#### Second Sunday in Ordinary Time JANUARY 16, 2022

Isaiah 62:1-5; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11; John 2:1-11

We return to "Ordinary Time", the season of the life of the Church. Green is the color of life and of hope; our vestments and altar frontals will be green until Lent begins (March 6). Because of the Gospel selection, today is often called "Cana Sunday." The basic story is simple: Jesus and his followers go to a wedding feast; the host runs short of wine; Mary tells Jesus who seemingly rebuffs her. Mary tells the waiters to do whatever Jesus says. Jesus then changes the water into wine.

But the rest of the story is much deeper. John's Gospel always has at least two levels, one obvious and one deeper and not so obvious. The purpose of John's Gospel is to show the replacement of all the forms of Judaism with something new and better.

Jesus works seven "signs" to do this. This first sign alludes to the Jewish manner of purification (the water jars). This is replaced by the lavish (about 125-150 gallons) new wine of Christ (representing the grace of love and salvation). Jesus calls his mother "woman", alluding to the "woman" in Genesis 3:15 whose son will stamp out evil. The old woman Eve and her heritage is replaced by the new woman, the Church, represented by Mary. The marriage of God to Israel is replaced by the marriage of the Church to Christ. The theme is newness, richness, joy, and love.

Do you think you are a nobody? Then you'll act like one! But if you think that you are a beloved son or daughter of God, you should act as one. The second reading tells us that God has given each of us distinct talents and gifts. And he calls on us to "give them away", to use them in service to others for the building up of the Church.

Insofar as we try to serve others and "give away" our gifts, the Lord will lavish on us even more abundantly. Let us pray to know our gifts and to use them in joy for others. If we seek to serve, we shall be amazed at

#### Dear Parishioners,

As we gather this weekend for our Eucharist, the Church begins what is termed "Ordinary Time." This is that time in our Church calendar that does not celebrate a special mystery in the life of Christ or in the Church. Thus, it is termed "ordinary" as there is not a specific feast or solemnity being celebrated. But it is never "ordinary" in the sense of "common place," for when we celebrate moments of grace it is never "ordinary" in that sense of the word. Thus, we begin the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

On this 2nd Sunday in Ordinary time, the Church gives to us the gospel of the wedding feast at Cana. In this particular gospel, the evangelist, John, tells us that Jesus and His disciples were invited to a wedding. We can presume that Jesus must have known this couple to have been invited to their wedding. Now, one of the worst things that could happen to this couple did happen; namely, they ran out of wine. This would have been an error of judgment, but it would come across as a lack of hospitality. It could come across as a very embarrassing moment for this couple and their family. In this particular situation, two things happen in this gospel. The first, Mary, also an invited guest, takes notice of the situation and informs Jesus. Eventually, Mary tells the waiters "Do whatever Jesus tells you to do." Perhaps those same words would echo through the centuries as they happen to be the same words she would say to all of us, "Do whatever Jesus tells us to do." Wise words as they are, words that would lead not only to happiness in this life, but eternal happiness in the next; if we only would heed her words and live by them. The waiters would heed the words of Jesus, filing up several large jars with water, and then something remarkable happens. The water that was poured into these jars was changed into the finest wine, thus preventing embarrassment and/or social disgrace to this young family. But on a deeper level, this wedding feast of Cana was another type of Epiphany experience. It was the experience of people who see in Jesus a replacement of the old ways of the Torah with the new ways of Christ bringing an abundance of God's forgiveness and joy, represented by the wine.

As we look ahead, Catholic Schools Week will begin the weekend of January 29–30. At the conclusion of that week, we will have our traditional dinner in which we honor someone who has been instrumental in promoting and supporting Catholic Schools here in Quincy. This is sponsored by QCES, the Quincy Catholic Elementary School's Foundation. This will be the 13th Annual Friends of Catholic Education Dinner, in which we will recognize the Franciscan Friars for their contribution to Catholic education. This dinner will be Saturday, February 5, at 6:00 p.m. in the Atrium. Please consult the bulletin on tickets for this evening.

Next weekend we will have one of our two collections for items to be shipped to our sister parishes in Haiti. You are asked to bring to church toothpaste, toothbrushes, regular size bars of soap, deodorant, washcloths, and combs. Containers will be in the Narthex to receive your donations. On a personal level, I saw how the Haitian people were so touched by these small gifts. Thank you!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Soon our diocese will take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. This national collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Brazil's Associacao do Sementes do Verba (Seeds of the Word Community) is a young and growing congregation with a unique vision of forming missionary communities of disciples in all states of life-consecrated men and women, clergy, lay missionaries, and married couples and families, all living together in community. Founded in 2004, Sementes do Verba has 20 communities throughout Brazil, as well as in Portugal, Belgium, Canada, Comoros, and Mozambique. A central aspect of the group's spirituality is a nine-month formation period called a "sabbatical year," during which participants live in a mission house with the community and study Scripture; take courses in the theology of the body and human sexuality, with an emphasis on prevention of abuse; and participate in spiritual exercises and parish mission weeks.

Supported by a grant from the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America, 100 participants from 25 dioceses in 11 Brazilian states had the opportunity to become formed as more effective missionary disciples in 2021. When you support the Collection for the Church in Latin America, your material gift makes it possible for disciples to use their gifts and abilities as evangelizers, regardless of their states in life or economic backgrounds.

Our diocese takes up this collection on the weekend of January 22—23. Please be generous toward this collection. Take this opportunity to share your faith with our sisters and brothers in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support truly makes a difference. Thank you and God bless you.
