

Today, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. Today, we celebrate the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. The Magi represent the Gentiles to whom our Lord intended to include in His gift of salvation. The Gentiles were not the original Chosen People, but our Lord always intended to include them in His plan of salvation. In God's plan Israel was to be like the Star of Bethlehem – a light to the nations to guide them to the Lord. Like Israel, the Church today is called to be the star to guide people today on their path to the Lord.

Next Saturday evening, January 8, here at Blessed Sacrament, we will celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation for our 7th, 6th, and 3rd Grade Students** and **1st Holy Communion for our 3rd Grade students**. Bishop Thomas Paprocki will be here to celebrate these sacraments at two evening Masses at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Please place our students in your prayers this week in anticipation of these sacraments which will complete their initiation in the Catholic Church.

This month we begin collecting subscription money for our Diocesan Newspaper, the **Catholic Times**. I encourage our parishioners to include \$15.00 in your Catholic Times envelope for your annual CT subscription. You may return your envelope in the collection anytime in the next few weeks.

Our Accounting Office is making available **printed copies of your annual 2021 financial contribution statements** for you to pick up in church. In the upcoming weeks we will have labeled and sealed envelopes containing your contribution information that you can use in preparing your tax return. Envelopes will be sorted alphabetically, and we encourage you to pick up your sealed envelope before or after Mass.

Finally, next Sunday, January 9, Bishop Thomas Paprocki will be making a **Pastoral Visit to Blessed Sacrament Church**. He will preside at our two morning Masses (8 a.m. and 10 a.m.), and will be available for parish members to visit with him after each of these Masses. Coffee and donuts will be available at each of these Masses to enjoy while waiting to visit with the Bishop. At 12:00 Noon Bishop will have lunch with members of the Parish Staff, Education Council, Finance Council, Pastoral Council, Pastor's Cabinet, and Stewardship Council. Following lunch these members will have a Joint Meeting with the Bishop, with an opportunity to share hopes and visions of our parish within the life of our Diocese of Springfield in Illinois.

The Epiphany of the Lord, Solemnity Sunday, January 2, 2022

Isaiah 60:1-6. Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13. Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6. Matthew 2:1-12.

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. "The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is his, and government and power." With these words, the Church proclaims that today's feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of Advent. Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season.


The Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated either on January 6 or, according to the decision of the episcopal conference, on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8. The young Messiah is revealed as the light of the nations. Yet, as the antiphon for the *Magnificat* at Second Vespers reminds us, three mysteries are encompassed in this solemnity: the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, the Baptism of Christ, and the wedding feast at Cana. Extra candles and/or lamps may be placed around the sanctuary and in other parts of the church to honor Christ revealed as the Light of the Gentiles (*Ceremonial of Bishops*). It is customary to replace the images of the shepherds at the crib with the three Magi and their gifts

The feast of the Epiphany, which was kept in the East and in certain Western churches before being observed in Rome, seems to have been originally a feast of the Nativity – January 6, for those churches where it was kept, was the equivalent of Christmas (December 25) in the Roman Church. The feast was introduced at Rome in the second half of the sixth century and became the complement and, so to say, the crown of the Christmas festival.

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has ever seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. St. Leo brings out this point admirably in a sermon, read at Matins, in which he shows in the adoration of the Magi the beginnings of Christian faith, the time when the great mass of the heathen sets off to follow the star which summons it to seek its Savior.

That is the meaning, too, of the wonderful prophecy from Isaiah which the liturgy appoints to be read in the first nocturn at Matins and at the Epistle of the Mass. This same thought of universal redemption the Church returns to as she sings, in the antiphon to the *Magnificat* at 2nd Vespers, applying the words to herself, of the union with Christ typified by the wedding feast at Cana, by the baptism of her children foreshadowed by that of Christ in the waters of the Jordan. Formerly, the Epiphany was an additional day for solemn baptisms.
