

Did you notice how Mary speaks to Jesus in today's Gospel? She tells Him matter-of-factly, "They have no wine." She isn't anxious or desperate. She's not flustered. (In short, she's not at all like we can be!) She holds a conversation with Jesus...and then she speaks with the steward, telling the steward, "Do whatever he tells you." In these conversations she offers us an example of what the Lord desires from us: complete confidence. These days especially we find ourselves immersed in a lot of difficulties – some which are just a part of everyday life and some which are a part of the particular craziness of 2022. As we live it all, the Lord invites us to set aside fear and anxiety and ask Him confidently to make things right. If you have a hard time doing this, ask Him to help you to do so. (The chaplet of Divine Mercy is a great way to ask!) He wants us to trust in Him, and if He desires that, He gives us the means to make that happen.


