






So, whatever you may be struggling with right now, bring it to Him with great confidence. He is the Lord of it all – including those things in your life which might be causing you to fear.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES, DIOCESE OF PEORIA: HERE IN HANCOCK COUNTY. It has been many years since Catholic Charities (formerly, Catholic Social Services) has made itself known to our people here in Hancock County. But the diocesan ministry to those in need is coming our way soon. "Saint Nicholas Charity on Wheels," a travelling van of various home and school supplies, will be here on Friday, June 25, from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m., at Immaculate Conception Church, Carthage. Fliers are available at the doors of our churches. Items such as laundry soap, toilet paper, paper towels, hand sanitizer, dish soap, household cleaner, book bags, and school supplies will be available for those in our area communities who might find the acquisition of such supplies difficult and challenging. There is even provision for sign up, for those who anticipate needing such assistance on a monthly basis. Please pick up a flier and pass the word. We are grateful to Sister Michelle Fernandez, of the Sisters of the Pierced Hearts of Jesus and Mary, for her leadership of Catholic Charities, and for her presence in Hancock County. Wednesday Evening – The Vigil of The Birth of St. John the Baptist...a Good Reason to Have a Bonfire at Your House!

For centuries people of Christian countries have kept a solemn vigil for the festival of John the Baptist's birth. In the darkness of the night preceding the feast, a bonfire would flare up before the church edifice, in the market-place, on hill, in valley. John gave testimony of the true light which shineth in the darkness. He was the light-bearer before Christ, although he proclaimed in utter humility and self-abnegation: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30). But the Master also spoke in highest praise of His Precursor: "I say to you, among those born of women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist" (Luke 7:28). Attuned to the mind of the Master, early Christians quickly cultivated with enthusiasm a special veneration of this saint – their enthusiasm and love enkindling within them a justifiable conviviality at the approach of his day. The custom of the St. John bonfires, indicative of a people with burning and childlike faith, continues in some places to this day.
