## From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Church celebrates the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the new Liturgical year. We are reminded in the readings from Sacred Scripture for today that in looking forward to the return of Christ in glory, our hearts are full of hope and expectation.

Today's readings point to two temptations that can so easily appear. First, we might presume that since we have been waiting so long for the return of Christ, that it won't be anytime soon, and so we will have lots of time to prepare. The other is, we may assume that His return is any moment now, so that we live in fear of that great day, frozen and unable to hope or to embrace life's journey.

Neither of these temptations is worth embracing. Instead, we look forward to Christ's return, and as we wait, we use the time to grow in our relationship with the

Lord while understanding that this world is not our ultimate home.

Today's Gospel can seem very sobering. Jesus doesn't mince His words as He reveals to us that there is going to be a reckoning, a judgment, and we do not know when. But we know it is coming and, therefore, we need to be vigilant, prayerful, and ready. This is not a pious cliché, but a tenet of faith that we profess in our Creed.

The judgment will be a real one. The review of our life with its many choices and options will be laid out before us in the bright light of God's revelation and mercy. But there are also two other themes in this Gospel passage that we need in order to have the full picture.

First, as Christians, we are encouraged to stand tall in the knowledge that our Redeemer is at hand and to hold fast to the hope that our faith gives us even in times of trial and tribulation. We know the final outcome in the great battle between good and evil. It is Christ's triumph over death. Our task is to ensure that we are on that winning side by living lives worthy of Him. We cannot take it for granted, but instead need to renew daily our commitment to fulfill the hope that is within us and live our lives in the sure and certain knowledge that our redemption is at hand.

Second, as Christians we are called to be realistic, to face up to the fact that our world is broken and in need of healing, and yet we are never hopeless in all of that. Indeed, the Christian view is to see imperfection not as a lost cause but as an opportunity for healing and redemption. All is never lost until that moment of final judgment. This is what we celebrate in the Advent season, a time of preparation and anticipation. We look forward to the coming of Christ, and as we look forward, we strive to be vigilant, prayerful, and worthy to stand before Him when He comes in glory.

And now just a few notes:

LITURGICAL CELEBRATION THIS WEEK:

- Tuesday, November 30 - Feast of St. Andrew, Apostle. Andrew was the brother of Simon Peter and disciple of John the Baptist. Tradition holds that he preached north of the Black Sea and in Greece and died bound to an X-shaped cross at Petra, Greece in the First Century. He is mentioned in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) and is the patron of Russia, Scotland, and the fishing industry. St. Andrew, Pray for us!

- Friday, December 3 - Obligatory Memorial of St. Francis Xavier, Priest. Francis Xavier was from Navarre and was one of the founding Jesuits. He preached in India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, and Japan. He died in 1552 at the age of forty-six on the island of Sancion off the China coast. Along with St. Therese of the Child Jesus, he is co-patron of the Apostleship of Prayer and of the foreign missions. St. Francis Xavier, Pray for us!

- Saturday, December 4 - Optional memorial of St. John Damascene, Priest and Doctor of the Church. St. John Damascene was born around the year 657 in Damascus, a Muslim city. He was raised a Christian but served as a finance minister at the court of the caliph where he was respected for his competence, fairness, and humility. He became a monk around the year 700 and later a priest at the Monastery of St. Sabas near Jerusalem. He was the first of the East to formulate a comprehensive synthesis of Christian Dogma. His main Dogmatic work, *The Fountain of Knowledge*, defended the veneration of images against iconoclasts. He is known for composing hymns and preaching many homilies in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially her Assumption. He died around the year 749. St. John Damascene, Pray for us!

- POPE'S INTENTION - the Holy Father's intention for December is for Catechists. Let us pray for the catechists, summoned to announce the Word of God: may they be its witnesses, with courage and creativity and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

- FIRST FRIDAY - Friday, December 3, is First Friday and so we will have our First Friday Devotion at St. Thomas with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at Noon and going until 5:45 p.m. Benediction will be at 5:45 p.m. followed by Mass at 6:00 p.m. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available from 5:00 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. As always, I encourage all of us to spend some time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament and to enter into the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What a wonderful opportunity for all of us.

- NOCTURNAL ADORATION - Nocturnal Adoration at Holy Family will begin on Saturday evening, December 4, at 10:00 p.m. It will go overnight as usual and end with benediction at 7:45 a.m. on Sunday morning. Again, I encourage everyone to come and spend some time in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

- DONUT SUNDAY - Next Sunday, December 3, is the first Sunday of the month which is "Donut Sunday" for St. Thomas. Plan to join us in the Hall after Mass.

- ST. THOMAS CHRISTMAS PARTY - Mark your calendar for St. Thomas Men's and Women's group parish Christmas party for all St. Thomas parishioners on Sunday, December 12, in the Parish Hall. They are planning to have folks sign up so that they can plan accordingly, so please be on the lookout for that and other information. I do hope that you all will be able to join us.

- FALL COLLECTION - The Holy Family Fall Collection is under way. I hope many of you have already been contacted. If you have not yet been contacted, you should be soon. I ask all parishioners to prayerfully consider their contribution to this collection which remains so very important to the parish, and I'd ask you to return your contributions as soon as you can. Included with my letter for the Fall Collection is an Infant of Prague Prayer Card. As I entrust the financial well-being of the parishes and school to the Miraculous Infant of Prague, I ask you to join me in these prayers each day as well. If you do not receive a letter and prayer card in the next week or so, please let me know and I will be happy to get you one. I'm happy to provide you with additional prayer cards as well if you need them...just let me know.

- CHRISTMAS CARDS - As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, again this year I have been able to get some beautiful Catholic Christmas cards and make them available to you. These beautiful cards are sometimes difficult to get since they run out of stock very quickly after they become available for the year. While I tried to order as soon as they were available, some of the quantities were still limited. What I was able to get I have in the back of each of the churches.

If you would like to use them, wonderful, please feel free to take what you need. I have brought these in myself, not with parish funds or as a way to “make money.” I want to have solidly Catholic Christmas cards available for you if you want to use them. If you would like to make a contribution for them, you certainly can. I will try to have some envelopes in each church marked “Christmas Cards” that you can use (you could drop those in the collection basket) or you can give me your contribution directly. If you need to write a check, please make it payable to me. Any contributions above the cost of the cards will be given back to the parishes. If you would like to use the cards and cannot offer a contribution, that is perfectly fine...I want you to use them if you want to.

- RETURNING HOME - As I've mentioned a number of times now in the bulletin, if you know of someone who is away from the Church, I would like to send them a personal invitation to come back and join us, especially for our Christmas Liturgies. I'd ask you to consider giving me their name and mailing address (if you have it) and to let me know if I may use your name in the invitation that I send. I ask you to prayerfully consider this and look at it as an opportunity of great love to bring others back to the Church.

As a reminder, this is primarily for those who are away from the Church. If you know someone interested in joining the Church, wonderful, but that is more for RCIA. You are welcome to give me those names as well, but please make the distinction.

You can get me the information a number of ways...by e-mailing me, giving it to me (written out) at Mass, or by dropping it in the mail or by the office. I will keep these confidential, but I do ask that you include your name.

- VOCATIONS - As we continue to support and pray for good and holy vocations, each parish will be having small

cards available for each seminarian of our Diocese. Please be on the lookout for these. I encourage you to take one or more of these cards to learn a bit more about that particular seminarian, and then to offer prayers for him. You might also consider sending him a card and note to encourage him and to let him know that you are praying for him. While the cards have the name of the seminary where the man is studying, there is no address so I will be publishing those in an upcoming bulletin. In the meantime, if you need the information and cannot find it, just let me know and I will get it to you. Thank you for your support of holy vocations.

- BULLETIN FRONT - As I wrote in last week's bulletin, I will be working on updating the bulletin front. In the meantime, please note some of the changes now.
