Archbishop's Call to Share - Scripture can be confusing. We know that God created everything and called it all "good." But in today's Gospel reading, Jesus seems to suggest that partaking in this good creation by having enough to eat, meeting our material needs, and enjoying ourselves is somehow bad, even a curse. What's going on? None of these things (wealth, good food, laughter, praise) are bad in their own right. The problem is when we are so satisfied by earthly things that we lose the desire for God. In contrast, Jesus praises those who are empty: the poor, hungry, sorrowful, and the excluded. Not because poverty or hunger or any of these things are good in their own right, but because when we find ourselves in these conditions, we're more open to God. We know that nothing here will ultimately satisfy us, so we turn to Him. The Church calls this the virtue of spiritual poverty. It can transform the way we think about wealth. Spiritual poverty allows us to see that whatever we have is a gift God has entrusted to us. He asks us to use our gifts prudently as His stewards. Let's keep the virtue of spiritual poverty in mind as we discern how we can support our Archbishop's Call to Share appeal.

<u>Mass Intentions</u> ~ To remember a loved one who has died, or to honor and pray for the intention of another is a beautiful way to call upon God's blessing. The typical offering is \$10 a Mass.
