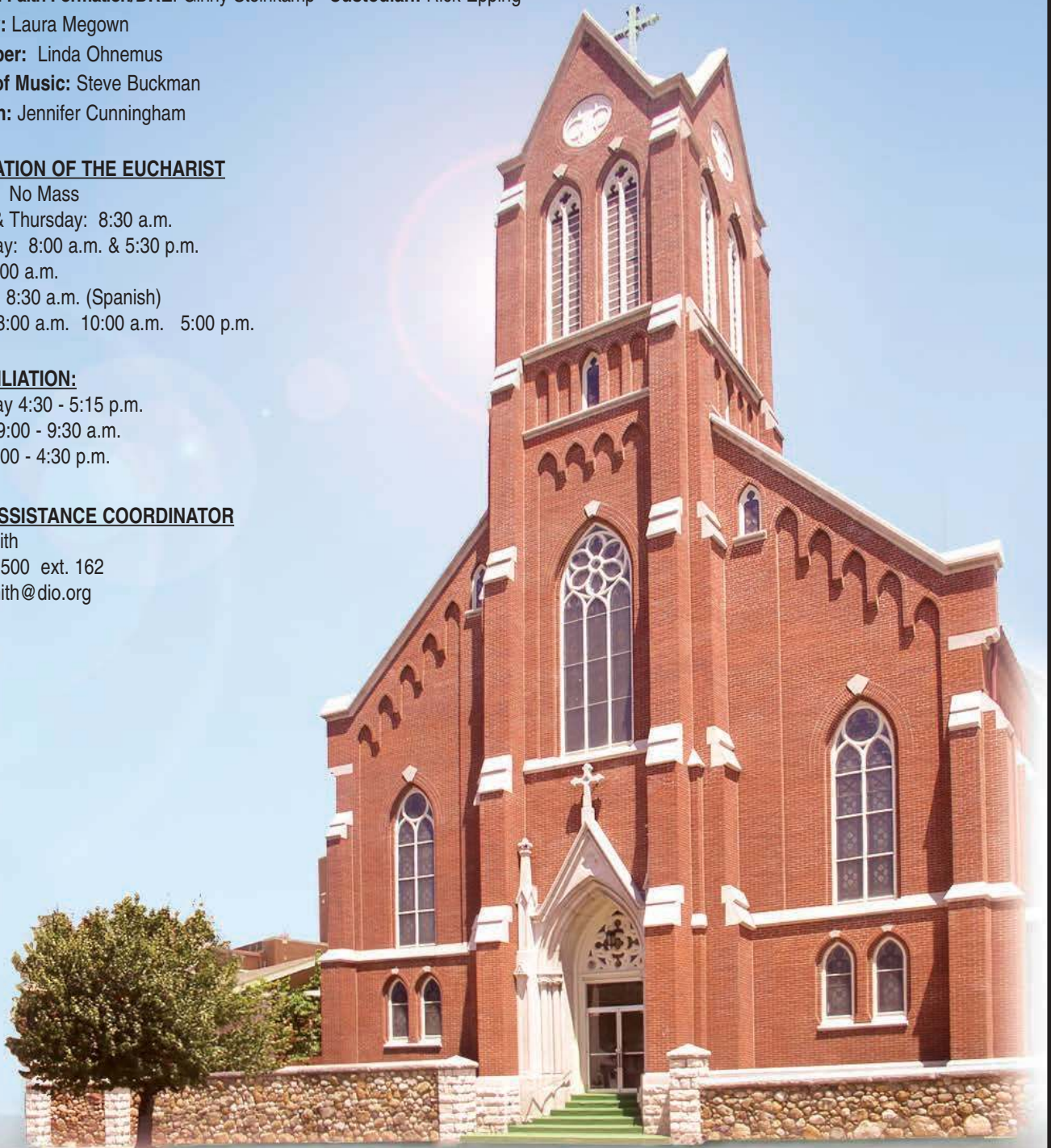

# Confirmation

## “Come, Holy Spirit!”



### What is the Sacrament of Confirmation really about?

The Sacraments of Initiation are ordered Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion. The recent “reordering” of the Sacraments reflects this prescribed order. Confirmation in that past has been viewed as a rite of passage or graduation into Catholic adulthood, but the Sacrament of Confirmation is so much more.

At Baptism, we receive for the first time the Holy Spirit and our souls become a temple for Him. Building on this gift, the Catechism states that, “by the Sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit.”

### Where is Confirmation talked about in Scripture?

The coming of the Holy Spirit is announced not only in the New Testament by Jesus, but also in the Old Testament. Isaiah 11:2 states, “And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord”

Additionally, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus at His Baptism by John was a sign of what was to come in our

Baptism. The Catechism says, “This fullness of the Spirit was not to remain uniquely the Messiah’s, but was to be communicated to the whole messianic people.” We hear about the disciples who waited for the coming of the Holy Spirit whom Jesus promised to send. The reception of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and at Confirmation is the ultimate communication of the Holy Spirit to God’s people. Confirmation, like Pentecost calls out of the fear in the upper room and calls us to continue the mission of Christ as His Body—The Church.

### Who is the Holy Spirit?

If we want to have a relationship with the Holy Spirit, knowing a little about Him is a good place to start. We know Him as the third Person of the Holy Spirit. We hear Him called Paraclete which is best translated as “he who is called to one’s side” and the advocate. St. Paul also calls him the Spirit of promise, adoption, Christ, the Lord, God, and Glory. The Holy Spirit is the teacher of our Souls. He guides us and teaches us how to pray. St. Gregory of Nazianzus says, “No one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Holy Spirit.” The Holy Spirit then aids us in our prayer and relationship with the Father and the Son.

### Come, Holy Spirit!

The Spirit comes at Baptism and fills us in Confirmation, so why should we continually ask for Him to come? When we ask the Holy Spirit to Come, it is no simple thing. To ask the Holy Spirit to come is a *surrender* of our will, our plans, what we think is best, to his movement. Just as Mary’s yes allows the Holy Spirit to fill her and bring about God’s will, invoking the Holy Spirit allows Him to move us closer to God’s will in our lives—that we might truly be able to say “thy will” not my will “be done.” The Holy Spirit does not necessarily speak to us but rather directs us. The Catechism says, “The Spirit who ‘has spoken through the prophets’ makes us hear the Father’s Word [Logos/Christ], but we do not hear the Holy Spirit himself. We know him only in the movement by which he reveals the Word to us and disposes us to welcome him in faith.” God greatly respects our free will and our faith is key also in this invocation and surrender. St. Paul’s prayer for the Galatians is that, “We might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.” To ask the Holy Spirit to Come is not simply to request His presence because He is absent, but to surrender our control to His movement.

*Come, Holy Spirit...*

fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

## It's time... welcome back to Mass

Bishop Thomas John Paprocki announced that, effective April 11, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will be modified to be limited to the following groups: Those 65 years of age or older; Those at risk for severe illness due to underlying medical conditions as described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; Those who care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed; Those women who are pregnant; Those who cannot be accommodated at Mass because the church was at safe-distancing capacity. Those who are sick or came in contact with someone with COVID-19/flu are obligated to stay home and are therefore excused. All other Catholics not in those categories in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, effective April 11, beginning with the Saturday anticipated Masses the evening before.
