From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. What a splendid celebration it is! Jesus Christ is a King unlike any other. In His kingship, Jesus offers us an example of how to live.

When we think of royalty, the British royal family may quickly come to mind. There has certainly been much coverage of that family through the years. We may have thoughts of a glamorous life of ease and luxury. Over time, though, we have come to see them as a sometimes-dysfunctional family that can be painfully and woefully human. This is not the kind of King we celebrate in Jesus.

As a nation that fought a revolution to throw off the reign of an unjust tyrant, our own kind of "royalty" can disappoint also. Presidents, politicians, great athletes, and

stars of stage and screen can too easily let us down. We hope for them to show us an image of a better way to be as people, yet they often let us down because we see their all-too-human side.

As we celebrate this Solemnity of Christ the King, it is apparent that we need a different image of kingship, and so we take a look at the ancient image of a king to better understand what this solemnity says about Jesus and what it entails for us as members of the Kingdom of God.

The ancient ideal of kingship meant that a king was one who was faced with making difficult decisions with wisdom, mercy, and justice. Ancient kings were meant to live lives in service to their people, being willing to set a faith-filled and servant-like example. Kings were meant to serve as peacemakers and were to be willing to give their lives in service to their people. They were called to live holy lives and to lay down their lives for their people, if necessary.

This ancient image of the king helps us to better understand Jesus Christ, the King. He is the one who offers us an example of living to imitate in our daily lives. He is the one who seeks to bring peace into the midst of conflict. His wisdom, mercy, and justice are a pattern for our own deliberations and actions. He is willing to offer us life by laying down His life for us on the Cross.

As the best of Kings, Jesus teaches us by His example that true kingship is not about glamour, power, or wealth. Rather, it is about service. As our King and as the example and model for our daily living, Jesus shows us by His life that we are called to humble, loving service. Our King shows us that we are to be merciful, just, and truthful, willing to bring God's peace to challenging situations.

Like Christ, our King, we are called to lay down our lives so that others may live. This is the kind of kingship into which each of us has been baptized. This sort of kingship offers a vision of a new heaven and new earth. It also demonstrates that we, like Jesus, must be willing to stand in tatters before the powers of the world, ready to offer our lives in pursuit of the kingdom of God.

And now just a few notes:

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK:

- Monday, November 22 - Obligatory Memorial of St. Cecelia, Virgin and Martyr. St. Cecelia is known from her legendary "Passio," a poem which exalts Christian virginity. She is mentioned in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) and has been honored in Rome since the Fifth Century. She died a martyr in the Third Century and is the patroness of Sacred Music because of the song of God in her heart. St. Cecelia, Pray for us!

- Tuesday, November 23 - Optional memorials of St. Clement I, Pope and Martyr; St. Columban, Abbot; in the United States, Blessed Miguel Agustin Pro, Priest and Martyr.

St. Clement I was the fourth Bishop of Rome, known for his epistle that he wrote to the Corinthians, and is mentioned in the Roman Canon. He was martyred around the year 100 under Trajan. St. Clement I, Pray for us!

St. Columban (also known as Columbanus) was an Irish monk and missionary to France. He wrote a strict monastic rule and Penitential and founded several monasteries. He was exiled to Italy for denouncing court immorality and lax bishops. He died in 615 at Bobbio. St. Columban, Pray for us!

Blessed Miguel Pro was a Jesuit from Guadalupe, Mexico, noted for his sympathetic nature and firm piety. During Mexican religious persecution, he was accused of plotting against the government and was executed exclaiming "Long live Christ the King!" He died on November 23, 1927, at the age of thirty-six.

- Wednesday, November 24 - Obligatory Memorial of St. Andrew Dung-Lac, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs. During the seventeenth through nineteenth centuries in Vietnam, some 130,000 Christians suffered cruel martyrdom, many by decapitation or strangulation. This day's memorial remembers St. Andrew Dung-Lac and his companions, most of whom died between 1820 and 1883. All were canonized on June 19, 1988, by Pope St. John Paul II. St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions, Pray for us!

- Thursday, November 25 - Optional memorial of St. Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and Martyr. In the United States, Thanksgiving Day is also observed.

St. Catherine of Alexandria was a learned woman of the early fourth century who, according to legend, following her conversion at the age of eighteen, preached the Gospel throughout Alexandria in Egypt. While imprisoned by the emperor Magnus Maximus, she converted both the empress and the leader of the armed forces. For this, she was martyred. There is a story that upon her death, after a wheel of torture (known as "Catherine's wheel") broke, her body was carried by angels to Mt. Sinai. St. Catherine is the patron saint of philosophers, preachers, and unmarried women. St. Catherine of Alexandria, Pray for us!

- ANNIVERSARY - Wednesday, November 24, would have marked my parents' 59th wedding anniversary. As many of you know, dad died ten years ago. I thank God for the gift of my very life, my parents, and my family. I will be offering Mass for dad on this day, and I encourage each of you to pray for those who have died and also to pray for good and holy vocations to Marriage, Single Life, and Priesthood and Religious Life and that within the great gift of family, all these vocations may be nurtured.

- THANKSGIVING - As we celebrate Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, I want to wish each of you and your family a very Happy and Blessed Thanksgiving. I will be celebrating Mass at both parishes that morning...7:00 a.m. at Holy Family and 8:30 a.m. at St. Thomas. I encourage you to make every effort to join us as we give praise and thanks to God for all the gifts and blessings in our lives that He alone has bestowed upon us.

- TURKEY TROT - The St. Mary School Turkey Trot (5K run/walk) is scheduled for Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 25, beginning at 8:30 a.m. at the Joel Oliver Memorial Pool in Mt. Sterling. In case of inclement weather, the location will be moved to the SMS gym.

- AWAY FROM THE PARISHES - I am planning to take a day away from the parishes, the day after Thanksgiving, Friday, November 26. There will be no Mass or Communion Service that day. For an emergency, please CALL me on my cell phone, 217-242-9669. For any other matters, please either e-mail me (akuhn@dio.org) or call one of the parish office numbers and leave a message if I am unavailable. Again, I kindly ask that my cell phone be used for emergencies only. Do not hesitate to call it for an emergency, especially a Sacramental emergency; but for all other issues, please use the office phone numbers.

- NOVEMBER - A reminder that during the month of November especially, we remember and pray for the dead. Please pray for the repose of the souls of all the faithful departed.

- ADVENT - The Vigil Mass on Saturday, November 27, marks the end of the Liturgical year and the end of the Year of Grace, 2021. Our new Liturgical Year begins with the celebration next week of the First Sunday of Advent, November 28.

- THANK YOU - Thank you to all who helped make this year's Brown County Deer Classic a great success. No matter how you supported the event, thank you. All proceeds go to support St. Mary School. I will be giving you an update as soon as I have figures from the Deer Classic Committee.

- ST. THOMAS CHRISTMAS PARTY - Mark your calendar for St. Thomas Men's and Women's group parish Christmas party for all St. Thomas parishioners on Sunday, December 12, in the Parish Hall. They are planning to have folks sign up so that they can plan accordingly, so please be on the lookout for that and other information.

- CROPS FOR KIDS - Just a reminder that you can still participate in the Crops for Kids for St. Mary School. Thank you to all those who have already participated.

- FALL COLLECTION - The Holy Family Fall Collection is under way. If you have not yet been contacted, you should be soon. I

would ask all parishioners to prayerfully consider their contribution to this collection which remains so very important to the parish, and I'd ask you to return your contributions as soon as you can. Included with my letter for the Fall Collection is an Infant of Prague Prayer Card. As I entrust the financial well-being of the parishes and school to the Miraculous Infant of Prague, I ask you to join me in these prayers each day as well. If you do not receive a letter and prayer card in the next couple of weeks, please let me know and I will be happy to get you one.

- CHRISTMAS CARDS - Once again this year, I have been able to get some beautiful Catholic Christmas cards and make them available to you. These beautiful cards are sometimes difficult to get since they run out of stock very quickly after they become available for the year. While I tried to order as soon as they were available, some of the quantities were still limited. What I was able to get I will have in the back of each of the churches.

If you would like to use them, wonderful, please feel free to take what you need. I have brought these in myself, not with parish funds or as a way to "make money." I want to have solidly Catholic Christmas cards available for you. If you would like to make a contribution for them, you certainly can. I will try to have some envelopes in each church marked "Christmas Cards" that you can use (you could drop those in the collection basket, or you can give me your contribution directly). If you need to write a check, please make it payable to me. Any contributions above the cost of the cards will be given back to the parishes. If you would like to use the cards and cannot offer a contribution, that is perfectly fine...I want you to use them if you want to.

- BULLETIN FRONT - I will be working on updating the bulletin front. In the meantime, please note some of the changes now.

Laura Evans has gone to part-time for St. Thomas only. Ann O'Sullivan is currently helping to oversee Religious Education at Holy Family.

The phone number currently listed for Pat Sharow on the bulletin front is the former cell phone number that St. Thomas once had. This number is no longer in service for St. Thomas and will be removed with the revised bulletin front. Please call the parish phone number.

Anita Witt is no longer heading up the music at St. Thomas because of her growing family commitments and involvement. For now, please call the parish phone number.

Mass times for days of Obligation will be removed from the bulletin front and instead will be included in the bulletin write-ups when these days are approaching.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is currently offered at Holy Family on Saturday afternoons from 4:30-5:00 p.m. and on the First Fridays of each month at St. Thomas from 5:00 p.m. - 5:45 p.m.

With the revised bulletin front, I will likely be removing some of the names and phone numbers from the bulletin front that is permanent and instead be including them from time to time within the weekly changing portion of the bulletin itself.

- RETURNING HOME - As I've already mentioned, if you know of someone who is away from the Church, I would like to send them a personal invitation to come back and join us, especially for our Christmas Liturgies. I'd ask you to consider giving me their name and mailing address (if you have it) and to let me know if I may use your name in the invitation that I send. I ask you to prayerfully consider this and look at it as an opportunity of great love to bring others back to the Church.

As a reminder, this is primarily for those who are away from the Church. If you know someone interested in joining the Church, wonderful, but that is more for RCIA. You are welcome to give me those names as well, but please make the distinction.

You can get me the information a number of ways...by e-mailing me, giving it to me (written out) at Mass, or by dropping it in the mail or by the office. I will keep these confidential, but I do ask that you include your name.

Again, I want to wish you all a very Happy and Blessed Thanksgiving. It is hard to believe that we are about to end one Liturgical Year and begin another. Thank you for your continued prayers and support. May you have a most blessed week.
