(For Palm Procession:  
 Mark 11:1-10 or John 12: 12-16)  
 For Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11;  
 Mark 14:1–15:47 or Mark 15: 1-39

The double title for today’s celebration indicates the basic paradox of our faith: suffering and glory. It is the “Paschal Mystery” of death and resurrection. We enter glory only after apparent defeat.

At the beginning of Mass, we bless palms. Palms (which are not native to Jerusalem) were used on the most glorious and joyous of Jewish feasts to praise the Lord, the King. John’s Gospel describes the people of Jerusalem acclaiming Jesus as Messiah and king with palm branches. They shouted, “hosanna,” which means, “Save us now!” They wanted to be saved from oppression and from suffering under foreign rulers.

But Jesus was a different kind of Messiah. He saved them not from present ills but from eternal suffering and death. He enters his glory only through the cross.

The readings of Mass tell of the suffering and death of the Lord. The first reading is from the third of four Suffering Servant Songs in Isaiah. The suffering servant is a mysterious “everyman” kind of person who takes all grief and suffering to himself, and by his own suffering vicariously heals all. The primitive Church used these songs as a way of explaining how the Messiah could suffer (since he was supposed to be invincible.)

The second reading was an ancient hymn before Paul ever incorporated it into Philippians (around 58 A.D.) It tells how Christ did not hang on to his equality with the Father, but emptied himself to become one of us. Then he became humbler yet, accepting death on the cross. Therefore he was exalted in the resurrection!

As we listen to the Passion according to Mark, let us identify with the various characters of the story: Are we Peter who talks a good game but who denies the Lord when it really counted. Are we Judas? Are we Pilate, who piously claims innocence when he could have saved Jesus from death. Are we the leaders who preserved their position by getting rid of Jesus?

Palm Sunday, March 28, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

Perhaps the best description of Palm Sunday is found in the initial greeting by the priest at the beginning of the liturgy for this day. The priest states: “Dear brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of the Lord’s Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that Jesus entered His own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord’s entry into the city for our salvation, following in His footsteps, so that, being made by His grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in His resurrection and in His life.”

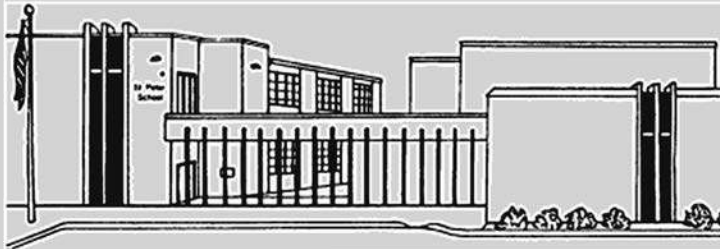
Palm branches will be blessed and distributed during each of our Masses for this weekend. Please feel free to take them home and perhaps take some to people who are either still fearful in coming, or who might not get to the Church this weekend.

This week, we celebrate what is termed the Triduum, the three holy days that recall the events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Holy Thursday, April 1, recalls the institution of the Eucharist by Jesus at the Last Supper. This celebration will begin at 7:00 p.m. Then Good Friday, April 2, is the celebration of the Lord’s Passion and Death, and the veneration of the cross, and the distribution of Holy Communion. This liturgy will also begin at 7:00 p.m. Finally, Holy Saturday, April 3, is the Easter Vigil, the solemn celebration of the Resurrection as well as the Elect celebrating the Sacraments of Initiation and the Candidates making their profession of Faith and reception into the Church. The Easter Vigil will begin at 8:00 p.m. I invite each of you to our celebrations and once again renew your commitment and dedication to Christ crucified, Christ risen. Because of COVID, much of our liturgies during the Triduum will accommodate social distancing and will be different from years past.

This Sunday, March 28, we will have our last city-wide Reconciliation Service at 2:00 p.m. in Blessed Sacrament Church. The last service last Sunday we had six priests present to hear individual confessions. So I invite you to join with us for this celebration of forgiveness of sins. Also, this same Sunday, we will have our final adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from Noon to 6:00 p.m. with the Stations of the Cross as our closure for this adoration. Again, please join us and perhaps pray before the Blessed Sacrament for God’s blessings in our life.

On Holy Thursday, we have our traditional procession at the end of Mass to the altar of reposition. There the Blessed Sacrament will remain until 11:00 p.m. We are asking parishioners, like the apostles, to come and watch with Jesus during the evening hours. From the end of our celebration to 9:00 p.m. I am asking families whose last names are between A-I, along with our Saints Alive group to be present; then from 9:00-10:00 p.m. families whose last names are between J-Q along with Found to be present; and finally, those families whose last names are between R-Z to be present from 10:00 to 11:00 p.m. along with high school and college students. The offer, however, is come when you can.

Just a reminder that we will have weekday evening Masses on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday during Holy Week at 6:30 p.m. A priest will be available for confessions on each of those days from 5:45-6:15 p.m. We also will be hearing confessions on Holy Thursday, from 4:00-6:00 p.m. and then again on Good Friday from 11:30-12:30 and 4:00-6:00 p.m.

Also another reminder that the Bishop, as of the weekend of April 10-11, will be lifting his general dispensation from the Eucharist for all those in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. This means that the obligation to attend Mass is now required of us. There is, however, individual dispensations for people who are sick, elderly, most vulnerable, and fearful of COVID. And if one is sick, quarantined, or exposed to the virus in any way, then this dispensation applies to you. If you have any questions, one can always call me to be dispensed from the obligation. We do want to get back to some type of normalcy, especially in celebrating the Eucharist.
