Fourth Sunday of Lent

MARCH 14, 2021

2 Chronicles 36:14-16,19-23;
Ephesians 2:4-10; John 3:14-21

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

This Sunday is usually called “*Laetare Sunday*.” “*Laetare*” (lay-TAH-ray) is the first word of the Latin Entrance Antiphon. It means “Rejoice!” It is a long story, but this Sunday came to be a Sunday of rejoicing in the midst of a penitential season: Today, the organ and other instruments may be played; and there may be flowers on the altar.

The “long story” is this: In ancient Rome, Mass was celebrated by the pope and people in different churches on different days. These churches were called “*stational churches*.” The liturgy often took its readings and theme from the “*stational church*.”

The “*stational church*” today is the “*Church of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem*” which is in Rome. This church was built by St. Helena to house the cross and the relics of the Lord’s Passion which she brought back from Jerusalem. She used dirt from Jerusalem as ballast for her ships. This dirt was then placed around the foundation of the Church of the Holy Cross – so it really was in Jerusalem (or on Jerusalem soil) even though it was in Rome.

The church represented Jerusalem – the ancient city as well as the heavenly Jerusalem. The Entrance Antiphon, then, was “*Rejoice Jerusalem! Be glad for her, you who love her!*” The “*rejoicing*” theme in the middle of Lent came from this antiphon!

The *first reading* (the conclusion of 2 Chronicles) is anything but joyful. It tells of the pathos of the destruction of Jerusalem. God had warned his people to return to him; they did not; therefore the city of Jerusalem and the temple were destroyed and the people languished in captivity for seventy years.

The *second reading* gives us reason for joy: Even though we have offended God, he is rich in mercy. He saves us *not* because of any good we do or merit of ours, but solely from his lovingkindness. Let us thank him for his mercy by living lives of righteousness.

The *Gospel* contains the most famous sentence in the Bible: “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him may not die, but may have eternal life.” (John 3:16.)

We rejoice today because of God’s mercy which we do not deserve. We rejoice that he sent his Son to save us. We rejoice in our Elect who are nearer to the Easter sacraments. (Today we celebrate the second of the three Scrutinies.) Let us always be a people of joy.

Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 14, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

Today we gather to celebrate the Fourth Sunday in our season of Lent. This Fourth Sunday is called “Laetare Sunday.” The word “laetare,” is a Latin word which mean to rejoice. It comes from the entrance antiphon for this Sunday which are the words of Isaiah, the prophet, “Laetare Jerusalem,” (translated as “Rejoice with Jerusalem.” This is the halfway point of Lent and sort of a respite in the penitential season. As illustration of this, we wear rose vestments instead of the violet. There is a joyful note to our celebration because of the ancient practice of handing over the Apostles Creed to our catechumens, the last and decisive step for those preparing for Baptism. So as we celebrate “Laetare Sunday,” let all of us rejoice as the Easter mysteries are close at hand.

This weekend, we will have our second of three Scrutinies for our Elect (catechumen to be baptized) at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Using the readings from Cycle A, we hear of Jesus healing the man born blind. It is a long Gospel that reflects a person coming to sight both physically and spiritually in Jesus as the Son of Man. And so today, we pray for our Elect that “the Father of Mercy will free these elect from the false values that surround and blind them. Set them firmly in your truth, children of the light forever.” Hoping that prayer also touches our lives on this Laetare Sunday.

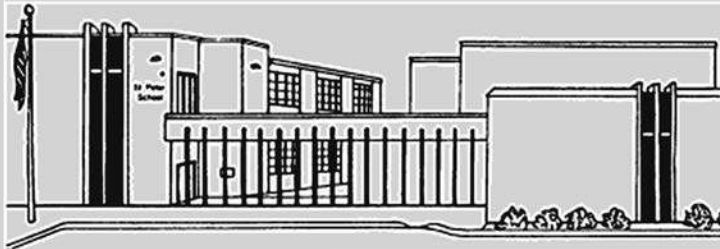
But for those of us who attend a different Mass, we will hear the words of Jesus to Nicodemus. These words are very familiar to us who have ever attended an athletic contest or seen one on television. Very often someone will be holding up a placard with the following inscribe, “John 3:16.” This inscription is a summary of the entire Bible as it states in our Gospel today, “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life.” Instead of viewing this on a placard, hopefully you and I will have it inscribed in our minds and hearts as this one verse reflects God’s love for all of us.

Just a reminder that we continue to celebrate our Eucharist each weekday evening at 6:30 p.m. For those apprehensive about coming to Church, other than Thursday nights you can celebrate with us with social distancing not being a problem. Also, we will have individual confessions from 5:45-6:15 each evening. Come join us. Then this Thursday after this evening Mass, we will watch the video of Bishop Robert Barron on the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Finally, we will be having a city wide Reconciliation Service next Sunday, March 21, at 2:00 p.m. at St. Francis Church, and then another one on Palm Sunday, March 28, also at 2:00 p.m. at Blessed Sacrament Church. We will have a number of priests present from the area to hear confessions.

Lent once again involves almsgiving. We are finally able to send to our sister parishes the items that we had collected last Spring. In the meantime, Fr. Delix Michel, pastor of our sister parishes in Haiti, is asking for both deodorant and female protective pads. We are asking you to bring these items to Church next weekend and place them around our Haiti area. This shipment then will be sent with our other items and our poor will be served through our almsgiving.
