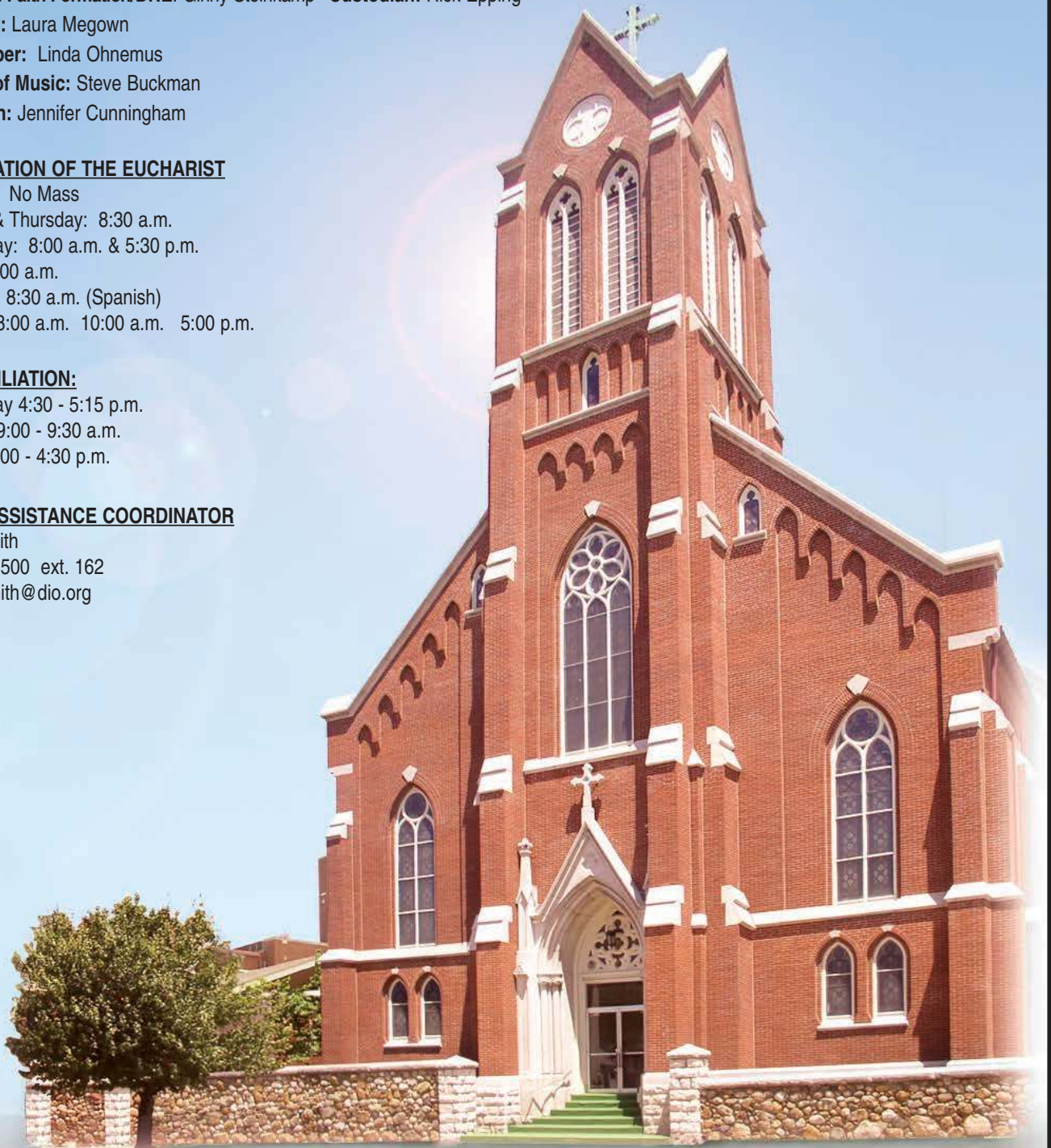

Today we celebrate the **5th Sunday of Easter**. Jesus uses the analogy of the vine and branches to describe our unique relationship with him. "He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it produces more fruit." Pruning is an interesting

phenomenon in nature. In order to bring growth a gardener has to cut back the bush or vine. Christ does the same thing with us. Sometimes it is necessary for Christ to "cut us back" in order that we produce more fruit.

This weekend Blessed Sacrament celebrates the **Sacrament of Confirmation and 1st Communion** for our 3rd Grade students. I commend our catechists for their outstanding jobs in preparing our students for this sacrament. I pray that our young people may continue to treasure the fullness of grace present in the gift of Christ's Body and Blood.

With this week's arrival of May is also the Church's celebration of **May Crowning**. We will have our BSS May Crowning this Thursday, May 6 after the 8:30 a.m. School Mass. I encourage our families to celebrate May Crowning in your own homes by praying the Rosary together as a family. We crown Mary as queen of our Universal Church and our parish, but also as the queen of our homes and families.

During the month of May I would like to invite parish members to consider submitting their names for **Open Seats** on the 2021-22 BSS Education Council, Pastoral Council, Finance Council, and Stewardship Committee. We received from the Springfield Diocese an ACSA (**Annual Catholic Services Appeal**) update. For our \$90,536 goal, we are **currently behind \$40,691**. Gratefully our average pledge **has increased 49%** and that is absolutely outstanding! Thank you for these very generous pledges!!! Unfortunately we have had 38% fewer persons pledging this year, likely due to our smaller Sunday Mass attendance since the beginning of the COVID pandemic. Blessed Sacrament Parish will be required to pay the difference by June 30. If you have not yet made a pledge, please consider doing so by June 30. The following are our current 2020-21 ACSA pledge numbers, in comparison to last year's 2019-20 pledges.

## *5 Ways to Pray the Rosary More Deeply*

### **Don't Rush**



The Rosary becomes an empty ritual if it is nothing more than the repetition of words. Instead, take time to introduce each of the mysteries very intentionally, and go over the principles of meditative and imaginative prayer and mixing up the way you pray together as a family – supports and enhances your practice of praying the Rosary. Once you've introduced the principles of meditative and imaginative prayer so that you have an idea of what you're aiming for, slow down. Racing through the Rosary, as several popes have pointed out is not ideal. If time is an issue, then trying praying a single decade slowly and meditatively.

### **Schedule a Time**

How do you pray the Rosary when life gets busy? We all value prayer and we know we need it. But when life gets busy, taking time to pray can slip through the cracks. With so many competing time demands, it can seem difficult to find an opportunity for good prayer time. When it's finally quiet and no one's expectations, demands or checklists can get to us, we may finally breathe. We have permission to just simply be. When you find a pocket of quiet, you realize your heart really misses prayer time. We miss nearness to God. You miss the peace of His presence and the joy of simply being refreshed by His Word. That's why it's so important to take out time to pray.

### **Think**

The Rosary is more than a series of prayers to be recited. Rather it is a series of thoughts to be dwelt on, to be turned over in the mind and to be applied to daily life. While we are saying the words of the prayers, we should be meditating upon the mysteries. It's easy for your mind to start wandering when you're contemplating the mysteries. Praying the Rosary can become very repetitive. You may feel like you're a robot, not truly processing the prayers. One way to work around this is to cultivate an awareness of the presence of God. Another way is to bring your prayer requests into the mystery. These will help you be more intentional when you're praying.

### **Ask Mary For Help**

In the Rosary, we ask Mary to "pray for us sinners" – in other words, to join us in our prayer. Mary is "favored" by God and "blessed among women," according to the angel Gabriel (Luke 1:28), because of the role she plays in fulfilling God's plan of salvation. So reciting the Hail Mary – a prayer rooted in the Gospel of Luke makes sense: We ask Mary to join us in our prayer just as we would ask any close friend to pray with us, but Mary is much more than just another friend; Jesus appointed her as our "spiritual mother" (John 19:27). At the same time, the Rosary is a profoundly Christ-centered prayer. When we ask Mary to accompany us in praying the Rosary, she leads us to Jesus (John 2:5). As you pray to Mary, don't be afraid to ask her for help.

### **Listen to What God is Telling You**

God is faithful to His promises, and God promised to answer our prayers. "And I tell you, ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find, knock, and it will be opened to you. For every one who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened" (Luke 11:9-10). If God promises to answer our prayers, He will do so infallibly. But in prayer, there are two sides: he who asks and He Who gives. It's important that when we pray the Rosary, we listen to what God is telling us. Prayer must also be humble. We can't look at prayer as writing a check based on our good credit to buy a favor from God. We must approach prayer knowing that, as sinners, we really have no credit with God and that we are totally reliant on His infinite goodness.

*While the Rosary follows a simple pattern, it can be a very challenging prayer to master. If you've struggled with it, you're not alone. Many of the Saints struggled with it too. If you find it difficult to pray the Rosary, try out these tips and see what happens. The next time you pick up your Rosary beads, imagine that you're holding Mary's hand and taking a trip to visit Jesus. When you pray the Rosary, that's exactly what happens.*
