**From the Pastor's Desk**

I know I must sound like a broken  
 record (which I recently came to discover

that younger folks may not understand that expression), but it is hard to believe that we have entered into the month of May and that today the Church celebrates the Fifth Sunday of Easter. But indeed we have. We remain filled with great joy as we continue to celebrate this Easter Season and I pray that each and every one of you may know the peace and joy of the authentic Christian life.

The readings proper for this Fifth Sunday of Easter give us much to reflect on as does the entirety of Sacred Scripture, the Living Word of God. My following thoughts are based on the readings proper to the Fifth Sunday of Easter. I make this clarification because Bishop Paprocki has granted permission to use the Liturgical texts proper to St. Joseph for our Liturgical Celebrations for the Fifth Sunday of Easter this year. This permission was granted since we are celebrating the Year of St. Joseph and since May 1 is the memorial of St. Joseph the Worker. In short, we have several options for Prayers and Readings with this permission as we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Easter.

With that said, being independent has certainly become one of the great things to strive for. We often hear about being able to “make it on our own,” not needing anyone or anything else but me, being “financially independent,” doing things “my way,” not worrying about someone else just so we take care of ourselves and make ourselves feel good and happy... that’s what’s important we’re told and we may even come to start to believe it. We may even fall into the thinking that “if I want something done right, I gotta do it myself...” and I admit, this creeps into my own thinking as well from time to time. It can creep into all of our thinking if we’re not careful and on guard against it.

Now, just to be clear, I’m not saying we should just accept mediocrity, that attitude of “who cares, it’s good enough,” nor am I suggesting that strong leadership and vision is not important. And certainly

we don’t want to get caught up in the mentality of “just go along with the crowd.” That can be dangerous and we do need to speak and defend the Truth. But what I am saying is that we’re not in this life on our own or just in our own small group, we’re not flying solo. And certainly, we don’t live out an authentic Christian life in isolation and independence from others.

And, again, just to clarify, let me address anyone who might throw out a question like, “what about a hermit or a cloistered nun...these exist in the Church and are recognized...what about them?” Well yes, indeed these do exist in the Church but those who are cloistered live in a community and those who are hermits (true, authentic hermits) are living out an authentic call from God, and both are living a life of prayer and solitude for the Church and for the salvation of souls. And really, this is God’s call for each of us, regardless of our state in life...a call to holiness, a call to the building up of the Church, a call to do all we do for the salvation of souls. You see, the hermit, if living authentically, is not a hermit for himself, he’s not doing this on his own or for his own glory. His life is lived out for the Church and for the salvation of souls. His life is lived out for you and for me. And shouldn’t our lives be lived the same? And so, questions like “what about the hermit, they live alone?” shows our lack of understanding that God’s ways are not the ways of the world.

So, where is all of this coming from? Well, I’d like to draw our attention to two small but important points in today’s Gospel. First is Jesus’ opening statement to His disciples...“I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower.” In particular, I draw our attention to the single word TRUE. Again, Jesus says “I am the TRUE vine, and my Father is the vine grower.” By the way Jesus says this, doesn’t it suggest then that there are other vines? You see how important every word of Sacred Scripture is. Recall again, Jesus calls Himself the TRUE vine, not just the

vine. And this point, although seemingly small in the Gospel, is an important one.

And we might say to ourselves, well yes, I believe that and I understand that. It makes sense. But do we really? Indeed there are other vines, lots of other vines that we get caught up in each and every day, vines that we attach ourselves to. And the more we attach ourselves to those other vines, the more we become detached from the TRUE vine. And these vines can be any number of things...the vine of relativism, the vine of gossip and slander, the vine of false teaching, the vine of self-centeredness, the vine of corruption and deceit, the vine of complaining, the vine of vanity, the vine of independence and self-sufficiency, and on and on. And these vines continue to bear fruit and threaten to overrun the TRUE vine to which we are attached through Baptism; they threaten to overtake our very Christian life.

But what does Jesus assure us of a bit later in the Gospel? He says "whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without Me, you can do nothing." Again, Jesus says, "WITHOUT ME, YOU CAN DO NOTHING." That is pretty strong language for us to pay attention to. And then, Jesus goes on to say that "anyone who does not remain in Me will be thrown out like a branch and wither," and "people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned." This is profound and perhaps one of the most important things for us to take away from today's Gospel.

Finally, we might ask ourselves how we bear fruit on the TRUE vine, how we remain in Jesus. And just briefly, we can look to our Second Reading for the answer. Simply, it is through love. And what does St. John tell us? Not just love in word and speech but love in deed and in truth, he says. He goes on to tell us that "those who keep (Christ's) commandments remain in Him, and He in them." And Christ's commandments are commandments of love, love of God and love of one another. And we don't just speak of love in

words...that's easy to do. We act out our love for God and for others in deed and in truth...that's what becomes more difficult. Our lived Christian life is not just hot air, it's action. That's how we remain in Christ and He in us.

And so, as we continue to live out our Christian lives, hopefully in the most authentic way, let us reflect on those vines that we've attached ourselves to which are threatening to de-tach us from the TRUE vine and ask the Lord to open our hearts to draw closer to Him through our love for Him and others in deed and in truth.

And now just a few notes:

-CONFIRMATION AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - This weekend we celebrate Confirmation and First Holy Communion at both parishes for several of our children. What a wonderful celebration. Please continue to keep these young people in your prayers.

-ST. THOMAS PHONE NUMBER - Please keep in mind that if you are calling St. Thomas, you will need to use the parish number, (217) 593-6685. When you call this number, it will normally ring to the rectory. The old cell phone number is no longer operational. I will be working to update the bulletin cover information this summer.

-ETERNAL REST - Faye Greenwell from St. Thomas Parish died on Sunday, April 25. Please keep Faye and her family in your prayers. Eternal rest grant unto her, O Lord, and let Perpetual Light shine upon her. May her soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

-FEAST - On Monday, May 3, the Church celebrates the Feast of Saints Philip and James, Apostles. As we seek to grow in our own faith life and to spread the message of Christ to others, we ask for their intercession.

-PRIEST GATHERING - On Wednesday, May 5, there is a gathering of the priests of the Diocese. During this gathering, those priests who are celebrating Jubilees will be recognized and honored. In particular, Fr. Chris Comerford is celebrating his Silver Jubilee and Fr. Jim Neuman is celebrating his Golden Jubilee. Bishop Kevin Vann, a Springfield priest, will also be joining us as he celebrates his 40th year of priestly ordination. Bishop Ron Hicks of the Diocese of Joliet will be our speaker. I am looking forward to being with the priests of the Diocese and honoring our priests who are celebrating Jubilees. I'd ask you to continue to keep all our priests and our Bishop in your prayers.
