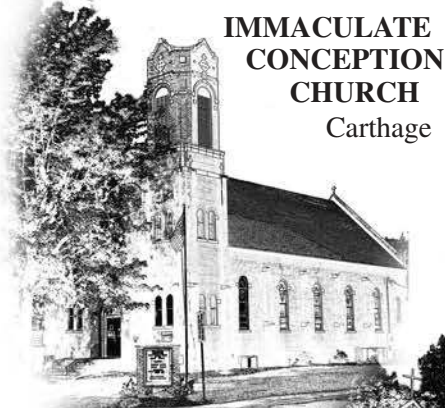
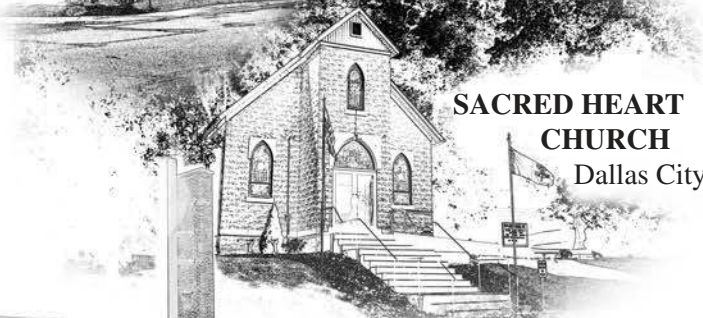

MISSIONARY CO-OPERATION PLAN – Mission appeal, 2021: Please join us on the weekend of September 4 and 5, 2021, to hear Rev. Fr. John Bosco Mujuni speak at all the Masses about his home mission Church in the Archdiocese of Mbarara, Uganda, East Africa. Fr. John Bosco will share with us the needs of a new Seminary in his home diocese. This Seminary was opened up after an increase in the number of young men in discernment of vocation to priesthood.

Currently, Fr. John Bosco is one of the African priests serving in our diocese of Peoria at Immaculate Conception Parish, Lacon, and St. John XXIII Parish, Henry. As a way of appreciating the services rendered by the priests from Africa and other mission lands, the diocese of Peoria once a year assigns them a parish or parishes where they can preach and raise funds to support their home dioceses. *Our parishes have already made a \$1,500 donation to Fr. John Bosco, so we will not be asking you for more donations. His talks will speak about what the donations of our parishes will be supporting.
