

REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDIUUM

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious, and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

- 1. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022, and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022, and Good Friday, April 15, 2022.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

We have, on many a Sunday, listened to Father say, "It is good to quiet yourself and be in the presence of the Lord." This Lent there will be an opportunity to do just that. We will have an hour of Adoration Every Thursday night from 7 to 8 in two of our churches.

Come for the hour or just part of it but come. And in case you are wondering, we will not be using incense.
