

Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the gospel story today Jesus returns to the synagogue in His home town of Nazareth. He picks up the scroll and reads the passage from Isaiah, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor." 


