Resurrection of the Lord

APRIL 4, 2021

Acts 10:34a,37-43; Colossians 3:1-4
or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8; John 20:1-9

The beauty of the Church is a sign of our unrestrained joy at the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Throughout the Easter season, we shall sing and shout “Alleluia!” “Alleluia” is our “Easter” word; it means “Praise the Lord,” but traditionally in the western Church it has been an acclamation of rejoicing at the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

During the Easter season (which lasts fifty days – until Pentecost) our first reading at Mass is not taken from the Old Testament as it usually is. Instead, it is from Acts of the Apostles. Acts tells how the Church spread through various groups of people and to different places until it is found throughout the known world. Acts is a proclamation that Jesus has risen and that we must have life in his name.

Our second reading is from Colossians. If we have been raised up in Christ, we must always live like his risen members. Through our baptism we died to sin, and rose to share the very life of God through grace. Through Lenten penances, we have again tried to restore our faith and fervor. We renew our baptismal promises at Easter Mass, pledging that we shall always live for Christ.

Whereas the men seemed to be frightened away during and after Jesus’ crucifixion, women were unafraid. Mary stood at the foot of the cross. Mary Magdalen and other women came to the tomb early Sunday morning, after the Sabbath was over. Mary Magdalen seems to be the first witness of the resurrection.

When Peter and John came to the tomb, they saw the burial garments. Our English does not give the flavor of the original language. In the original Greek, the burial garments are found “in their folds” meaning “as if the body had simply evaporated, leaving the contours of the body in the cloths.” The only possible explanation was resurrection! If the body had been stolen, the “contours” of the body would not be in the burial shroud.

Dear Parishioners,

“This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.” These are the words of our Responsorial Psalm for this Easter Sunday. Yes, there is cause for rejoicing, there is a reason to be glad as the Lord has conquered sin and death, and now there is promise of a new and eternal life with the risen Christ forever.

Our Gospel for Easter seems to narrate the happenings of that Easter morning. Mary Magdalene went to the tomb in anticipation of anointing the body of Jesus. She was worried about the removal of the stone at the entrance of the tomb. What surprised her was not only that the stone had been removed, but Jesus’ body was taken. Her response was to run to Simon Peter to tell him about this surprise. Then we hear how Peter and John went running to the tomb to investigate themselves as to this disappearance. Apparently there was a disconnect between what Jesus had said and their memory of what was said. Needless to say, they were surprised to say the least. And the Gospel tells us that they saw the burial cloths in such a way that the body just seemed to disappear. Then John tells us in this same Gospel, “they saw and believed.” Not sure what they believed as the final sentence tells us that they “did not yet understand the scripture that He had to rise from the dead.”

“This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.” On behalf of the priests, parish staff, grade school administration and personnel, I want to wish each of you a very Blessed and Happy Easter. May this event of the empty tomb fill each of your lives with a hope and faith in the risen Christ, a faith and hope that comforts, strengthens, and challenges each of you to see and believe in your lives.

Next Sunday, April 11, is Divine Mercy Sunday. It is also the weekend that the Bishop has lifted the dispensation from Mass that he gave over a year ago. This general dispensation that is lifted then obliges us to attend and celebrate the Eucharist on Saturday night or Sunday as our way of keeping the Lord’s Day holy. Now there are particular dispensations, however, that are still in effect, namely, for those who are quarantined, those who are not feeling well, those who are most vulnerable and fearful of this pandemic, or those who might be guided by such fear that they seemingly cannot attend. But this is your individual judgment and I ask you to use it wisely. The main part of the Church will no longer be for social distancing. If you desire that distance, I ask you to sit in the sections of the Church on both the left and right of these two main sections of pews. I also continue to encourage you to wear your masks, not so much for yourselves, but rather out of courtesy for others who might have that fear of this virus. Look at it as an act of charity—its only for one hour a week.

I also want to thank all those who contributed so much for the beauty of our Church for the Triduum as well as Easter Sunday. The atmosphere each day of the Triduum reflected the celebration we experienced. I also thank all those who donated Easter flowers to adorn our Church on Easter. Besides the environment, our music, musicians, lectors, servers, and our entire parish family made our Triduum and Easter celebration something to remember. Thank you to all involved.
