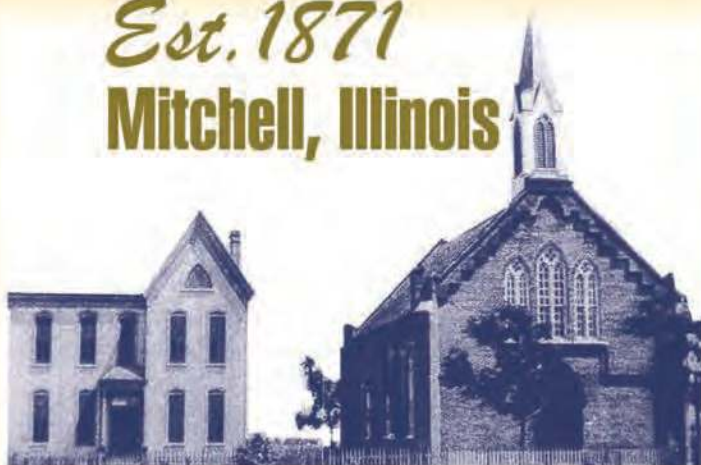
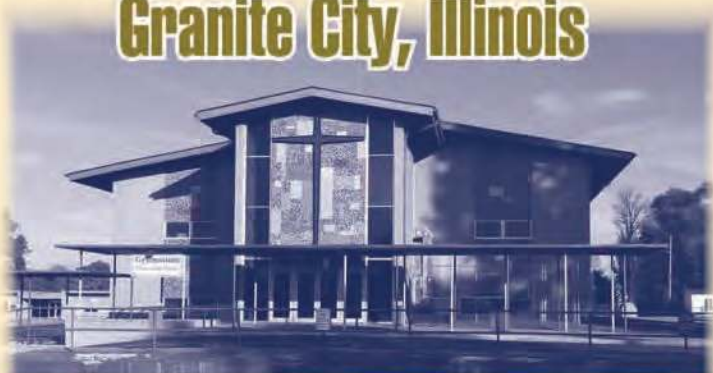

From the Parish Office

In February of each year, we celebrate Black History month in the United States. Most of the time we hear well-worn yet important stories about Americans of African descent who have made great accomplishments in medicine, business, politics, or entertainment. We of course hear of the struggles of the civil rights movement in this country and those who fought for freedom and equality for all. What we do not typically hear about is the history of black Catholics.

Nonetheless, to promote awareness of the accomplishments of all black Americans, it is important to promote an awareness of some of the many Catholic individuals who have achieved greatness in the face of racism – and in many cases a great deal of holiness.

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of black Catholics. Black Catholics trace their faith back to Christian antiquity long before other nations heard the “Good News.” Christian Africa was a leading light in early Christendom. Black Catholics point to three popes who were born in Africa: Saints Victor I, Melchisedech, and Gelasius I.

Some you may have heard of: Venerable Pierre Toussaint, Venerable Augustus Tolton (our country’s first black priest), Servant of God Mary Lange (founder of the first U.S. order for black sisters, the Oblate Sisters of Providence), or even Bishop Harold Perry (first recognized black bishop in the U.S.).

However, I am rather embarrassed to admit that as a convert, I have had to do much of my own research for general knowledge and for this column. I could NOT have told you there were three popes of African origin or much at all about the other important black people of faith until recently. The first person to see me and tell me about an additional black Catholic that they read about or learned about from someone, I have a special treat for them.

It is important for us all, as Catholics, to realize, understand, and appreciate the contributions of the diverse ethnic groups that make up our faith. I encourage you all to find opportunities to read and learn more about the history of people of color in our church. I know that I will continue to do so as it makes me feel even more that our church, MY church, is truly here for us all.

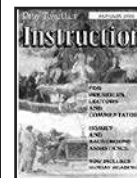
