

Bringing Christ to the Nations

On this Solemnity of the Epiphany, we recall the visit of the Wise Men to the Infant Christ and how non-Jews came to worship Him. What a strange encounter this must have been! There is a lot that is not known about the Wise Men (they were "from the East"), but it seems clear that they were foreigners. They probably spoke a different language from that of Mary and Joseph. Their dress was probably different. It was probably a somewhat uncomfortable experience for Jesus' parents..and yet here they were to worship Jesus. This encounter offers us a reminder of what to expect in evangelization: strangeness, discomfort, and awkwardness! (To be sure, there's a lot of grace and mercy and love, too!) On our part, as we look to bring Christ to others, while holding firm to the truth of the Gospel, we need to expect that the people who will hear the message might not know or understand or live according to everything we do. It might be strange, uncomfortable, and awkward to encounter them...but know you're not alone! It was probably just like this for Mary and Joseph, as well.


