

What St. Elizabeth School Means to Me

Saint Elizabeth School has been my home away from home since Pre-K. That is around 10 of my 14 years on this earth. Teachers have become parents, classmates become siblings, and every day is like a family reunion. You see your "cousins" from other classes at lunch and can catch up with them. At St. Elizabeth, good values and strong morals are instilled in your head every single day. We are taught the importance of friendship, kindness, and, most importantly, God. This is what St. Elizabeth School means to me.

Even though I have been here most of my life, it doesn't even feel like a week. Everyone and everything changes continuously, whilst remaining nostalgic and familiar. From things like new school bathrooms and water fountains to new teachers and faculty members, it seems like nothing stays the same. Still, it has the same smell on the first day of school; the sign out front was there when I first started kindergarten. I still remember shadowing the preschool class and not wanting to leave. Everyone still treats one another like family. Sometimes, I forget how truly amazing this school has been for me; but I am reminded by the teachers who have adopted us as their own, who ask how we are doing, and who really care about our futures.

One of the most important things that I have learned here is that we aren't so different from one another, even though we might not recognize our similarities at first. We all have things in common; like our undying love for our middle school teachers. They are hilarious and silly, while still remaining like authority figures instead of your best friend. They make sure you are being the best version of yourself you can be. The teachers here have become more like fun parents than teachers. I would consider them family.

I know how easy it is to forget that I've been here for so long and that I will be graduating this year. I too get caught up in all of the teenager problems, schoolwork, drama, and other things that are distracting me from being happy. I might seem excited and worry-free, but internally, I am the opposite. I am terrified of leaving and going to a new, bigger place where I know no one and no one knows me. I will be leaving everything I've ever known and starting anew, and that is frightening. But I know that no matter where I go, God will always be with me. I learned that at St. Elizabeth; that God is always there, even when you feel alone.

Thinking about graduating and starting a new phase of my life is scary, but exciting. I know that St. Elizabeth will always have a special place in my heart and will always be an important part of who I am. This school has helped instill good morals and values that I will carry with me for the rest of my life. It has helped me become a good Catholic and a helpful, considerate human being. I have learned the importance of community service and helping others in need. That is what St. Elizabeth School means to me.
