

Father Tom's Column

Today we celebrate the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the gospel today Jesus asks His disciples the question, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?" Jesus is confronting the tendency within all of us to judge our neighbor. "You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." This coming Lent is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to cooperate with the Lord in His removing the beams from our eyes that keep us from seeing.

This upcoming Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent as we celebrate **Ash Wednesday**. Our Ash Wednesday liturgies will be celebrated at the following three times:

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting – giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

The following are the **Lenten regulations** for Catholics to observe.

Abstinence – Everyone <u>14</u> years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Friday's of Lent.

Fast – Everyone <u>18</u> years of age and under <u>59</u> is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal, and two much smaller meatless meals, are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

On the Sunday Evenings of Lent before 5:00 p.m. Mass, we will celebrate **Solemn Evening Prayer in the context of a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Exposition**. The Sunday evening schedule, beginning Sunday, March 6, will look as follows:

3:50 p.m.: Eucharistic Adoration begins 3:50–4:20 p.m.: Confessions 4:20–4:40 p.m.: Solemn Evening Prayer 4:40–4:50 p.m.: Benediction and Reposition

5:00 p.m.: Evening Mass

This coming Lent our parish will host a video Bible series, *The Bible and the Sacraments*, produced by Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology. It is an 11-episode video series, each video 30 minutes in length, which explains the Scriptural foundation of the Sacraments. LENT IS QUICKLY APPROACHING!

Lent is more than just a time to prepare our hearts for the Lord; it is a time to turn our hearts to the Lord. Every day there are many distractions, difficulties, and even sins that turn our hearts away. In the first reading for Ash Wednesday we hear the prophet proclaiming, "Even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the LORD, your God." Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we are able to redirect our hearts. We do not just sacrifice for the sake of sacrificing, and this is not a time to kill two birds with one stone by implementing a new restrictive diet. We need to ask ourselves: how can my sacrifice be offered up on behalf of others? Am I giving up things that either need elimination from my life or while not bad in themselves, are a distraction on my path to holiness? Below are some suggestions for ways to implement prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent.

Liturgy Corner

What's up with the different things Father wears during Mass throughout the year? Why do they wear them in the first place and why are they different sometimes?

The various vestments Father wears at Mass and at other liturgical celebrations are very symbolic.

ALB The alb is the white garment which reminds the priest of his baptism (specifically his baptismal garment) and the purity of heart that he must have in carrying out his priestly ministry.

CINCTURE The cincture is a long, thick cord with tassels at the ends which secures the alb around the waist. Priests are reminded of their call to chastity and St. Peter's words of wisdom. "So gird the loins of your understanding; live soberly; set all your hope on the gift to be conferred on you when Jesus Christ appears. As obedient sons, do not yield to the desires that once shaped you in your ignorance. Rather, become holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct, after the likeness of the holy One who called you" (I Peter 1:13-15).

STOLE The stole is a long piece of fabric that resembles a scarf worn around the priest's neck and fastened by the cincture. Jewish rabbis would wear prayer shawls as a sign of their authority. Because of this, the priest wears the stole for everything: confessions, exorcisms, and most priests carry one in their emergency kit in case they need it for an emergency baptism or confession.

CHASUBLE The chasuble is a symbol of the priests charity. Because of this, it is proper for the priest to wear the chasuble over the stole to symbolize charity over authority. The chasuble is always in the proper liturgical color. That is why this changes from time to time. Green for Ordinary Time, White for Solemnities and Feast Days, Purple for Lent and Advent, Red for Martyrs' Feast Days, Rose for Guadete Sunday, and Laetare Sunday are the main liturgical colors.




