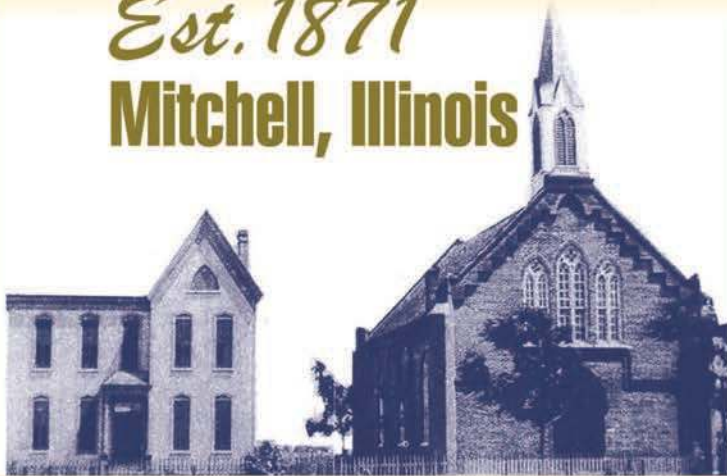
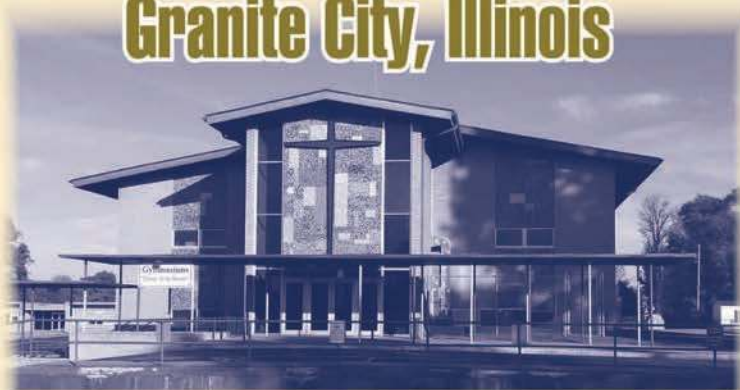

Faith Formation & Discipleship

Deacon Candidate Michael Halbrook

One thing that has been remarkable to me since I started ministering here for my final year of formation is the deep sense of pride in stewardship at St. Elizabeth Parish. Everywhere I turn are people who care deeply about our parish and who selflessly give of their time and talents in service, and also of the financial gifts that God has granted them to support the work and mission of the church.

Our diocesan synod of 2017-18 called for a renewed spirit of stewardship across our diocese, one in which we deeply reflected upon God's gifts to us and what in turn we could offer back to God, first to the church and then also to other worthy ministries and nonprofits about which we have care and passion.

As part of this renewed focus on stewardship, each of us is asked to prayerfully consider approaching as nearly as we can the Biblical model of tithing, returning 10% of all that God has given in some form. Again, it's important to look at this in terms of our time and talents in service, *and* our financial gifts. That 10% for some of us may go entirely to the church. For others it may go in many directions, perhaps 5% to the church and 5% to other nonprofits.

As I mentioned in my lay stewardship witness at Mass back in the fall, Suzanne and I have prayerfully considered deepening our commitment to financial tithing each year of our marriage. Each time we commit more deeply to deeper stewardship, God surprises us by ensuring our family continues to be provided for. As a parishioner put it leaving Mass that weekend, "You can't outgive God."

In years past, our parish has had a set "goal" that we were asked to reach to provide for the financial needs of our diocese. This was the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA). This year, the diocese switched to a "Parish Community Tithe," a flat tithe of 10% of a parish's regular financial support that will flow through to support the diocese heading forward. This year, we still have a set goal based upon last year's parish financial support. Our goal to the diocese this year is \$46,166, of which we still have \$33,861 remaining to pay.

If you haven't yet made a pledge or donation directly to the bishop's appeal on behalf of our parish, please do so, or call the Parish Office to ask how you can give specifically to this appeal.

I know firsthand the many ministries and efforts that are supported by our giving to our diocese. My own formation for ministry in the church is supported through this, and we've had exposure to many of the worthy ministries and departments of the diocese that are here to support us in our work in the parish and community. It also comes back in very tangible ways, like licenses for Microsoft Office for all of our school and parish staff, and finance system, HR, and legal support.

In addition to the immediate need for this year's goal, please prayerfully discern how you may be able to deepen your financial stewardship commitment to the parish. Remember that later this year, effectively 10% of our usual parish support will go directly to support the work of our diocese. Basically, to continue to operate our parish as we have, we need to increase our giving by roughly 10%. That is a challenge for sure, but one that I know our parish will meet, with prayerful discernment and response to the Spirit's whisperings.

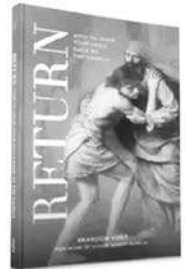

Divine Mercy Novena & Sunday

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 2, and ends on April 11. In the message to St. Faustina, Our Lord requested that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II declared that the 2nd Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday through the whole Church. On that same day he canonized Sister Faustina as the first "Saint of the Jubilee Year of Mercy." After completing the Novena in 2005, Pope John Paul II died on the eve of Mercy Sunday. He was beatified on Mercy Sunday in 2011 by Pope Benedict XVI and canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014.



Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet with us through the Novena, starting just after the Good Friday 3:00 p.m. liturgy, each day at 3:00 p.m. (at the church, or where you are), ending in the church at 3:00 p.m. on Divine Mercy Sunday.

"Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Feast of Mercy." (Diary, 699)
