Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time JANUARY 30, 2022

Jeremiah 1:4-5,17-19; 1 Corinthians 12:31—13:13; Luke 4:21-30

Seek the truth and practice it in love. This sums up the message of our faith. The truth is not always popular. Jeremiah was called to be a prophet when he was a teenager. Few people think that the young have anything worthwhile to say, and Jeremiah's message was definitely not popular. He told the people that the nation had become so corrupt that God would destroy it.

He counseled surrender – and was branded a traitor. Yet his message was from God. Today's first reading describes God's call of Jeremiah: He called him and dedicated him from before his birth. He called him to stand up against the powerful and influential. His only consolation would be that he spoke the truth and was doing God's will.

Today's Gospel follows last Sunday's stirring announcement of Jesus at his hometown synagogue. The words of the prophets were fulfilled in him! At first the people were glad: a hometown boy had made good. But then they found him too much for them. They wanted miracles. They wondered where he came by his wisdom and power, since he was just a hometown boy. He said good things about Gentiles – and that did it! They were so furious that they tried to kill him! Crowds are fickle; they are swayed by emotion; they are rarely interested in truth.

The second reading is the most beautiful chapter in the entire Bible. Paul had been discussing how the Corinthians should use their talents and spiritual gifts: The gifts came from the one Spirit, and should be used for each other; the gifts were for the building up of the Body of Christ (the Church) in unity.

This leads him to the "Digression on Charity." If you have every gift (tongues, prophecy, miracles), but have not love - you are nothing! Paul gives the qualities of fraternal love which should be the mark of every Christian: Love is patient, kind, never jealous, never snobbish, never rude, never self-seeking. Love doesn't put on airs or give in to anger or bear grudges. Love rejoices with the truth. Love is not just a nicey-nicey feeling, for if we truly love another person, we want them to come to the truth and be saved. If we love each other, we first of all are concerned for each other's spiritual welfare. Love seeks to radiate the great truth of God to all persons.

Dear Parishioners,

We gather this weekend to celebrate the Fourth Sunday in our Ordinary Time. In our first reading from the Prophet Jeremiah, we have a very moving Scripture passage. In this reading, we hear of the call of a young teenager to be a prophet. Jeremiah was called to be the spokesperson of God, proclaiming a very difficult message to an audience that didn't want to hear it. Jeremiah tried to find one excuse after another, from his youthfulness to his inability to speak, to avoid this calling by God. In spite of his reluctance, the Lord told him, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born, I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." How could one say "no" to this declaration? But Jeremiah had his reservations and didn't think himself strong enough to survive what lay ahead with the people's reactions. But the Lord says to Him, "Be not crushed on their account, as though I would leave you crushed before them. They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you." Jeremiah, with the grace and presence of God, accepted his role as prophet and fulfilled it in his life.

As I reflected upon that reading, I thought about what God had said to Jeremiah, is the same message that He says of each of us: "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you, before you were born, I dedicated you." Each of us has a specific purpose in life. God did not randomly create us, but rather He created us in His image and likeness to have a role in His plan of creation. Each of us needs to discern what our role is, what our Lord has dedicated us to do with our lives, and then with His grace fulfill that role. And to the extent that we accept the role that God has for us, to that extent will we find fulfillment and happiness in our lives here on earth. So, the challenge is to ask ourselves, What role do I have in God's plan of creation. God has made us with a purpose and a role, for He doesn't make junk. Jeremiah discovered his role. What is yours?

This weekend, we begin what we call National Catholic School's Week. At our Masses this weekend, one of our students from St. Peter School will stand before us, thanking us for making it possible to have St. Peter School. As a product myself of Catholic education, I have always been very proud of what I was given in a Catholic school. We were given a quality Catholic education at a time in which there was no tuition, but only parish support, and for that I have always been grateful. I look at my Catholic grade school days as very instrumental in helping me discern my vocation to the priesthood. Priests like Fr. Roy Bauer were assigned to my home parish and became an influence for me to consider the priesthood. I have so many great memories of my grade school days, memories that shaped and fashioned me to discover God's plan for me as a priest. And I will always be grateful to the Ursuline Nuns who taught in our grade school, who demanded much, and who were not afraid to discipline when necessary; but my experience of the Catholic school was foundational in my call to the priesthood. And St. Peter School, I hope, continues this ministry of quality education with high expectations, solid discipline, and moral living as our school becomes the place to discern our calling from God and our role in His creation.

Fr. Leo's column continued..




