overcome all temptation, for God never permits us to be tempted beyond our strength. Let us, then, renew our fidelity to our baptismal covenant. In the power of Christ, let us die to selfishness and sin, and rise daily to manifest the glory of his resurrection.

First Sunday of Lent, February 21, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

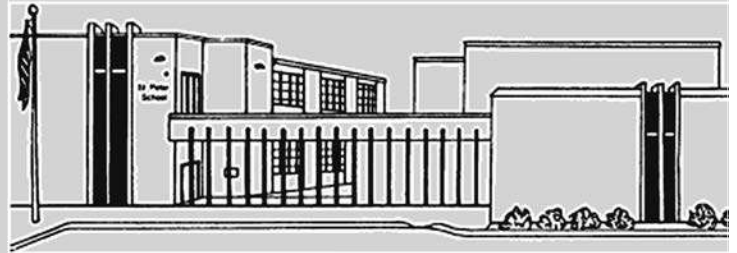
We gather this weekend to celebrate the First Sunday in our season of Lent. Lent is that time before Easter that we prepare for Baptism of our catechumens. But for those who already have been baptized Lent is an invitation to look within ourselves to see if we truly have been living our baptismal promises, thus seeking God's forgiveness in preparation for renewing these promises again at Easter. And so the Church gives us the reading from Genesis concerning Noah and the flood. The waters of the flood are to symbolize our baptisms, and the covenant made by Noah with God, is the symbol of the New Covenant established by the death and resurrection of Jesus. Peter, in our second reading, tells us that Noah and the flood "prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God." In spite of that saving grace, our Gospel also lets us know that we will always be plagued by temptations in life. Even Jesus Himself was "led into the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan." Putting these readings together, I think the Church is suggesting using these days of Lent to look inward at our lives, to see where we are tempted, to use prayer, almsgiving, and fasting, as ways of overcoming these daily temptations so that we can reaffirm our faith in our baptism renewal of our promises so that we truly can share in the new life of Christ.

I'd like to share the following as food for thought this Lent. It's a poem whose author is unknown. "I asked God to take away my pride" and God said, "No." He said "it was not for Him to take away but for me to give up." "I asked God to make my handicapped child whole" and God said, "No." He said, "her spirit is whole, her body is only temporary." "I asked God to grant me patience," and God said "No." He said "patience is a byproduct of tribulation. It isn't granted, it is earned." "I asked God to give me happiness," and God said "No." He said "He gives blessings; happiness is up to me." "I asked God to spare my pain and God said, "No." He said "suffering draws you apart from worldly cares and brings you closer to me." "I asked God to help me love others as much as He loves me," and God said, "Ah, finally, you have the idea." Some just food for thought.

Just a reminder that we will be having an additional Mass each weeknight of Lent at 6:30 p.m. This will provide people an opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist without a lot of people in attendance. Plus those in attendance will be able to social distance themselves from each other as they return to celebrating the Eucharist. Also, since the Sacrament of Reconciliation has a special role in our Lenten devotion and practices, we will be offering this sacrament each weeknight before the 6:30 p.m. Mass, from 5:45-6:15 p.m. These will be special times for this sacrament apart from Saturday morning and afternoon.

Rice Bowls are available in the Narthex. It's a great opportunity to have them on our tables and to pray for the poor before we eat our meals. Through our fasting, the money saved can be put into the Rice Bowl and collected later.

EMPOWER ILLINOIS—INVEST IN KIDS

Student demand for Illinois' tax credit scholarship is at an all-time high. This school year, 481 students in 30 schools across the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois received a scholarship to attend Catholic school thanks to \$1,485,527 in generous donations.

The tax credit scholarship program, part of Illinois' Invest in Kids Act, is a win-win-win. The first win is for the students, who despite financial hardships, can now attend Catholic schools, be surrounded by positive and holy values, and receive a higher academic experience. The second win is for the schools, who now have these students in their classrooms. The third win is for donors, who receive a 75% state income credit on their donation.

Now, an additional win is available for 12 schools in our diocese thanks to a Catholic couple in Chicago, who have generously committed to match dollar for dollar what is donated to these schools through Empower Illinois up to \$15,000 per school! Donors must get their donation in by March 31.

Fr. Delix Michel, our priest from Haiti, came by to visit with me several weeks ago. He was here for a medical checkup and thankfully he is doing okay. Please keep him in your prayers. We also are participating in the grant established by the Parish Twinning Program in which our money given to our sister parish will be doubled by this program toward the purchase of food. This is a great opportunity to help us feed our sister parishes. Through the maximum contribution of \$2,000 we are able to provide over \$4,000 worth of food to feed our sisters and brothers in our parishes in Haiti. This is quite a gift, and I continue to thank each of you for supporting our brothers and sisters in Haiti.

I remind you about our Eucharistic Adoration to take place each Sunday of Lent from 12:00 Noon to 6:00 p.m. Come and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. We will have sign-ups only to make sure that each hour is covered. But for the rest of our parishioners, you make come and go as you wish. I encourage you to make an hour in prayer each Sunday, thanking God for His blessings and graces.

Lenten Regulations

The season of Lent began this year on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 and ends just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All the Christian faithful are urged to develop and maintain a voluntary program of self-denial (in addition to the Lenten regulations which follow), serious prayer and the performing of deeds of charity and mercy, including the giving of alms.

LENTEN REGULATIONS – Please share with your parishioners the following Lenten regulations:

1. **ABSTINENCE** – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

2. **FAST** – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

May this holy season be a time of spiritual renewal for each of us!

What is CRS Rice Bowl? CRS Rice Bowl is a Catholic Relief Services' Lenten faith-in-action program. It offers opportunities for your family to engage daily with the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. And it's an opportunity for our parish/school to come together as a community and practice the works of mercy with our neighbors and our brothers and sisters around the world. Please pick up your family's Rice Bowl and join thousands of other Catholic communities across the United States, in this lifechanging Lenten journey. Bowls will be collected April 10 and 11 – the weekend **after** Easter. You can return the money in an envelope, with your name on it, and mark it Rice Bowl. If you return the rice bowl itself, please add your name on it and tape it closed.


