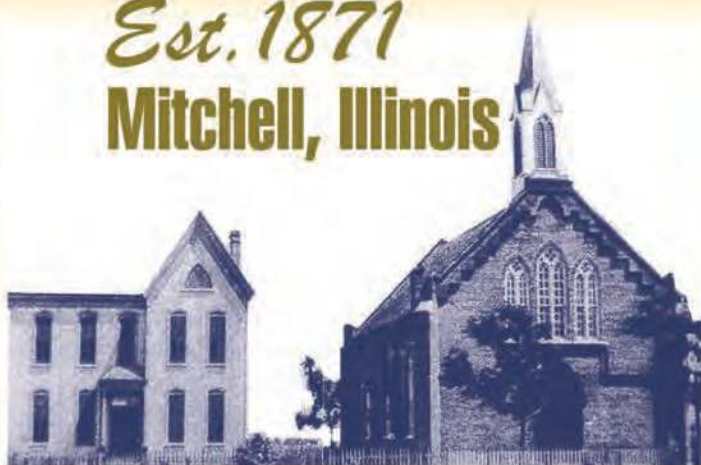
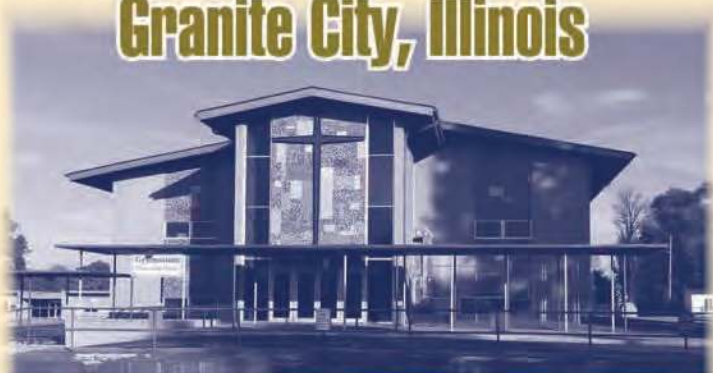

### Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 62:1-5. Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10.

1 Corinthians 12:4-11. John 2:1-11.

**Believing Signs.** At first glance, these readings lead us to bride and groom, gifts, and marriage. But there are important things underneath, important truths at the heart of these proclamations. God has not and will not abandon us (Isaiah). Charisms, that is, gifts of the Spirit, are given to everyone to use for the common good, not just one's own good (Corinthians). The miracle of water to wine is the first of many signs of the Messiah, the Christ (John). God's signs and good activity are everywhere.

- ♦ What gifts that I have, given by the Spirit, will I put to use for the good of another?
- ♦ Christ is active all the time. What little and big signs of this goodness can I be part of? What signs will I rejoice in?

## Theological Thoughts

*with Deacon Michael*

It's time for a liturgical trivia question! Do you know what this is?

If you answered a "hand paten" or "communion paten," you're correct!

Ever since Father Alfred suggested that maybe we could try to bring the hand paten back into our liturgy at St. Elizabeth, and they arrived in my office, everyone I've shown them to (everyone older than myself, that is) has remembered them from their youth.

The hand paten is held and used by an altar server under the hands of the Communion minister (or extraordinary minister) and the communicant (the person receiving Holy Communion) to help catch and ensure no particles or crumbs of the Blessed Sacrament accidentally fall to the floor during the distribution of Holy Communion.

Using hand patens is one way to ensure we treat the Most Holy Body of Christ with the respect and care it demands, and also a way for those who may not share our belief in the Eucharist to visibly see and come to understand how important it is to us, and how carefully we treat it.

You'll note that just like the other sacred vessels, the servers will take care with them and will return them to the altar, sitting on a corporal, where they will be purified by a deacon or acolyte to ensure any remaining particles are properly cared for.

For now, we only plan to use the hand patens at the 10:30 Sunday Mass, and other special Solemnities, because it's usually at those Masses where we have enough altar servers to be able to handle all of the hand patens. It's also where, for the time being, our seminarians will usually be around to help our altar servers with the proper use of them.

However, in the future, we would certainly hope to use them at all of the Masses, and whenever Holy Communion is distributed. One way you can help is to encourage more of our young men and women (our Young Disciples) to become altar servers!

We plan to start this coming weekend, so thought this would be a good weekend to introduce and explain them.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. This national collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Brazil's Associacao do Sementes do Verba (Seeds of the Word Community) is a young and growing congregation with a unique vision of forming missionary communities of disciples in all states of life-consecrated men and women, clergy, lay missionaries, and married couples and families, all living together in community. Founded in 2004, Sementes do Verba has 20 communities throughout Brazil, as well as in Portugal, Belgium, Canada, Comoros, and Mozambique. A central aspect of the group's spirituality is a nine-month formation period called a "sabbatical year," during which participants live in a mission house with the community and study Scripture; take courses in the theology of the body and human sexuality, with an emphasis on prevention of abuse; and participate in spiritual exercises and parish mission weeks.

Supported by a grant from the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America, 100 participants from 25 dioceses in 11 Brazilian states had the opportunity to become formed as more effective missionary disciples in 2021. When you support the Collection for the Church in Latin America, your material gift makes it possible for disciples to use their gifts and abilities as evangelizers, regardless of their states in life or economic backgrounds.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of January 22-23. Please be generous toward this collection. Take this opportunity to share your faith with our sisters and brothers in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support truly makes a difference.

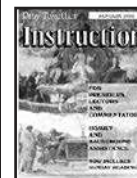
