Divine Mercy Sunday was placed on the universal calendar by Pope St. John Paul II in 2001 on the occasion of the canonization of the Divine Mercy visionary St. Faustina Kowalska. This feast, falling on the 'octave day' of Easter intends to draw the Church into contemplation of God's mercy in light of the Risen Lord. We spent the 40 days of Lent tempering our desires and correcting our faults in order to welcome the grace of God's forgiveness through the wood of the cross. Now, in the Easter season, we recognize and celebrate the fullness of Divine Mercy revealed in the mystery of our Lord's final triumph over sin and death. If we have the attitude that penance, confession, self-denial, and the desire for divine forgiveness are reserved for the season of Lent, then we have misunderstood the "reason for the [Easter] season". Easter is the dawning of a new age of reconciliation in the Risen Lord who conquers sin and death precisely because he loves his human family in its frailty, and wishes them to have greater life by living in him.

Around Palm Sunday, all of our registered parishioners received their 'annual' **Parish Renewal Kit**, which this year is being presented in the Spring, because many of our ministries were still inactive due to the pandemic. We are looking to resume many of our activities and ministries in the coming weeks and months, and we want **you** to be part of this renewal of our parish!

This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for us as a parish to 'reset' ourselves and our ministries and our outreach, and to re-dedicate ourselves to the mission we have been given as disciples to witness to the Risen Christ in our midst. Disciples are always learning. Disciples live in harmony with one another as brothers and sisters in God. Disciples are not 'amateurs' or 'hobbyists', but rather strive to model their entire lives after the example of their teacher and master.

As we have done in recent years, please look through the parish ministries renewal guide and see if there is a place that God is calling you to become more involved with our parish. Note that we have added information which can be shared with family and friends on how one becomes baptized in the faith, how one signs up students at St. Dominic School, to see how one begins the process to be married at St. Anthony's. We want the invitation to engage in the sacramental and ministerial work of the Church to be in front of every family, so please keep and share these renewal guides which list the leaders and contact people for the various groups and ministries.

We, of course, also want our parishioners to re-commit themselves to the on-going financial support of our parish and its school. We have all been through an incredible year of uncertainty, but our parish has pulled through by the generosity and the attentive care of so many. Thank you to those who made special gifts, and thank you most especially who have committed themselves to weekly support of our parish through our weekly collections. This is a sign of strength and unity among those who value the ministry of our parish and its school. If you have not been part of this community in this way, I ask you to consider 'taking a step' in expressing your faith in this way.

The commitment cards in your renewal kits will be collected on the weekend of April 24/25. We have already received some in the office and we thank you. But please try not to short-circuit the process of making a prayerful, conscious, intentional choice to support the parish through your commitment of time, talent, and treasure. Thank you!

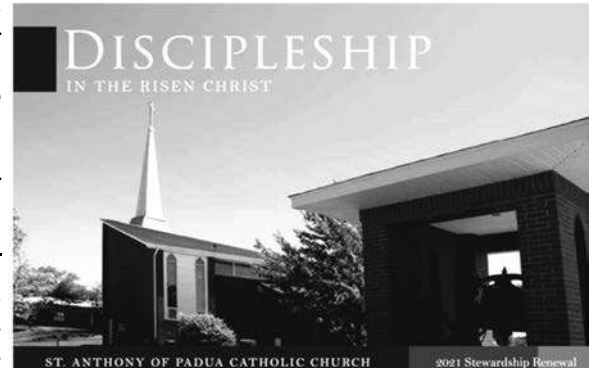

First Grade Class Promotes Gentleness

During the month of April, our first grade class along with their teacher, Mrs. Molly Stroot, leads our school during Morning Meeting to promote gentleness, like St. Francis. The first grade class provides us with a lesson each day on our new Holy Hero, Saint Francis of Assisi, as well as a new Bible verse, and prayer. Our Fruit of the Holy Spirit this month is gentleness, which the first grade class connects to the way St. Francis cares for animals. We always begin each Morning Meeting with prayer. During April we are learning how to pray the Peace Prayer of St. Francis, “Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow your love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to Eternal Life.” In addition, the first grade class is also helping us learn a new Bible verse, “I praise you God, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made” Psalm 139:14.

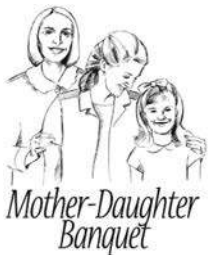
RICE BOWLS
