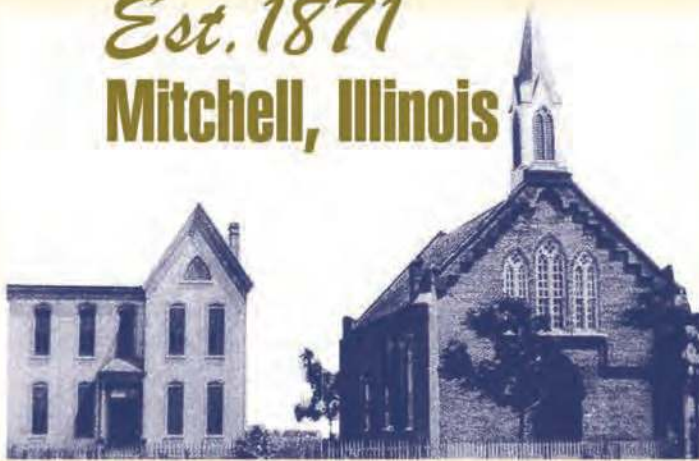

Sunday's Mass Readings

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – January 23, 2022

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10. Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15.

1 Corinthians 12:12-30. Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21.

Believing the Word of God. We are the Body of Christ (Corinthians) assembling as the graced community of believers (Nehemiah) each week to give thanks and praise, to share in Communion, and then sent to serve. We are part of the great Communion of Saints to whom is handed down the living Word of God – both the Scriptures and the Tradition as well as the very person of Christ who is the spoken Word of God (Luke). During the first Mass in a brand-new church building, the bishop shows the *Lectionary* to the assembly and says:

"May the word of God resound always in this building, to open for you the mystery of Christ and to bring about your salvation in the Church."

The Word of God is central to faith.

- ◆ How will I set aside a few minutes each day to read/reread Scripture? What is a good time?
- ◆ How will I look for the unfolding mystery of Christ in little and big ways today?
- ◆ How will I be "good news" this week by what I say and do?

Theological Thoughts with Deacon Michael

To quote the song, *I Know Things Now* from the musical *Into the Woods*, I "feel excited; well, excited and scared," to be tackling some very important topics the next few weeks in our Adult Faith Formation classes. The moral teachings of the Church have come under a cultural microscope over the last 100 years or so, but continue to stand the test of time.

What God has revealed to us as it relates to how to order our lives and actions in key areas like the dignity of life, our use of the sexual gift, and in medical decision-making *works*, makes sense, and helps lead to happier, healthier lives. That doesn't change the fact that much of it is unpopular, ignored, or downright fought against in much of our modern cultural landscape.

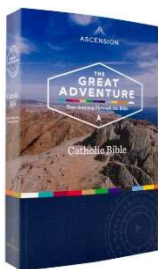
We'll be tackling some of these topics head-on, and if you're free on a Thursday night, I hope you'll set aside time to join us in the Harmony Room. We gather for fellowship at 6:30 and the class runs from about 7–8:15.

This Thursday, I'll be covering a broader survey of "Christian Moral Living," and the following Thursday (February 3) a deeper dive into the concepts of the Dignity of Life and a consistent Ethic of Life.

Thursday, February 10, a life-long friend of mine and current Vice President of Mission for the Mercy Health System, Dr. Jared H. Bryson, MDiv, DMin, will cover Current Issues in Medical Morality.

And on Thursday, February 17, I'll cover Current Issues in Sexual Morality.

Through these important nights on these important topics, I hope we're able to help draw a clear picture of some of the Church's key teachings, but also to help show that in many cases, our moral teaching is misconstrued and malpositioned as "the things we can't do," rather than being viewed as the roadmap to happier, healthier lives as God designed us to live. Our moral teaching isn't about restraint from anything as much as it is about Freedom for Excellence!

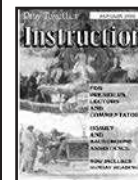
