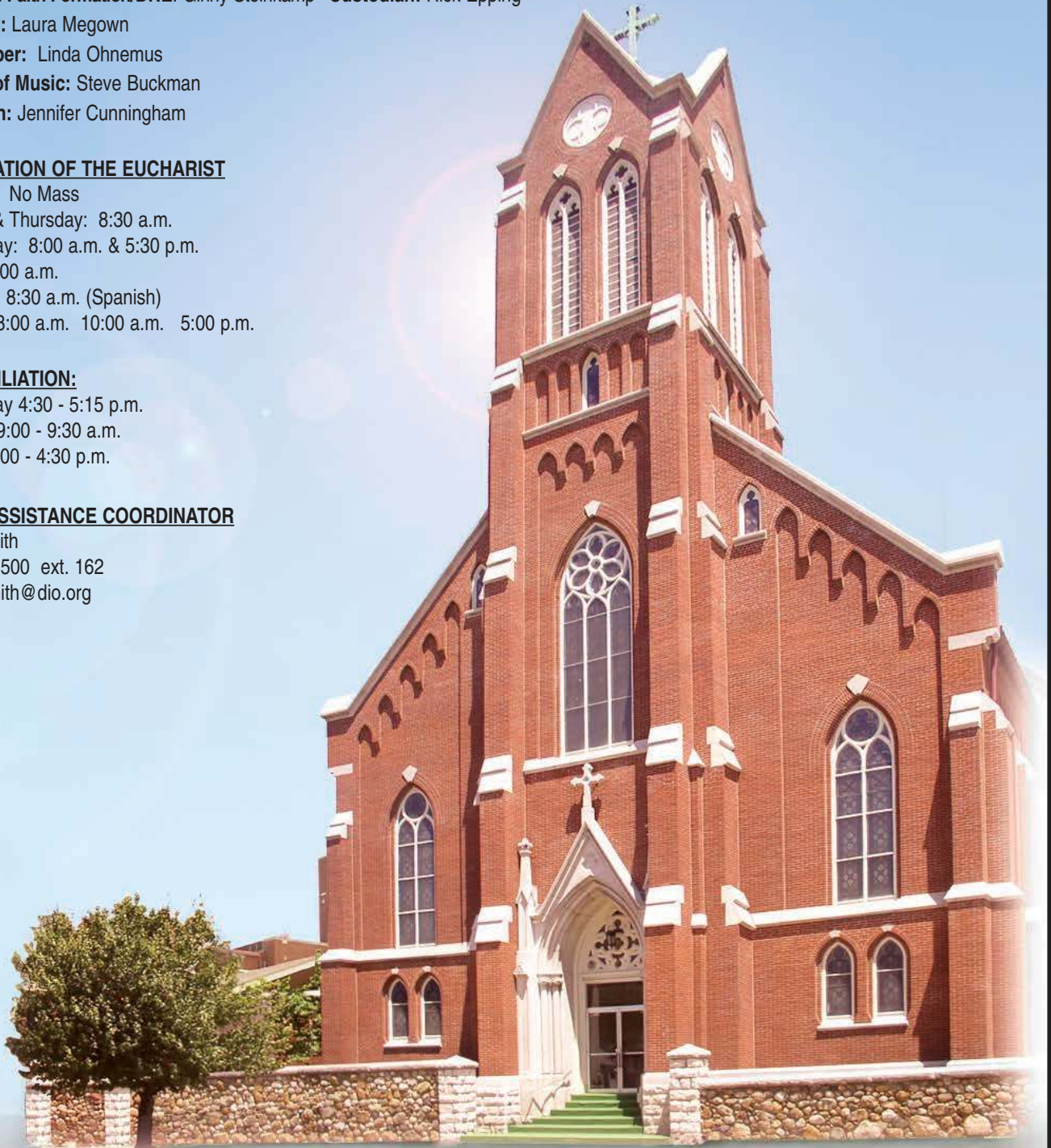

The Holiest Week of the Year

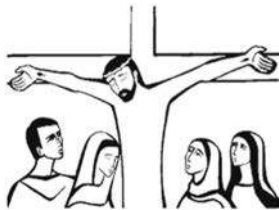
It's more than just theatrics. Holy Week and the Triduum is truly the holiest time of the year. Missing out on Holy Week is missing out on an experience of the Paschal Mystery like nothing other. Walk the path with Jesus from the Institution of the Eucharist, to His arrest and death on the cross, to His Glorious Resurrection at Easter. Many of us experienced last year what it was like to not participate in the Holy Week liturgies. May this propel us to grow in deeper appreciation for the mysteries communicated to us this Holy Week.

Holy Thursday

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Feast of The Lord's Supper. We remember when Jesus gathered with His disciples to celebrate the Passover and instituted the Eucharist. We participate in the Ritual of the Washing of Feet, recalling Jesus's washing of the Apostle's feet, as a reminder that a call to discipleship is a call to humble service. At the end of Mass, there is no concluding prayer. There will be a Eucharistic Procession to the Chapel of Reservation, which will be on the right side of the Church near the Ambry. This procession to the Chapel of Reservation reminds us of Jesus' time in the garden of Gethsemane when he prayed so fervently through the night. There will then be a time for Eucharistic Adoration where we can keep watch and wait with Jesus as the disciples did. We recall that it is also on Thursday that Jesus is arrested and taken into custody by the Roman authorities.



Good Friday



We recall Jesus's Passion on Good Friday. We also venerate the Cross. This year we will do this by bowing before the Cross. It may seem odd to show such reverence to an ugly instrument of torture that killed Jesus, but it is through this Cross that Jesus purchased for us our salvation. We never want to take Jesus' great suffering and sacrifice for granted. We will then pray a series of 10 intercessions. This emphasizes how universal our Church is and Her great needs. We also recognize and pray for other faith traditions and those without faith at all.

Easter Vigil

The Easter Vigil. Saint Augustine calls it "the mother of all vigils." People are often intimidated by the length of the Mass, but it is undoubtedly the most beautiful Mass of the year that engages all of the senses. The vigil begins with a fire outside. This fire symbolizes the life of Christ. Additionally the rich Scriptures read at Mass encapsulate the entire story of our salvation. After the subdued liturgical choices, we usher in Easter with the beautiful Exsultet which is usually sung by the priest or deacon. This Easter we will welcome in several new full initiated members. We also renew our Baptismal promises.

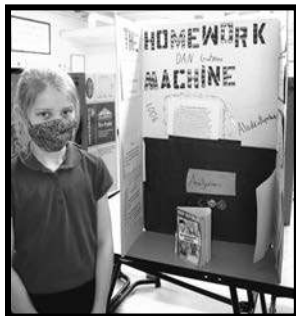

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion – 28 March 2021

Procession: Mark 11:1-10 OR John 12:12-16.
Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7. Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24. Philippians 2:6-11. Mark 14:1–15:47.

Entering and Dying. This Holy Week begins with a festive entry into Jerusalem with cloaks spread around, with leafy branches waving, and with “Hosannas” crying out. But this all ends with suffering and death.

- . How will spend this day and this week emptying myself as Jesus did?
- . How can I, like Jesus, be more humble?
- . How will I be obedient?

The Paschal Triduum – 01-04 April 2021
These Holy Three Days begin on Thursday with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues with the Passion of the Lord on Friday, rests in the joyfully expectant paschal fast of Saturday and the Rites of Preparation with the elect, and comes to an end with the Easter Vigil, the Masses of Easter Day, and Evening Prayer. Plan to come if you are safely able.

Return to Mass

It's time... welcome back to Mass - Bishop Thomas John Paprocki announced that, effective April 11, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will be modified to be limited to the following groups: Those 65 years of age or older; Those at risk for severe illness due to underlying medical conditions as described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; Those who care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed; Those women who are pregnant; Those who cannot be accommodated at Mass because the church was at safe-distancing capacity. Those who are sick or came in contact with someone with COVID-19/flu are obligated to stay home and are therefore excused. All other Catholics not in those categories in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, effective April 11, beginning with the Saturday anticipated Masses the evening before.
