Liturgy Corner

What is Liturgy of the Hours?

Liturgy of the Hours, also referred to as the Divine Office, is an ancient form of liturgical prayer. It has roots in Judaism, but went out of practice during the Protestant Reformation. It was implemented again by Dom Gueranger, a priest and figure of the Liturgical Movement, in the 1800's, and officially reemphasized by the Second Vatican Council. In the early Church, faithful Christians prayed at fixed times of the day. This eventually took the form of a cycle of hours — hence the name the Liturgy of the Hours. It is a way to sanctify time — to make each hour holy, to help us live prayerful lives, to pray in community, to enjoy lives soaked in Scripture, and to pray for the world.

The Structure of Liturgy of the Hours

Liturgy of the Hours is prayed at multiple times of the day. Some of the common times being Laudes (Morning Prayer), Vespers (Evening Prayer), and Compline (Night Prayer). At each time of the day, we pray with the Psalms and Scripture. "Thus it is so constructed that after a hymn, there is always psalmody, then a long or short reading of Sacred Scripture, and finally prayer of petition." (General Instruction)

"Singing belongs to the one who loves." St. Augustine

It is fitting that just as the Psalms were chanted by Jews, we sing the Psalms found in the Liturgy of the Hours. In the *General Instruction of the Liturgy of the Hours*, it says, "Christ Jesus, High Priest of the new and eternal covenant, taking human nature, introduced into this earthly exile the hymn of praise that is sung throughout all ages in the halls of heaven" (*SC. Art. 83*). From then on in Christ's heart the praise of God assumes a human sound in words of adoration, expiation, and intercession, presented to the Father by the Head of the new humanity..." As Dr. Denis McNamara puts it, singing the Liturgy of the Hours is "heavenly choir practice."

Liturgy of the Hours "Belongs to the Whole Body of Christ."

Liturgy of the Hours or the Divine Office is an extension of the Mass. Indeed, it is liturgical prayer, meaning that it is a public act of prayer. While it is required that "sacred ministers" (priests, bishops, etc.) pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the faithful laity are welcomed and encouraged to participate in this beautiful prayer of the Church. In praying the Liturgy of the Hours we are able to sanctify time. We are able to begin "praying without ceasing." Consider praying Laudes with your morning cup of coffee. Could you squeeze night prayer in while folding that last load of laundry? Apps like Hallow have auditory guides for praying Liturgy of the Hours that are great for beginners.
